

PENSMAN TAKES

MYTHING LESS WILL BE DISASTROUS

In the light of events which have taken place off the coast of Ca. Waterford last week when two huge trawlers, one Bulgarian land one Russian, which were, in fact, factory ships moving with a big fleet of trowlers from those countries operating off the coast were captured for fishing within the present fishery limits, the discussion which took place at the September monthly imeeting of the County Council, as reported in the last issue of the "Leader," was very much to the point In the course of that disoussion Senator Deasy very correctly referred to the acti-

vities of ithese and other foreign trawlers which have grossly overfished the oncerich fishing grounds around the coast of Ireland in which, as he said, "they have swept everything away by trawling off the bottom and using the smallest possible mesh in their nets " These foreigners have acted in a most unscrupulous way,

tearing through spawning beds, destroying fish stocks and showing absolutely no consideration for conservation in any shape or form They have shown scont at tention either to the existing international laws which lay down on exclusive six-mile limit around the Irish coast with an outer six-mile zone for five EEC countries and whenever they have found it possible to elude our fishery protection vessels they have come in practically to the beaches For all these raiders the cardinal error is being

eaught in the act Following the recent pro-posals of the EEC Commission to limit Ireland to a 12-mile tishery zone ithere has bei an outcry from the Irish Fishermen's Organisation Fishermen's backed up by the Irish Fish Producers' Organisation and others against the proposal and calling for a 50-mile exclusive zone The arrest o the two grant trawlers lust week has greatly strengthened this demand and gained support for it tall over the country This support has, how ever, not been shared by the government, who have been more inclined, up to this, to accept the EEC proposals limit the zone to 12 mile

Now, however, the Ministe for Foreign Affairs, Dr Fitz gerald looks like being force to stand his ground in tre land's demand for a 50-mil exolusive firmit against th trawlers of all nations Wit the crucial meeting of **EEC Council of Ministers fixe** for Brussels in ten days tim he con well find himself with no other option but to go al out for the 50-mile limit whatever his private feeling may be an achieving succes in this endeavour. The moo of Ireland's 6,000 fisherme at the moment is such tha they would be totally oppose to the idea of quotas and the nothing less than the 50-mil limit will be acceptable t them Anything less coul well prove disastrous for ou
