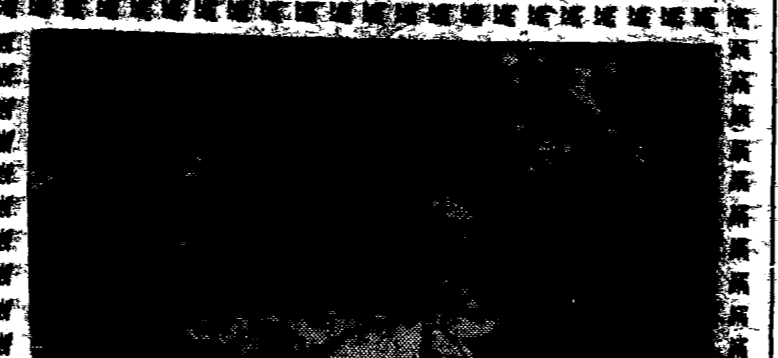

GANG RAIDERS AGAIN STRIKE IN WEST WATERFORD

For the second time in recent weeks a gang of raiders, believed to number five men, struck in West Waterford last week-end. This time their target was Ardmore and in the early hours of last Saturday morning they robbed a licensed premises and a supermarket there getting away with goods and cash to the value of nearly £1,000

The first target in Ardmore was the licensed premises of Mr James Rooney, where they gained entry by forcing a front window. They got away with a quantity of goods to the value of £800 and an undischarged sum of money they next moved to the supermarket of Mr John Joe Carlon through a rear window and got away with between £70 and £80 in cash.

The raiders then stole a car, the property of Mr. James Moloney, in which they made their getaway. This car was found abandoned at Guaranabrah in Cork City on Sunday.

There was also an attempt to break into the Marine Bar at Palla on the same night but in this the raiders were unsuccessful when the Manager of the premises heard them and raised the alarm.

All these cases again point to the need for more Garda protection in the West Waterford area, a matter concerning which much public agitation has taken place in recent months.

**DEPENDENCE OF AGRICULTURE AND TOURISM ON EACH OTHER**

Agriculture and tourism should be regarded as siamese twins. They heavily depend on each other and what is good for one should also be good for the other.

This was stated by Mr. Paddy Lane, Deputy President of the Irish Farmers' Association when he addressed a National Tourism Seminar in Galway.

He said: "There is a lack of appreciation on both sides of the complementary role of the other."

## SUPREME COURT JUDGE WHO PRACTISED AS JUNIOR IN WATERFORD RETIRES

A High Court Judge, whose ruling on constituency boundaries at the Electoral Act led to a General Election in the 1960s, sat for the last time as a Judge of the High Court last Thursday.

After a quarter of a century on the bench, the last nine in the Supreme Court, and Justice of the Peace (71), retired to his home in the village of Ballycotton, near Waterford.

Mr. Justice Budd was appointed a Judge of the High Court in 1951 at a time when he was a member of Seanad Eireann representing TCD on the University Panel.

He was born in Ennis, Co. Clare and received his early education in the Manor School, Ennis. He was called to the Bar in Essex in 1925 but obtained an honours degree in history and political science at TCD and two years later obtained his LL.D. being called to the Bar the same year.

For many years he practised as a junior barrister on the South-Eastern Circuit and was a regular advocate at the Circuit Courts in Dungarvan in the 30s.

In this regard he is being followed by his son, Mr. Declan Budd, who is a very popular barrister in the Dungarvan Circuit Courts at present. He took silk in 1940.

**IMPORTANT JUDGMENT**

Mr. Justice Budd's distinguished career on the bench Mr. Justice Budd's judgment in the Education Company of Ireland versus Sarsfield case on freedom of religion is now the law of the land. This decision set out the right of the individual to join or not to join a union and the judgment is much quoted in trade union litigation.
