

In America the Democrat condidate Jimmy Carter succeeded in ousting the Republicon President Gerald Ford from the White House after close and bitterly contested dection and in January he will take over in Washington to become one of the most powerful men in the world One of the reasons given for Carter's success is that he treal psyche more keenly than his opponents. But here in Ireland we ar to get a new President without a contest for the second time for the post closed on Tuesday only the Franca Fail nominee Dr Patrick Hillery had been nominated because the government funked the issue and by refusing to put! forward a condidate preferred to play politics rather than ave the people the opportunity of voting for the man of

their choice Dr Hillery who has been verv successful in Europe as our EEC Commussioner for Social Affairs should prove 6 most suitable incumbent of Arus An Wachtgrain but in this regard the attitude of the Taoiseach, Mr Cosgrave, as was the case in the recent constitutional crisis involving the Presidency, must again be criticised He did not think Dr Hillery good enough for a second term of office in Europe but by his tacit agree ment to his nomination for the Presidency he has accepted that he is an acceptable! holder of the highest office in

the land But it would appear that the Tooiseach does not think a great deal of the Presidency It is now known that during the two years tenure of the office by Cearbhall O Dalaigh Mr Cosgrave visited Aras Air Uachtangen only four time and the last occasion on which the Taoiseach and President met, in accordance with Constitutional requirements, was in May of this year, five months before Mr O Daalgh's resignation. The Corstitution requires that the Tooiseach shall keep the President generally informed on motters of domestic and in-

ternational policy Previous holders of the office of Tooiseach usually went to Arus An Uachtarain once a month

All this goes to show that politics have taken over an Office which was supposed to be above politics and the manner in which it has been downgraded after the recent crisis will not now be helped by the fact that there is to be no election. No matter how good Dr Hillery may prove as President he will not be able to claim that he was freely elected by the majority of the people This is to be regretted
