Mr. Thomas Phelan

Widespread and most deep regret was expressed at the announcement of the death which occurred rather unexpectedly at an early age at the Dungarvan Hospital, Waterford, on Monday night, June 7, of Mr. Thomas Phelan, Congress Villan, Dungarvan. Although in failing health for some time he was not about on the previous Friday and in the usual jovial disposition.

MAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

MORE BACKING FOR MULTI-CHANNEL T.V.

The decision of Waterford Council at their meeting on Monday last week to back a call on the Minister for Posts and Telegraphs by the Waterford Multi-Channel T.V. Campaign Committee to completely abolish the introduction of RTE 2 and to set up instead a channel to re-broadcast BBC 1 shows how much public opinion has changed since RTE carried out their now famous "survey."

But perhaps public opinion has not changed in the interim and that it was this RTE survey that came up with the wrong result because of the loaded manner in which the questions were put to whoever was interviewed. The credibility of the survey was certainly completely knocked by a poll recently carried out by one of the Dublin Sunday papers which showed that a massive 97 per cent wanted BBC 1. One of the questions put by the Sunday paper to its readers was whether they accepted the vote in favour of RTE 2 carried out by the Irish Marketing Surveys as being representative of the nation's viewers (there were thousands of replies) felt it was not representative.

However despite this indication of what the public want, especially in the one-channel areas, RTE are going ahead with all speed with their plans for RTE 2 (God save us). They must be aware, though, of what the public choice now is but perhaps this knowledge is what is accelerating their action so that their No 2 channel will become a fait accompli before the present trend in public opinion gains further momentum.

I think that it is now time for the Minister to step in and put a stop to any further forward movement towards RTE 2. People have become completely disenchanted with RTE 1 and more so than ever since the recent strike at Montrose. A second channel under their control would suffer the same consequences as the first one in another state situation and this would be little consolation to a viewer whose set has been blocked out because of a strike but who would still have to continue paying his licence fee to RTE and his rental fee to the TV Rental Company.

The main objection raised by those opposed to BBC channels is the effect such transmissions would have on our national heritage. Surely we must be given credit for being adult enough to make our own choice, once the freedom of choice, such as they already have in Dublin and the east coast areas is extended to us. We already have the cinema and the radio pouring in outside influences so why all the furore about what will happen if

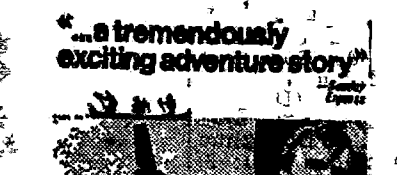

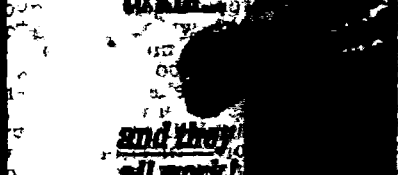
