PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

WHY THE SILLY SEASON? This is truly the silly season for newsmen when nothing is happening and one must write about nothing more than one's self.

While the country is supposed to be struggling through the throes of the greatest economic crisis it has ever known, the people don't seem to be aware of it. Last week the punters at Galway Races established a new record by lashing out while the week end there was no great evidence of any depression or shortage of cash anywhere. Is there a crisis or is it the old question of what is the crisis?

Then the Daill has gone into a traditional long summer session and doesn't seem to be concerned (or not at all) with the way the country is being run (or not being run). The silliest situation of the season however was pinpointed by a visitor from Britain last week-end when she stated that it was the August Bank Holiday in this country. Naively she asked, how can you have such a bank holiday at a time when your bank people are all on strike and the banks are all closed? I had to admit that it was a question which I could not answer beyond remarking that it was just all part of the silly season!

NEW ADJUTANT-GENERAL OF DEFENCE FORCES The President, acting on the advice of the Government, has appointed Colonel Carl D. Sullivan to be Chief of Staff for the term of five years commencing on July 29, 1976 and has appointed Colonel Patrick Dempsey to be Adjutant-General for the period from July 29, 1976 to April 18, 1979.

Col Dempsey who will be retiring on April 19, 1976 has been Assistant Chief of Staff since September 1975. Member of the well-known Dempsey family of London, Dungarvan, he is a graduate of the Army's Command and Staff College which he entered as a cadet in 1938. Principal appointments held by Col Dempsey have included Staff Officer, Kerridge F.C., 1947/52, Commandant of the Infantry School, Military College, 1971/72, Director of Operations, 1972/74, O.C. Carragh Training Camp, 1974/75, and Assistant Chief of Staff 1975/76.

THE STORY OF THE ERIN'S HOPE As promised last week and in order to put the record straight I will try, in as brief a way as possible, to outline the story of the Fenian ship, the Erin's Hope. This is dealt with at length in "Beatha Mhichil Turraoin," the biography of the noted seanchaigh many years at the Irish College of Ring, written by the late Michael O. Cionnhaill. The ship left New York early in April 1867 and was known as the "Jacknelt". Hidden under the camouflage of general cargo she carried 5,000 guns 3 small canons, 1,000 rounds of powder and shot for the canons all destined for Ireland where the Fenians had planned a rising in that year. Shortly after leaving New York she rendezvoused with a boat and picked up 40 men under a Capt. Kavanagh who from there on took charge of operations. On April 21 Capt. Kavanagh assembled the ship's company and announced that the ship's name was to be changed to the Erin's Hope and that they were heading for Ireland to take part in the rising. On the morning of May 10, after a voyage lasting 33 days, the "Erin's Hope" came within sight of the Irish coast off Donegal. That night they sent out the agreed signals but got no response from the shore. For four days they dalted off the north-east coast without making any contact with the Fenian leaders on the shore and in desperation Capt. Kavanagh planned to land the arms in Sligo where he expected that local support for the rising would be available. He sent two men ashore to reconnoitre the position and report back but they failed to return at the appointed time. However a boat did come with a messenger to inform them that because the Fenian Movement had been riddled by spies the rising had failed and word that the "Erin's Hope" was on the way was not passed until it was too late. He passed an order to Capt. Kavanagh to proceed to Cork and to land the arms there. The "Erin's Hope" then put to sea again and played hide and seek with the British warships which by this time were aware of her presence as this made her way down along the west coast. She arrived off the Cork coast on May 27 but again her signals to land remained unanswered. For three days she stood off the coast but when a Coastguard cutter approached she had to get under weigh again and put out to sea. The Capt. and officers aboard then held a war council and decided to make off further attempts to land the arms. They approached land on a foggy morning on June 1 and found themselves about 4 miles from Helvick Head. Out of the fog came one of the local fishing boats from Ring skippered by Paid Mor O. Faolain. Capt. Kavanagh followed the fishing boat and following a conversation it was agreed that the officers and men who had come for the rising should go ashore in the boat. When the men had boarded the boat, the "Erin's Hope" put back to sea once more. Under the cover of the fog the fishing boat made for the shore but as it was low tide she was unable to make it back to Ballinagoul. As a result the men were landed on the strand about half-mile away. Their joy in coming ashore did not last long, however, because they were observed by one of the coast-guard stations on Helvick Head who alerted the Crown Forces in Dungarvan and it was not long before all were captured and landed in jail. After about a week the "Erin's Hope" which had continued to dodge units of the British fleet made another landfall but when no word was received from the shore the Capt. correctly surmised that things had gone wrong. He sailed along the coast and on June 11 the couple of officers and men who had remained on board decided that there was no longer any use in dallying about. As food and water were getting scarce it was finally reluctantly decided to head the "Erin's Hope" out into the Atlantic and back to the U.S. and on August 1, 1867 she arrived back in New York after sailing a total of 9,000 miles. Those who had been taken prisoner when they landed at Ballinagoul were subsequently tried in Dungarvan and received sentences of 15 years. Paid Mor O. Faolain was one of the principal witnesses but refused to identify any of those who came ashore in his boat. Afterwards he was taken through the streets of Dungarvan on the shoulders of the local people who had gathered outside the Court-house and his boat was known ever afterwards, until she eventually broke up, as "An Finin" (the Fenian).

