

RTE has been pressing ahead with its plans for a twochannel national television service. The second channel will be made available to as many homes as possible as soon as possible in full colour and at minimum cost. The technical questions involved are being examined in order to identify and eliminate the problems of reception which may arise in some parts of the country.


Viewers in the present single-channel area will have a evening and on weekend afternoons. Extra home production will include programmes made outside the Dublin area Extra programmes will also be imported from British and other sources The second channel will be developed in several phases It is expected that test transmissions will begin in Spring 1977, and the scheduled service later in the year

All set-owners other than subscribers to cable systems, will need to alter their aerial installations to receive the will need to alter their aerial installations to receive the two-channel service. In most cases no other technical adjustment will be necessary. In some areas however, sets may also have to be adapted and it should be noted that pre-1966 sets will not always be adaptable. As already announced, the now-obsolete 405-line sets which cannot be converted to the technically superior 625-line reception will be unable to receive the two-channel service. According as detailed plans are evolved, RTE will issue pamphlets explaining the requirements in each affected area. Assistance and general information will also be provided by means of special television and radio programmes.

Television Dealers throughout the country are being kept informed of developments by RTE and the public are recommended to see the advice of a local dealer on the implications of the two channel service before installing new equipment RTE will provide every possible assistance in helping to minimise reception difficulties wherever these are experienced.

This is the first of a series of-Progress Reports which RTE will publish about its plans for two-channel television


