As the name implies, the reel is geared to have a high recovery retrieve of between 3 or 4 at to 1 which means that one turn resulted in a of the handle will cause the h costs and spool to revolve 3 or 4 times, so arded to the bringing in a fair amount of line This is a great advantage to the long caster who hooks a fish some hundred yards away On appearance the multiplier looks complicated with all its levers and gadgets, but it is simp y broken down to a spool which revolves a lever to make it free-running for casting and to engage it for reeling in and a shopping clutch very conven-iently fitted next to the handle so that it can be operated without taking the hand away from the handle and ratchet

There are many models of multipliers and with a varied price range but even the least expensive are capable of cast-ing over a hundred yards Casting with a multiplier may appear complicated and I have seen some terrible tangles with the anglers changing to another action, but if the angler is pre pared to spend a few hours in a field practising reaching over 50 yards, not 100 yards without over-runs and the resulting tangles the increase in distance casting becomes easy Once the reel is mastered

Dungarvan Urban Council three tenders for the proposed renovation of the Town Hall were received, opened and initialled They have now been sent on to the Architects for examination and in all probability the tender which will be recommended by the Architects will be approved by the Council I believe that this is a pro-

ject which in these times of economic stress and money scarcity could well be shelved until a later date If the Council believe that they have £30,000 or £40,000 to play around with they could, without looking very hard, find several schemes which would be of far more benefit to the community As I have said previously

years of his death Mary Elizabeth MsGroth enjoyed all the advantages ! which the immigrant who had made good could give to his children in America in the second half of the last cen tury She was born in Dungarvan, but after moving to America her father prospered of quickly enough to send her to the type of private school that had formerly been the pre-serve of the long-established

"By the time she married a Boston doctor called Blake she was publishing poems and soon was regarded as one of Boston's chief literary figures She published a number of books of poems, as well as prose works on travel and c verse for children.

"Prominent in Catholic Church affairs, she had eleven children whom she brought on ambitious educational walking tours in Europe which supplied her with] material for travel journals


"Perhaps her wealth and; personality brought her writing more attention than it would otherwise have received It is little noticed today "She died on February 26, 1907"
