## **VAT** Sales in Bond of Wines and Spirits

Section 52 of the Finance Act, 1976, which became law on 27th May, 1976 and which relates to sales in bond of goods liable to a duty of Customs or Excise provides that, in the case of such sales, VAT will be payable on the duty-free price increased by the amount of duty which would be payable if the goods were

withdrawn from bond at the time of sale In applying the new provision to sales of wines and spirits, the Revenue Commissioners will be prepared, in certain circumstances, to allow approved manufacturers and wholesalers to defer payment of VAT on the duty until the goods are actually withdrawn from
