## MAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

**HOOIGANS AND VANDALS**  
The heatwave of the past week saw an unprecedented rush to the beaches as people tried to cool off from the blistering sun. The swimming pool in Dungarvan was also a popular attraction especially for the younger generation. The local Council has done much to restore the fabric of the pool and has done a good job and credit is due to the men who carried out the work.

But the hooligans and vandals were again at work there last Saturday when the pool caretaker closed up during his dinner hour one or more of these hurled a flagon of water into the pool and when it was re-opened a youngster sustained a rather nasty leg wound from the broken splinters of glass. As a result the pool had to be closed for the entire evening until it could be drained and cleaned.

These hooligans show little or no respect for life or property and their actions must be condemned in the strongest possible terms. Whether they are young or old, small or big, nobody seems to know, although it has been well said by a senior Garda Officer who was commenting on other criminal acts recently that very little can happen without somebody seeing it. If then, somebody did see any of these hooligans hurling empty bottles into the pool, they should be civic spirited enough to come forward and report the matter.

But this type of offence is not confined to the swimming pool as the Park adjoining the pool is regularly littered with broken bottles and indeed many streets and pathways within the urban area are also strewn with fragments of shattered glass bottles.

There should be no sympathy shown to anyone who is deliberately responsible for these highly dangerous acts as broken glass in swimming pools, public parks, roadways or beaches or indeed in any public place presents a terrible hazard.

**SILVER JUBILARIAN**

## Lady becomes first citizen of Dungarvan

There was a rather unusual turnout at the Annual Meeting of Dungarvan Urban Council last Monday night but it resulted in a rather historic occurrence in that for the first time in the lifetime of the Council a lady was elected to occupy the chair for the coming year.

The Fianna Fail party which holds 5 of the 9 seats on the Council retained control of the position but as it turned out the Party's first objective although proposed and seconded, turned down the nomination and in turn proposed the lady for the chair.

Mrs O'Brien's nomination was seconded by Mr P. Whelan. On a vote Mrs O'Brien was declared elected by 5 votes to 4 for Mr Kyne.

Mrs O'Brien then took the chair and was invested with the chain of office by the outgoing Chairman. She said that she was deeply honoured and very proud to have become Chairman of Dungarvan Urban Council and she appealed to the women of the Urban area to take a more active part in the running of the local community.

**VICE-CHAIRMAN**  
Mr Murphy who was the outgoing Vice-Chairman was again proposed for the position by Mr Goode seconded by Mr Whelan and defeated Mr E. Walsh (F.G.) who was proposed by Senator Deasy (P.G.) and seconded by Mr Kyne (Lab.) by 5 votes to 4.

**COUNCILLOR QUESTIONS POLLUTION WARNING**  
At the monthly meeting of Dungarvan Urban Council last Monday night Mr T. Kyne, T.D., asked whether any report of pollution in the outer harbour had been received by the Council.

Mr B. White Town Clerk said that no such report had been received.

Mr Kyne said that the reason he referred to the matter was that he saw a notice in the local papers warning people about the effect of pollution in the harbour would have on shell-fish in the area. He asked who was responsible for the publication of such a notice.

It was stated that it had been published by the Regional Health Board Authorities.

Mr Kyne went on to say that this was something that had been done without consulting the Council. "It is unfair," he said "that such notices should be published and we should protest against people deciding what should be this Council's business."

It was agreed that the Health Authorities be asked why the notice referred to was published and whether there were any grounds for it.

INQUEST SEQUEL TO ROAD ACCIDENT

A traffic accident which occurred on April 10 and in which 6 years old Mairead Power lost her life on the roadway outside her home at Kilmurry, Dungarvan, had a sequel when an inquest was held by Dr D Healy, Lismore, Coroner for West Waterford, sitting with a jury of the courthouse, Dungarvan, on Wednesday.

Mrs Nora Power mother of the deceased child said that at about 11.10 a.m. on the morning of April 10 she was at her home in Kilmurry and she heard some of the children running in the yard and shouting that Mairead had been killed. She went out and saw her daughter lying unconscious on the road. A car was reversing on the road and the driver got out and gave her the name. She took the child to the hospital in the car where she died some hours later.

Mr Matty Whelan in evidence said that he was driving towards Dungarvan and as he was passing Power's cottage at Kilmurry a child ran out on the road. Although he braked hard and was only travelling at about 35 m.p.h. he had no chance of avoiding collision. The child struck the left front wing of the car.

Dr M K Cusack stated that the child was admitted to the District Hospital at 11.45 a.m. on April 10 and he saw her there at 12.15 p.m. She was unconscious and there was an extensive wound in the right temporal region. Both eyes were swollen and blackened and she was bleeding profusely from the nose and left ear. There was a compound fracture of the right shin bone. He did all that could be done for her but she died a few hours later. In his opinion the death was due to extensive brain damage shock and haemorrhage caused by multiple injuries which were consistent with her being involved in a traffic accident.

The jury of which Mr J O'Donnell was foreman returned a verdict in accordance with the medical evidence.

The Coroner Supt English and the foreman of the jury expressed sympathy with the bereaved parents in the tragic loss they had suffered.
