VALUE-ADDED TAX

Notice to persons selling new~ motor cars or new motor cycles

Sales of motor cars and motor cycles by dealers (i.e. by wholesalers and retailers) on or after 1 March 1976 will generally be liable to VAT

However, with a view to avoiding transitional difficulties arising out of the change in the rate, the Minister for Finance has announced an arrangement whereby subject to suitable safeguards. NEW motor cars and motor cycles which can be shown to have already borne VAT at 36.75 pc, will continue to be chargeable at 6.75 p.c. if sold by dealers on or before 30 April 1976

Details are contained in a leaflet which is being distributed to the trade

The arrangement will not apply to second-hand vehicles nor to stocks of vehicles held by cor here and motor cycle here companies
