MAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

MAN RATE UP £1 PLUS

Dungarvan Urban Council held their annual estimates meeting next Monday and will deal with a budget which indicates that a rate of £9.29 in the pound will be required to meet the Council's financial commitments for 1977...

The estimates provide for a total expenditure for the year of £515,025 of which £248,395 will fall on the rates of the 110p increase of the County Council demand at £2.32, accounts for 35p while additional outlay on the scavenging services accounts for 6p of the increase, so between them these two items account for 99p of the total increase.

The cost of scavenging has been going up from year to year but despite this, the overall appearance of the town within the urban bounds is very little to reflect the increasing cost. Litter still abounds and at week-ends, the streets of Dungarvan and of Abbeyside are covered with all kinds of dispose wrappers, papers, tins and bottles.

OPEN DAY AT ST JOHN'S SPECIAL SCHOOL

The people of West Waterford have been most generous in their support of the organisation which was set up in the '60s with the object of providing educational facilities for those children in the region who require special attention. For a long period the organisation had to rely on the co-operation, goodwill and hospitality of the Presentation Order in Dungarvan and latterly on the local Conference of St Vincent de Paul for making temporary premises available for the children attending the school.

However, the very active Board of Management under Chairman Mr Norman Walsh, M.C.C., Cappoquin and School Manager Very Rev D O'Byrne, P.P., Fourmiler were all the time working hard at the project of getting a completely new school erected. It took a great deal of persistent pressure but the efforts of all involved were eventually rewarded when the new school was completed and occupied for the first time by the children when they returned from their Easter holidays earlier this year.

Why was there a need for such a school? Well for varying reasons some children do not succeed at school. They often become unhappy in themselves as a result and this can lead to further problems. As the pupil grows older it becomes more obvious that he needs special attention to help him cope with school life and with adult life later.

This special attention may be given in such ways as remedial help in school, extra tuition at home, a special class in a larger school or full-time education in a "special" school. Now St John's School is a special school where children who are limited in their ability to learn in ordinary schools are taught. Here they have the benefit of small classes which allow more personal attention, they learn in one language, English, there are extra facilities and services, the programme is geared towards a practical and social education rather than theory and academic study with work training in the senior classes.

In order to afford an opportunity for the general public to see the new school which is located at the Youghal Road entrance to the Presentation Convent Grounds in Dungarvan it has been decided to hold an "Open Day" at the school on Sunday next, November 28. From 2 p.m. the teachers and members of the Board of Management of the school will be there to welcome all those who wish to go along and see the new school for themselves. There will be an open door and all will be made most welcome.

HEALTH BOARD'S MASSIVE BILL FOR 1977

The South-Eastern Health Board will need at least £1,683,000 more to maintain services next year at the same level as at present. This was stated at the annual estimates meeting of the Board in Kilkenny last Thursday.

Despite considerable expenditure cuts this year, the Board will have a deficit of £780,000 at the year's end. It is hoped that a grant from the Supplementary Budget being introduced by the Minister for Health will help to clear this.

CHAMPION YOUNG FARMERS

Two young farmers from County Waterford figured prominently on the 5-man Irish Macra na Feirme team which competed in the First World Young Farmers' Tests at Kansas City in the U.S. earlier this month.

Also high up in the list of winners was 23 year old Noel Looby of Kiltree Cappoquin who was placed fourth in dairy judging, sixth in poultry judging and fifth in carpentry and who with 21 year old James O'Donnell of Golden, Co Tipperary was placed seventh in the tractor operation and maintenance tests.

John Gerard Fitzgerald (21) of Ross, Kilmadigan, the other Co Waterford young farmer on the team got ninth place in pig judging, 10th in fruit testing and 10th in dairy judging.

Noel Looby who is a member of the Cappoquin branch of Macra is a well-known and popular young farmer and is the present County Secretary of the Waterford Macra County Executive. In 1973/74 he was Secretary of the Cappoquin branch and in 1974/75 was PRO. He has completed Macra na Feirme Proficiency courses in Dairy Hygiene, Speech Training and Tractor Maintenance.

But the position is critical and an officer of the Society informed me on Tuesday that unless they get the full support of all past and present members as well as many newcomers it will be impossible for them to stage another show. This is certainly something which should not be allowed to happen.

The closure of the Waterford-Mallow railway line was described by Mr C Curran, Chairman of the monthly meeting of the Waterford County Council held in Dungarvan last Monday as the greatest blunder ever made by C.I.E.

He was commenting on a letter from the Minister for Transport which indicated that because it was proving uneconomical to close the line, the freight services on the Waterford-Mallow line in 1977 would likely be taken by the C.I.E. Board at their meeting in December.

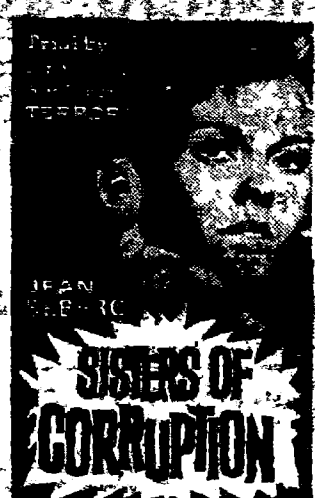

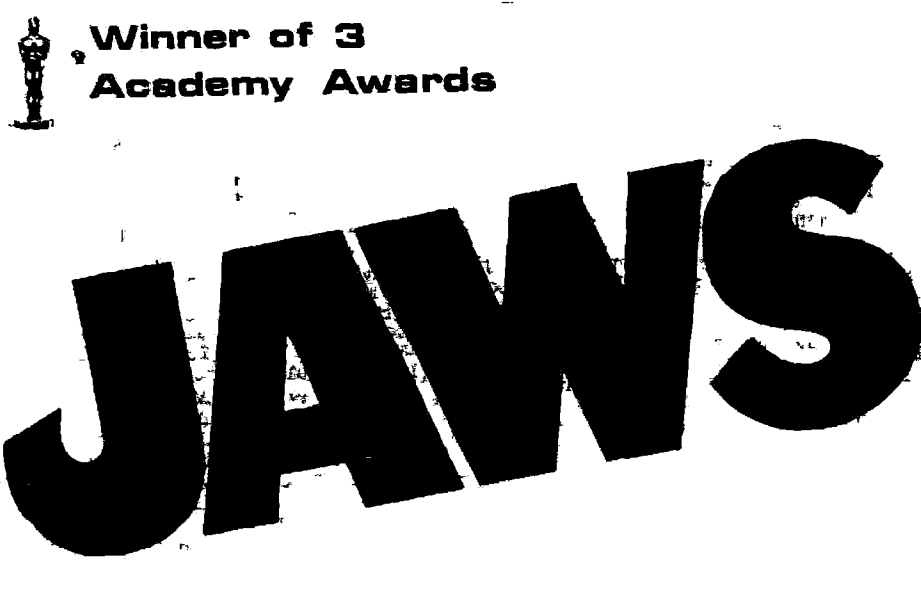
