# Behind the SPOTLIGHT

### THE MULTI-CHANNEL TV CAMPAIGN

The campaign for multi-channel TV reception is at present gaining impetus and more are afoot in Dungarvan and areas in East Waterford seeking the widest support of private television viewers for it. The campaign was initiated following the surprising result and the methods used in obtaining it by which RTE were given control of the planned second channel. RTE continues to be utterly disappointing for the majority of viewers in the one-channel areas and it is now evident that it has no intention of giving the kind of second channel service which the people really want. Why should viewers in these single channel areas, of which this district is one, continue to passively accept such a poor service when, with a united campaign, it would be possible to organise multi-channel reception and so place us on a par with the more privileged viewers in Dublin and along the east coast who already enjoy such a service.

I understand that both Mr. Billy Kirwan, Leamybrien who heads the local multi-channel organisation in this county and Mr. Sean Casey, the Dungarvan television dealer and engineer are satisfied that signals of adequate strength are coming in which, if properly handled, would make multi-channel reception a reality for many areas in the county.

All that is now required is the full backing of the local private television viewers to enable the committee in charge of the campaign to take the fight back to the government for a return to the concept of multi-channel viewing. In a further move the committee have addressed a memorandum to the main political parties requesting a policy statement on the issue. I interviewed last week-end Mr. Kirwan, who is dealing with this part of the campaign, said "Election promises have not materialised. But our trump card is that a general election comes up in about 18 months and we plan to make this a national issue."

The fact that there is now positive evidence that a full range of television signals

such as are reaching Dublin and east coast areas are also available up in the Comeragh Mountains and that there is no reason why they should not be tapped and relayed down into areas in the county should be a big lever in the hands of the local multi-channel campaigners. Is it democratic in such circumstances that just merely to satisfy the moguls of Manroose and the type of programmes which they decide we should get that we should remain part of the captive audience in the one-channel areas?

### WOULD YOU BELIEVE?

Having written as I did in the previous paragraphs I must admit, though, that RTE can be quite good at some things in particular they excel when it comes to disbursing staff expenses. The following is really a gem which I came across over the week-end. It is an extract from an RTE staff expenses rate card "Persons graded as Class B may claim Class A when travelling in the company of a Class A employee provided the certifying official certifies that it was necessary to travel and/or stay together."

### A STARTLING QUESTION

Evidence given to a Coroner's Inquest in Dunooghore last week concerning the death of an elderly widow should pose a startling question for everyone. The Coroner was informed that the woman had not eaten properly for a considerable time and malnutrition was put down as one of the causes of her death in her own bedroom.

Returning a verdict in accordance with the medical evidence the Coroner is reported as follows "One wonders how many elderly people there are who live alone and fail to get adequate food, not for financial reasons, but because they become disinterested in their welfare. Society should take more care of elderly people."

It was stated that the woman involved had lost interest in life when her husband died eight years ago and just somehow became turned off. The fate of this lonely widow is certainly something

which should provide a conscience-prick for us all. The startling question which it poses is how many of these people there are and what we, as members of the community in which they live can do to ensure that they are not left on their own in a state of utter loneliness and isolation.

The appeal by the National President of the Society of St Vincent de Paul made following publication of the facts of this woman's death that neighbours should look in on old people living near them and make sure that they were not in difficulties is one which should be fully supported by everyone.
