DOCTORS STILL DISAGREE ON DUNGARVAN CASUALTY SERVICE

Some time ago I wrote to you about the establishment of a week-end casualty service based at the District Hospital in Dungarvan. It has since been solved. The information I received from the hospital came to me from a source who was not a doctor. It is possible that the information was correct at the time it was given but it is now clear that the agreement amongst the doctors who were to operate the service has once again gone up in smoke and we are back to square one.

It is now more than three years since the first call went out to set up this service to deal with week-end casualty cases which might occur in the town of Dungarvan or indeed in other parts of West Waterford. Several accidents had occurred which pointed to the need for such a service and the general public thought that its establishment would be a simple, straightforward thing. How wrong we all have been is proved by the fact that we are now no nearer to it than we were five years ago.

The matter was discussed yet once more at the May meeting of the South Eastern Health Board during which Mr. C. Curran stated that his experience in the whole affair had proved the most frustrating of his entire professional life. He recalled the series of meetings which of-ten took place at the hospital and the local representatives had held with the doctors in Dungarvan over the past three and a half years and said that it was an utter disgrace that the doctors concerned could not reach agreement among themselves on the matter.

The Board's Community Care Programme Manager, Dr. Val Barry, who has been cast in the role of Dr. Curran in an effort to solve the problem told the Board that they had held several meetings in Dungarvan with the local general practitioners but it was not possible to get the agreement of all the doctors to take part in the service. He added that while most of the doctors had agreed to be on call on a rota system at week-ends not all would agree and the others

DOCTORS WORRIED ABOUT RABIES THREAT

According to the current issue of the "Irish Medical Times," Irish doctors are apprehensive to ease rabies should break out in this country. Rabies or hydrophobia is defined as a disease which occurs following a bite by an infected animal. The apprehension of the medical profession arises as a result of foreign vessels visiting anchorages around our coastline.

The possibility of a rabies outbreak is prompted by the fact that there is now more traffic than ever between the continent and this country. The recent harsh penalties being imposed in Britain for breaches of the Rabies Act there have also served to underline the danger.

The present position whereby vessels with animals on board anchor indiscriminately in our harbours is a matter of grave concern, many doctors insist there is little or no check on whether the animals are allowed by their owners to wander around on shore.

The Government, it is felt, should take the initiative and introduce a campaign to increase awareness of the danger of the disease to prevent it from being brought into Ireland, including the allocation of specific moorings for boats with animals on board to reduce the likelihood of illegal landings and to ease problems of surveillance.

During the past week it was reported that rabies had reached areas less than 40 miles from Paris after blanketing a quarter of France in eight years. A spokesman for the Paris health authorities has stated that foxes, the main carriers of the disease, had brought rabies to forest lands neighbouring the city and that domestic animals infected by rabies had unwittingly been taken into the capital.

STAGGERING LOSSES

Incurable financial losses incurred by the Society in the past few years made last Monday's dramatic developments well nigh inevitable. The first ominous signs came in 1972 when the Society made a profit of a mere £2,154 for the year. Two years later a net loss of £28,296 was reported for the year.

The 1974 figures made even worse reading. The net loss topped the £200,000 mark. But perhaps the most ironic aspect of last Monday's decision to go into voluntary liquidation was the rejection of an amalgamation offer with the giant Dungarvan-based Waterford Co-operative Society Ltd. in the latter part of last year.

On April 9, 1975, the Knockmeal shareholders convened under the chairmanship of Mr. Jeremiah Harrington, to discuss the amalgamation offer. At the same time, the Waterford Co-op shareholders met in Dungarvan and agreed unanimously to accept in the Knockmeal Society.

Under the terms of the proposed amalgamation, all permanent members of the Knockmeal staff would be retained and all Knockmeal members' loans would be guaranteed by Waterford Co-op.

Ultimately a decision was taken against amalgamation with Waterford Co-op, today one of the largest group co-operatives in the country with an annual turnover of almost £40 million.

QUESTION MARKS
Now as a result of going into voluntary liquidation it is understood that the milk suppliers to the Knockmeal Society stand to lose in the region of £30,000 to £100,000. In addition, question marks must be placed before the future job prospects of most if not all the 50 employees at the Society's headquarters at Knockmeal and the branches at Ballymacarbery, Scar, Cappouin and Lismore.

Earlier this year the milk suppliers formed themselves into a new association under the chairmanship of Mr. Michael Mulhally, Ballymacarbery, to try to avert last Monday's situation. But their efforts too proved unsuccessful in the wake of the continuing trading losses the Society was suffering.

It is understood that the winding up of the affairs of the Society will commence immediately and should be completed within a matter of months.
