A DEATH WISH

As if the immense problems of inflation and unemployment which have nearly crippled the country were not enough to contend with we have had, in recent times, a series of strikes which have almost totally paralyzed us. One after the other we have had the banks, CIE and ESB bringing the country to its knees in a series of actions which smack very much like a death wish and one may well be pardoned for asking why, when we are under such grave economic stress from outside sources, we seem so intent on further aggravating the position by self-inflicted wounds.

While each of the stoppages has been serious the power cuts which occurred last week following the ESB shift workers work-to-rule have proved the most chaotic to date. The fact that their action was unofficial, based on a most trivial complaint and in the selfish pursuit of sectional interest must brand it as being utterly callous and absolutely irresponsible. Not only did the power cuts bring industry to a halt but they put lives at risk and in fact a number of lives were lost as a result. The situation was worsened by the intensely cold spell which went with it.

The concerted cessation of work by a body of workers is a very powerful tactic because it is so powerful and can have such crippling effects which apply indiscriminately across the population it is a tactic which should be used only when absolutely necessary and only when it is a genuinely democratic expression of all the workers involved.

Unofficial or "wildcat" strikes indicate that union officials can no longer control the actions of small minorities of their members and there is a trend towards unilateral action on the part of small groups of workers who neglect not only the interests of the public in general but even the long term interests of their fellow trade unionists. While trade unionism has traditionally prided itself on championing the interests of the underprivileged it was, ironically, that very section of our society which was hit the hardest when the buses went off the roads and the electricity was cut off last week.

It must be emphasised that such unofficial actions cannot and will not be tolerated and thus must be brought home to such strikers by every possible means. But added to the public protest the unions themselves must take action if agreed procedures are disregarded there must be some form of official union sanction. Added to this the Managements of our key industries must examine their negotiation and arbitration procedures to see if they are all they should be while the Government must also look to the role they must play when an emergency that is capable of shutting down the country arises.

These remedial actions must be looked into as a matter of urgency. We have had too many of these crippling strikes in too short a time and something must be done if we are not to wind up in the quagmire which we seem to be heading for with all speed at present.

ABBESIDE BRIDGE

It has been accepted for years that this bridge needs to be widened in order to adequately cope with the increased volume of traffic using it and also to cope with the ever-increasing size and weight of the lorries, trucks

Part of the mammoth task of preparation includes the laying of 3 1/2 miles of mains water to be piped around the site and the cutting of 700 tons of wood for fuel. A staff of 600 volunteers are being geared and briefed to administer and run an exciting programme which will keep the scouts fully occupied throughout their stay at the camp.

Constantly over the winter months work parties from all over the country—Dungarvan, Waterford, Clonmel, Cappoquin, Carrick-on-Suir, Fermoy, Cobh, Mitchelstown, Cork, Limerick, Dublin, Derry, Belfast, Amagh, Newry and other places have been giving up their week-ends to prepare the site to have it in readiness in time.

The overall plan provides for the establishment of six sub-camps on the site and these will take their names from places in the old five provinces of Ireland. Aileach (the Foyle district of Donegal), Caiseal (the famous rock in Tipperary), Dal Riada (the north coastal tip of Antrim), Cruachan (the county of Roscommon), Emain Macha (in the town of Armagh), Teamhair (in south county Dublin) and Deise (the diocese of Waterford and Lismore).

The sub-camps of Cruachan, Emain Macha, Caiseal and Aileach will be for the Scout Troops on camp and each will have between 1,450 and 1,850 campers, sub-camp Deise will be reserved particularly for the Venturer Section and will have room for about 400 while in sub-camp Dal Riada accommodation will be provided for the Girl Guides who will attend.

1977 IS JAMBORORA YEAR
The major Golden Jubilee Celebration of the Catholic Boy Scouts of Ireland will take place later this year and despite the dreadful outdoor conditions which we are at present experiencing work in preparing for the great occasion is beginning to move into top gear.

PROBLEM OF STREET TRADERS AGAIN RAISED

Mr. J. A. Murphy, Vice-Chairman who presided at the monthly meeting of Dungarvan Urban Council last Monday night again raised the much discussed problem of street traders. He said that while the recent Christmas season had proved an outstanding one for the traders of the town it could have been more so but for the outside traders who came into the town all through the weeks preceding and sold all kinds of goods on the Square.

Mr. E. Kyne T.D.—And they were selling at 50% less. The Chairman said that these people paid no taxes. Pointing out that under the bye-laws there was a one hour parking restriction at the Square he asked if the vans of these traders which had been parked there throughout the day were governed by these parking regulations.

Mr. C. A. O'Connor Co-Manager, said that he would require notice of this question before he could answer it. Mr. P. Walsh Town Engineer, expressed the opinion that he did not think street traders would be subject to the regulations as the Square was a place which was traditionally used for trading.

The Chairman said that he had been inundated with complaints from angry traders in the town with whom he agreed as these outsiders were hitting hardest at the people who were paying most in rates to the Council.

Mr. Kyne said that the ordinary working man in the town was not concerned with that and was quite happy to be able to get goods at reduced prices. He pointed out that street traders were licensed and paid their taxes to the government.

Mr. W. O'Gorman—But the staff they are selling is of inferior quality.

IRRELEVANT
Senator A. Deasy said that the discussion was irrelevant as the special Commission which had been set up to examine this whole matter had found that street traders had a right to trade in a given area.

FROST, SNOW AND POWER CUTS

Last week was a period that will remain in memory for a long time because of the misery caused by the very severe frost followed by a heavy snowfall which has made this winter so far the worst in 26 years. Several areas especially on the high ground of the Comeragh and the Drum Hills were isolated for days and travelling was made hazardous because of the dangerous condition of the roads.

The conditions created by the terrible cold were intensified by the long ESB power cuts which occurred daily throughout the week leaving people in all areas without heat and light and bringing business to a general almost total standstill. It was surely a week of chaos and misery but fortunately no serious accidents were reported.

Mr. D. Goode said that he had been hammering at the problem for three years as his livelihood was at stake through the operation of these street traders. "If I had my way I wouldn't let them into the town at all," he said.

Mr. P. Whelan said that the point was that these people sold inferior articles and then disappeared and people had no redress but if they were dissatisfied when they bought from shops in the town they could bring the goods back and have them replaced.

Finally it was agreed that the Co-Manager look into the problem raised by the Chairman in regard to the parking regulations at the Square.
