Under the heading "Environmental Protection," the separate rate jumped by 29p from 90p this year to £1 19 and this shows that the cost of collecting domestic refuse and street cleaning in the town goes up from £18,818 to £23,158, an increase of £4,340

One of the most controversial items in the estimate was the inclusion of a sum of £9,000 to cover the first year's installment of principal and interest towards the renovation of the Town Hall which plans the provision of office facilities for the Council staff on the ground floor. The overall cost of this project is estimated at about £45,000 and it is to be paid for over a period of five years Whether it is worth £45,000 to move the offices from upstairs to downstairs, especially at the present time when money is so scarce, is a most debatable point I think that it is a luxury which the ratepayers could have done without at the present time and anyway the question must come up as to whether it is responsible to spend such a hat of money on such an old building

RATES SYSTEM MUST BE IAD REFORMED

The County and Dungarvan have now been struck and it is no exaggeration to say that the ratepayers of the areas concerned have been absolutely appalled by the big burdens they will have to bear to provide the money to be spent by the County and Urban Councils in 1976

But Waterford and Dungarvan are no exceptions where mounting rates are concerned To a greater or lesser degree the story is the same up and down the country and generally speaking the people who have to foot the bills in all these areas have been utterly astounded by the huge amounts involved
