



Some very essential details are missing from the Council of Farm. Ministers package just negotiated in Brussels said Mr T J Maher, President of the Inish Farmers' Association. Mr Maher pointed out very important areas have still to be worked out by the Commission before any definite appraisal of this year's price package can

He said "The decision to in-crease the FEOGA supports in the Disadvantaged Areas Scheme from 25 per cent to 35 per cent is clearly a step in the right direction, but will be of little advantage to Western-type areas in this country, unless it is matched by a like increase in our own Government contribu-

He said there are quite a few areas of the package that have to be spelt out more clearly For instance, the proposed plan to incorporate skim milk pow-der in animal feeds, which is designed to take account of 400,000 tons of the surplus is far from being in an operational This Scheme will undoubted-

ly have a further impact on farmers costs through having to pay more in stock feed prices, especially for pig and poultry producers, but no clear figures are yet available "It is still unclear what the