ON "PASSWORD" PROGRAMME There should be additional interest for people in the Abbeyside and Dungarvan districts in this week's television programme "Password" which goes on at 7.20 p.m. tomorrow (Friday) evening. One of the contestants who will be taking part in the word game will be Mrs. Paul Finlay, Dublin, formerly Miss Libby Coleman, Abbeyside.

COUNCIL REVOKES PLANNING PERMISSION

As briefly reported in our last issue a special meeting of Dungarvan Urban Council was held last Friday evening at 5 p.m. to consider a motion to revoke the planning permission granted by the Council to Messrs George Chapman Ltd., Waterford and upheld by the Minister for Local Government on appeal to the erection of a Cash and Carry Store at Strandside North, Abbeyside. The meeting was a sequel to the ordinary meeting of the Council held on the previous Monday night at which a deputation from the locality representing 80 residents in the surrounding area objected to the granting of the planning permission on the grounds that it was contrary to the Dungarvan Town Plan which designated the area concerned for residential development only. The resolution calling for the revocation of the permission was proposed by Cllr W. Coiter, seconded by Cllr D. Goode and passed. It directed that notice of the revocation be served on Messrs Chapman and on Mr S. Queney owner of the land on which the disputed site is located. Mr J. Kelly abstained from the vote stating that he was neither for nor against the resolution. Mr P. Whealan was unable to attend the meeting for business reasons.

HELVICK HEAD RESERVE

The second Irish Wildlife Conservation Reserve in Co. Waterford has recently been established at Helvick Head. Under an agreement made with the owner Mr. William Graves, the Conservancy will set on Mr. Graves behalf to ensure that all wildlife using the area for breeding, roosting or feeding purposes will be suitably protected. A local Conservation Order under the Local Government (Planning and Development) Act 1963 is now being processed which will afford legal protection to the wildlife there. Although the Head does not have exceptionally rare or unusual birds, it is an area rich in a wide variety of numbers of Kittiwakes, Gullinets and Razorbills breed on the cliff ledges. Other breeding birds include Black Shags, Herring Gulls, Fulmars and Skuas. Other species recorded include Herring Gull, Cormorant, Raven, Chough, Kestrel, Puffin, Gannet, House Martin, Swallow, Meadow Pipit, Yellowhammer and also Peregrine Falcon. There is also a resident Eggar on the Head. The Head's main asset is that many of these birds may be seen in a very small and compact area in any way and members of the public are encouraged to use the area for observation and other educational purposes. However, interference with nesting birds in the area will not be allowed and those visiting the Head are asked to respect the property and its wildlife in every way. Shooting is not allowed.

WEEK-END MATCHES

At Dungarvan, the meeting of Kilgobinet and Colligan, is arousing tremendous interest as it is the clash between St. Mary's and Clashmore, both in the junior hurling championship.

TALLOW v. SHAMROCKS
Shamrocks, out for the third Sunday in a row, are really under pressure these times, but fortunately they have no serious injuries from their two meetings with Ferrysbank and they will take the field fit and ready for this interesting challenge on Sunday evening.

ST. MARY'S v. CLASHMORE
St. Mary's are the favourites to win here. The inclusion of players of the calibre of John Dalton, Declan Fitzpatrick, Ned Power, Albert Burke and company must give them an outstanding chance of getting by Clashmore who are less experienced as a hurling side.

