POSTMAN TAKES YOU BEHIND THE SPOTLIGHT

THE PROBLEM OF WANDERING ANIMALS

The continuing problem of wandering animals straying on to the roads was once again brought to the attention of the County Council when members drew attention to the problem as it at present exists at Kilmacoma on the outskirts of Clonmel on the Waterford side. The only solution was to refer the matter to the Garda Authorities.

In practically all cases these animals are the property of groups of itinerants and it is only when any of these groups move into a particular area that the problem occurs. Referring the problem to the Garda is really no solution for while the Garda can take certain action and issue summonses, the question of adequate proof to make the charges "stick" in court is a hard nut to crack. And these horse blockers are no dogs and know all that is required to be known to enable them to side-step convictions.

This difficulty was highlighted as a recent sitting of Dungarvan Court when a member of the local Garda force had three brothers summoned in respect of a big number of horses which he had found wandering. He told the court that he was unable to prove total ownership as the brothers admitted ownership to only a few of the animals concerned. The Garda referred to the fact that there is no Pound in Dungarvan and said that had this not been so this difficulty of proving ownership would not arise. If there was a Pound the animals when found wandering, could be placed in it and would remain there until the owners came along to claim them.

The District Justice agreed that the question of ownership was, under these circumstances, something very difficult to prove and it was on this point that the question of a conviction hinged. He spoke of the great dangers which wandering animals of all types present to traffic especially at night and to show what a serious view he took of this type of offence he imposed fines totalling £40 on one of the defendants who had admitted ownership to a few of the animals.

It would appear then that the only real way of dealing with this problem of wandering horses is to provide a Pound where the animals can be impounded and held until the owners come along to claim them. In this way they will not only be admitting ownership but proving it as well and from there on the Courts should have no difficulty in dealing with them in a proper manner.

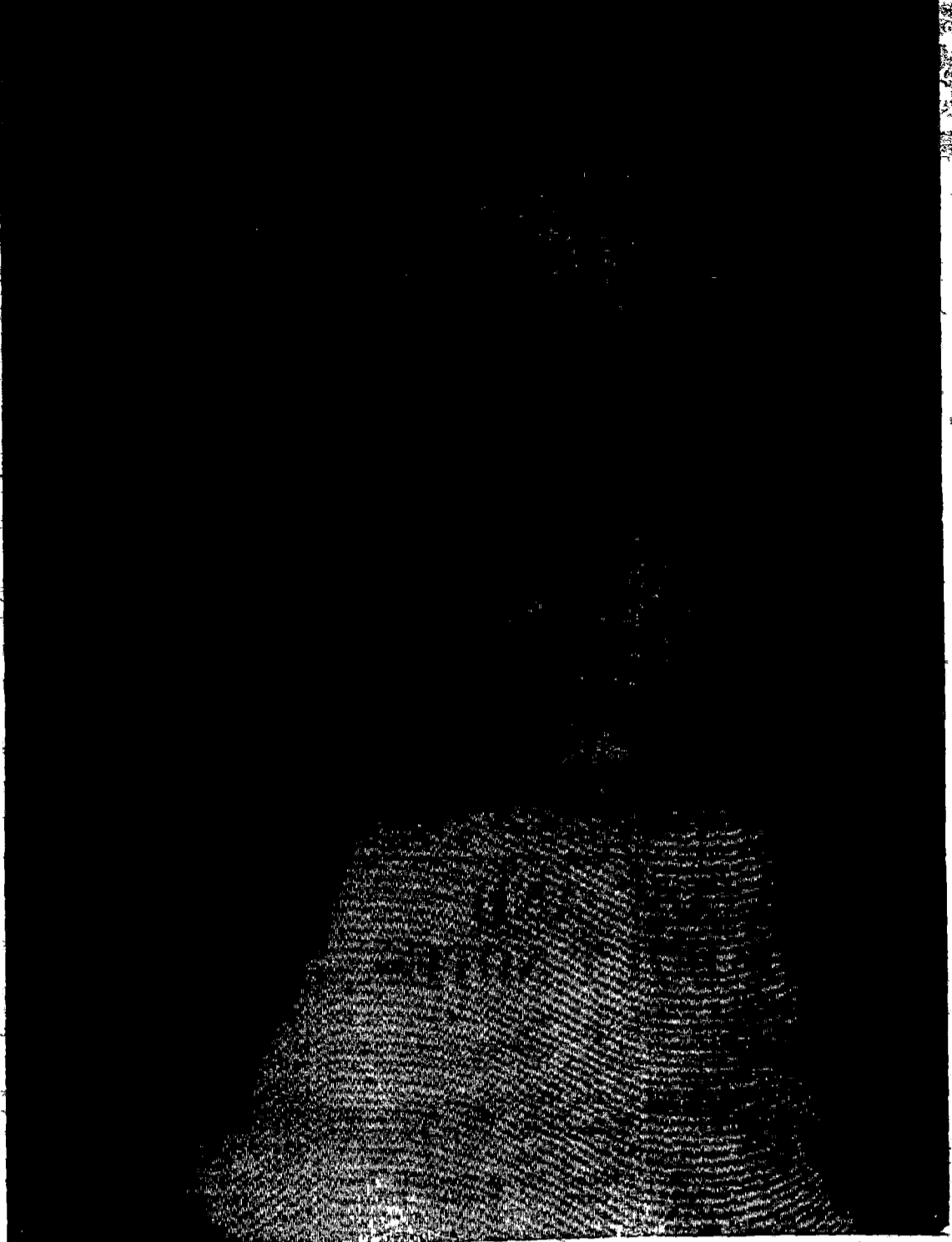
