The amount of refund will now be calculated as follows -(1) An eligible person is expected to provide, out of his own resources the first £500 of expenditure in respect of a calendar month on medical requisites prescribed by a medical practitioner for himself and/or his dependants

(2) Where the expenditure in respect of a calendar month is more than £500 and does not exceed £800 he/she will receive a refund of half the expenditure in excess of £500

(3) If the expenditure in respect of a calendar month is greater than £8.00 he/she will be refunded the amount in excess of £800 plus £150