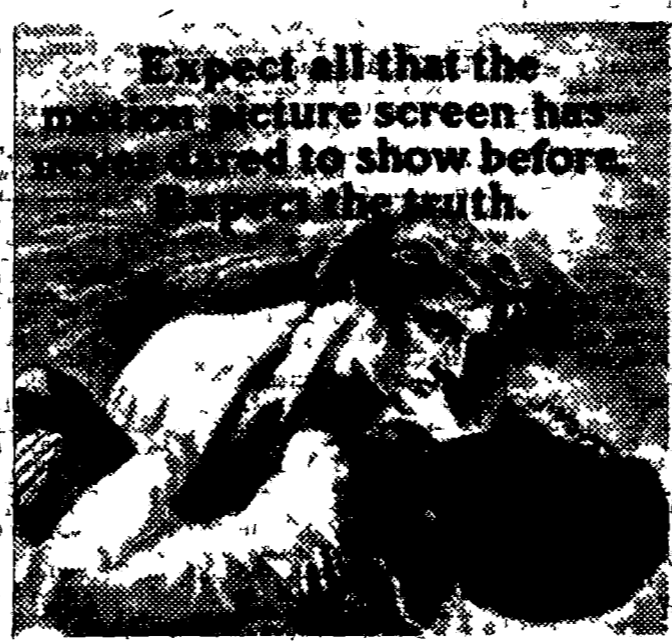

FRIENDLY RELATIONS RESUMED AFTER ASSAULT

While he was satisfied that an assault had occurred which perhaps, had not been very serious and as friendly relations between the parties had been resumed he would mark the charge proved and adjourn the case until November 24 to see how the defendant conducted himself in the meantime.

This was stated by District Justice W F O'Connell at Dungarvan Court when Gerald Moylan, 37, Cathal Brugha Place, was charged with assaulting Michael O'Brien, 19, Cathal Brugha Place by striking him on the face and head with a stick.

The defendant who was not professionally represented pleaded not guilty to the charge. Michael O'Brien in evidence said that at about 11.30 on the night of June 24, Moylan and his wife came to his house. Moylan started arguing with him and hit him across the face with a stick. He didn't know what it was all about but he saw Moylan and Moylan then went away but came back again and assaulted him a second time. Garda J Sleator gave evidence that at about 1.30 a.m. on the morning of June 25 O'Brien came to the Garda station and lodged a complaint against Moylan O'Brien had a small cut under his right eye and said that he had a pain in his left ear. Garda F Lohan said that later on June 25 he interviewed the defendant and asked him to make a statement after caution but the defendant declined to do so. Moylan in evidence said that earlier on the evening of June 24, O'Brien came into a pub where he was O'Brien was barred from the pub and as a result witness said that he didn't want to be talking to him there and told him to go away. O'Brien started arguing later that night he went to O'Brien's house to square things up but another argument took place. He said that one thing led to another and they had a scuffle. A brush handle got broken and O'Brien got hit unintentionally. He said that since the incident O'Brien had been to his house and they had spoken to each other. The District Justice then ruled as stated.

OBITUARY Mr. Thomas Lee

A former member of Dungarvan Urban District Council, Mr. Thomas Lee, died at St. Joseph's Hospital, Dungarvan, on Saturday morning, July 24th after a rather lengthy illness and at an advanced age. The late Tommy Lee was one of Dungarvan's best known citizens and as an independent member of the Council had been champion for the cause of the less privileged sections of the community in the area. He possessed a great sense of humour and was deservedly popular with a large circle of friends in all of whom were saddened at news of his passing. To his sorrowing family and relatives we extend deep and sincere sympathy. His remains were removed on Sunday evening to St. Mary's Parish Church and were buried in the cemetery on Monday morning for the repose of his soul and the interment took place afterwards in the adjoining cemetery. SUCCESSFUL APPEAL AGAINST TAXATION FINE

A County Waterford sand and gravel contractor who was fined a total of £1,335 at Dungarvan District Court last May for using an unlicensed motor lorry had the fine reduced by £1,285 on appeal. The appellant was Michael Fenell, Ballyville, Dungarvan, who was fined for using a lorry of twenty-five previous convictions for not having motor vehicles. Garda M. Shanahan told the court that when he stopped the appellant's lorry on January 26, he found it was unlicensed. Subsequently Fenell failed to appear in the District Court when the Justice imposed a fine equivalent to treble the annual rate of tax on the vehicle. Garda Shanahan said the appellant had asked the court for a reduction of the fine as he was a very careful man where the taxing of his vehicles was concerned. The appellant told the court that there was a genuine mix-up over the date of the District Court hearing. There was no loss of revenue as far as tax on the lorry was concerned. Observing that the appellant had a total of 25 previous convictions for similar offences, Judge Pawlett commented that the taxing of vehicles was "a bad habit" as far as Fenell was concerned. Judge Pawlett reduced the fine to £50 or a two month prison sentence in default.
