## DEPENDS ON HOW YOU READ IT

Speaking at the Cork Chamber of Commerce Conference on World Economic Recovery last week, the Minister for Finance, Mr. Richard Spillane, TD, according to a report of his speech supplied by the Government Information Service stated, among other things, that there could be little doubt that the Irish economy had entered the recovery phase. As indications of this "upturn" he pointed to the fact that in the first quarter of the current year, output in manufacturing industries rose by 8 per cent on the same period in 1975 while there was a further improvement in the second quarter when the increase on the corresponding quarter in 1975 was 13 per cent. Minister Ryan added that this year had also seen a rise in the volume of imports while as the most encouraging sign of all he cited the large volume rise in industrial exports.

Referring to the unemployment situation he said that this had fallen in recent months from a peak of 118,000 last February to 110,000 in mid-November. Thus, he said, was another favourable sign which suggested that unemployment was responding to the quickening pace of economic recovery. Mr. Ryan then said "I say to those who harbour nagging doubts about the existence of a more favourable trend in our economy, that there is now a virtually universal agreement that in 1976 economic growth will be of the order of 3 to 4 per cent. Surely the certainty of a growth rate of this year which is not only positive, but significantly so, proves conclusively that recovery is a reality and not just a politician's dream." The Minister was surely saying his most optimistic words when he made these statements and one would like to believe that what he said was true. But is there an "upturn" in the economy of the country and is the recovery which Mr. Ryan talks about under way? Not everyone will agree that matters are as rosy as the Minister would wish us to believe. A report from the OECD which deals with economic development in the European Community and which was released last week, points a much different picture. This report states that the Irish economy has reached a critical stage and it called bluntly on the government to check inflation first and to keep public finances firmly under control. ## Urban Rate for '77 is £9.17 in £

After considering the estimates for the coming year for the annual estimates meeting held last Monday night, Dungarvan Urban District Council finally adopted a rate of £9.17 in the £ for the coming year. This is an increase of 86p on the current rate of £8.31 but a reduction of 12p on the original figure submitted by the County Manager. In his report the Manager, Mr. C. A. O'Connor said that the estimates as submitted indicated that a general rate of £9.29 in the £ would be required to meet the cost of an expenditure of £615,022 for the year of which £248,885 would fall on the rates. The County Demand which is a statutory amount came to £2.32 of the total rate, an increase of 35p over last year.

Mr. O'Connor pointed out that the additional outlay on scavenging services would require a rate increase of 64p and this with the increase in the County Demand accounted for 89p of the total increase. He said that the cost of the scavenging services continued to increase and provision was made in the estimate for the purchase of a new truck, the total cost of which would be £12,000 over a three year period. Also included in the estimates for the year was a sum of £2,500 to cover the cost of a review of the existing Town Plan by a professional firm of Planners. Similar amounts would be laid over the following three years to meet the total cost of preparing the new Plan estimated at £10,000.

The Co. Manager said that he was very keen to have such a plan drawn up as at present the town was not properly zoned and he wanted to avoid a recurrence of the problem which they had last July when objections were made to the location of a new industrial estate at Abbeyville. He said that they had no industrial estate located in the town at present and they had failed to purchase land in the district for this purpose. A study group would prepare the new plan which would indicate where such land should be located. He said that they would require 16 to 17 acres and would probably have to acquire it by a Compulsory Purchase Order.

**HARBOUR SURVEYS**  
Under the heading "Environmental Protection" in the estimates a sum of £2,000 was included for the monitoring of the harbour waters in Dungarvan harbour twice during the year. The Manager said that this was necessary as outside agencies were taking it on themselves to do surveys in the harbour and were publishing reports which were not factual. In this he was supported by the Town Engineer, Mr. P. Walsh, who said that these monitoring tests were necessary to provide them with correct facts and figures as otherwise

they would have no way of refuting anything or anyone who claimed that the water in the harbour was polluted or polluted. Such monitoring tests would also enable them to assess whether the harbour could carry the sewage effluent being discharged into it and if they found things going wrong they could then decide whether they should spend more money in having the sewage treated before discharge. Mr. P. Whelan said that the new Town Plan was going to cost far too much money and it was up to them to cut their teeth according to the measure as the people of the town could not afford to pay this at the present time. The ratepayers could not be expected to bear any great increase in rates and he knew that there were many poor people and small shopkeepers who were actually being pushed to the wall to pay their way at present. Mr. J. A. Murphy said that £10,000 was a colossal amount of money to give any firm of engineers merely to review the Town Plan. He agreed that some review was necessary but said that it should not cost anything like the amount stated. He proposed that they put up only half the amount to be included in his year and make a saving of £1,250 under this heading. Referring to the £2,000 for the monitoring of the harbour, Senator A. Deasy said that he thought this was something which should be done at the expense of the Department of Local Government and not the Council. He was aware that the Department had a number of monitoring officers employed and they should be requested to do this work in Dungarvan. After further discussion it was decided by 5 votes to 3 to delete the £2,000 for this purpose from the estimates and to ask the Department to carry out the tests. These costs amounted to £3,250 representing a sum of 12p of the rates. The other items in the estimates were approved. Mr. Murphy then proposed that a rate of £9.17, a reduction of 12p on the sum submitted, be adopted. This was seconded by Mr. W. Cotter and passed.

## FOUR-CAR PILE UP INJURES SEVEN OUTSIDE DUNGARVAN

Seven people were removed to Ardkreen Hospital, Waterford on last Sunday evening following a head-on four car collision at Garrybane five miles from Dungarvan on the main Cork-Waterford road. Among the injured were a husband and wife and their two young children. The accident occurred shortly before seven o'clock on a 200 yards straight stretch of roadway. Three of the four cars were completely wrecked, and it was little short of miraculous that none of the occupants was fatally injured. A fleet of ambulances was rushed to the scene and members of the Dungarvan Fire Brigade unit had to release one of the drivers who was badly trapped. Medical assistance was also rendered at the scene by Dr. M. K. Cusack and Dr. Anne Casey both from Dungarvan. The injured were John Cull-

lmane Dunmore East his wife Anne John (9) son and Delirve (7) daughter; Donald O'Sullivan 6 Brandon Crescent, Dillston Cross Cork, the driver of one of the cars; Richard O'Sullivan his brother, 13, Lower Pouladuff Road, Cork and another brother, Finbarr O'Sullivan, 18 Carbery Grove, Cork. John Cullmane (Jnr) was stated to be critically injured but the condition of the other six was described as satisfactory. Two of the drivers Miss Margaret Flynn, Ballymacmaigue Dungarvan and Mr. F. Keegan William Street, Waterford were both badly shocked but escaped uninjured from the pile up. For a time after the crash there was a big build-up of traffic as gards and fire brigade personnel worked feverishly to clear the roadway which was strewn with wreckage.
