## PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

### CHARITY ON THE ROADS

Christmas time is a special occasion for charitable appeals and people in general usually respond magnificently when it comes to parting with a little extra cash for the several charitable causes concerned. But I think that for the next few weeks, over the festive period, people should exercise the virtue of charity in another practical manner by taking extra care and showing more consideration for each other on the roads.

There appears to be no shortage of money in circulation and as usual there will be parties and celebrations when old acquaintances meet to have their Christmas drinks. It is in this regard that many of us display a great lack of charity. Having drunk not wisely but too well, we think nothing of getting behind the wheel of a car and, to use a common term, of motoring on in doing so drivers put their own lives in jeopardy and also those of the passengers in their cars not to mention those in the other cars they meet and the pedestrians and cyclists they have to pass.

It is a time of extra heavy traffic on the roads and a time when the weather conditions for driving are not always the best. So do be charitable when on the roads over the festive period. Take care of yourselves and show the same care and consideration for others. Let Caution, Care and Consideration be your three big Cs for Christmas.

### THE EXTRAORDINARY GEAR OF JUDGES AND COUNSEL

It is quite a while back since I wrote about the wigs and gowns worn by judges and counsel and the outmoded Victorian atmosphere which they still tended to maintain in our Courts. I was pleased therefore to see reported last week where Rev Professor Enda McDonagh of Mayo noth advised the judges and counsel to get rid of their wigs and gowns as this extra-ordinary gear did not uphold the dignity of the law. He said that the system tolerated in Irish courts damaged vulnerable individuals.

A move was made in the early 1960s by the then Minister for Justice in the Fianna Fail government, Mr. Charles Haughey, to bring Irish courts more up-to-date by modernising the form of address to the court and dispensing with the wearing of wigs and gowns. There was little enthusiasm at the time for such a move and many judges counsel and barristers regarded it as unnecessary interference with an historical association and tradition going back for more than 200 years. They saw in the wig and gown something that added dignity and honour to the legal profession.

Rev Dr McDonagh very correctly pointed out that the dignity of the law was upheld by firmness and competence. At the time he was speaking at the final session of a three-day seminar on "Crime and Punishment" organised by the Mental Health Association of Ireland. He said that the whole court procedure beginning with the moment an accused person walked in and saw people in their "extraordinary gear" was "simply terrifying." Their "gear" might appeal to someone with a perverse sense of humour, but it was part of a court system that had a very inhibiting, distressing and painful effect on people brought before it.

I find myself in complete agreement with these sentiments as expressed by Dr McDonagh and think that it is beyond time to have the necessary changes made to do away with such things as wigs and gown and the forms of address still used in our courts.

## CO. COUNCIL WATER POLICY CHALLENGED

The agreed policy of Waterford County Council to encourage group water schemes for the provision of domestic water supplies was challenged at the monthly meeting of the Council in Dungarvan last Monday when a deputation from the Colligan area came officially before the Council and a group from Kilrossanty attended the meeting as a "back-up" for a member who was pleading their case.

The Colligan deputation which included Messrs Foley, Walsh and Dwyer were introduced by Cllr S Whelan who said that it was 12 years ago since the list of names of people in the area wanting water had been submitted and some, including the members of the deputation, had still not got it.

Mr Foley told the Council that 10 householders had applied 12 years ago but 4 of them had been left out and as a result they felt that they had been victimised. He had no water in his house for his large family and last summer they had to go 3 miles for drinking water.

Mr Dwyer said that he had to get his water from a hole in the bog and "it was pure mud". Mr Walsh said that they had no water throughout the summer and all the water they used for human consumption had to be boiled.

Mr Curran Chairman pointed out that it was never intended that water could be provided on tap for everyone in the county. The big problem was the cost of these schemes and where the money for them would come from. He referred to the fact that it had taken 17 votes and two meetings to strike a rate for next year because the amount was so high.

Mr F King said that as far as he was concerned water was essential and he would support any supplementary estimate proposed towards the provision of water.

Members generally supported the case for the deputation but it came back to the cost and the question of providing the money.

The Chairman pointed out that there were 20 other such schemes needed in other parts of the county and if they approved of one they would have to approve of them all. He said that the Council had adopted a policy of group schemes but now apparently wanted to change this.

Mr C A O'Connor Co Manager said that proposing a supplementary estimate at this stage was no good. Their obligations were limited to the monies provided in the estimates for the coming year and there was no other money available.

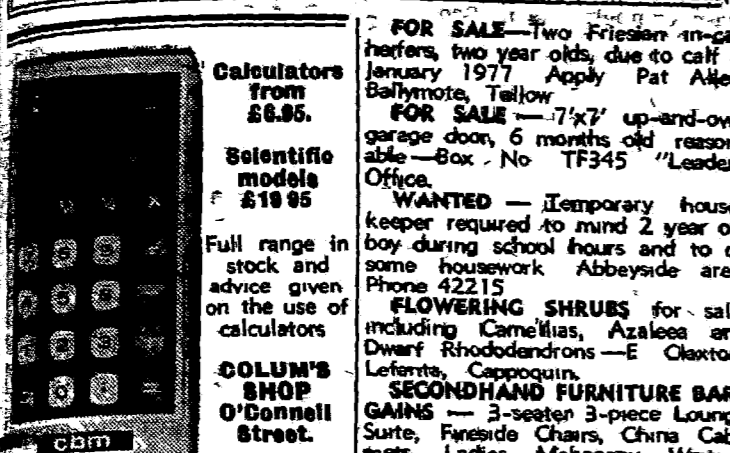
