PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

GENERAL ELECTION YEAR

The certainty of the matter is that this is a general election year, the uncertainties are when it will take place and who will win.

The Fine Gael and Labour parties of the Coalition government are basing their hopes of being returned to power on the outcome of the budget while Fianna Fail are hammering at the economic mess the country is in and are offering their policies as the only solution to the problems of inflation and unemployment.

How are the public reacting? Very slowly at present beyond the active supporters of each of the parties all of whom see only victories for their own.

Here in Waterford we will in this election, revert to a 4-seat constituency and the contest should prove to be keen and sharp.

The Fianna Fail party with our annual Ard Fheis which takes place in Dublin this week-end as the spring-board for the first big moves in who they hope will be the lead back.

Local interest in Dungarvan in the Ard Fheis will centre mainly on the bid of Mrs Rita O'Brien, Chairman of the local Urban Council, for re-election to the Select Committee of 15 which comprises part of the party's National Executive.

The end result in Waterford is that four deputies will be elected but with Labour hoping to retain their one seat, Fianna Fail hopefully looking for three, someone must lose.

MINISTERS' VISIT The Minister for Education, Mr Peter Barry, TD, will visit Dungarvan on Monday next, February 21, to perform the official opening of St John's Special School at Youghal Road.

Their Lordships Most Rev Dr Russell, Bishop of Waterford and Lismore and Dr Vard Armstrong, Bishop of Cashel and Emly, Waterford and Lismore will also be present to bless the school in an Ecumenical ceremony.

NOT MUCH HOPE FOR SALMON NET MEN

Salmon net fishermen around the coast from Dungarvan, Helwick, Ardmore and Youghal have been up in arms over the regulation governing the mesh depth of drift nets and the increase in the cost of licences.

However, it would appear that there is little or no hope that the agitation and protests will bring about the desired results if the replies given by Mr Michael Pat Murphy to questions raised on these matters in the Dail last week are to be taken as the government's policy on them.

Mr Sean Brosnan, TD, Youghal, asked if By-Law No 582 of 11th March, 1976, which prohibits the use of salmon drift nets in excess of 30 meshes in depth insofar as it affects the Lismore fishery district where nets in excess of this depth have been traditionally used for many years would be reviewed.

He was joined by Mr Eddie Collins TD, Waterford who asked if the Minister was aware of the reduction in the depth of mesh for drift net fishermen in Ardmore and of the hardships this would cause and whether he would take steps to remedy the situation.

Answering both questions together, Mr JM P Murphy said that the by-law limiting to 30 meshes the depth of drift nets which may be used for salmon fishing was introduced as a conservation measure and it was not proposed to review the terms of the by-law until its effects over a full season could be assessed.

Raising the matter of licence fees, Mr Collins asked the Minister if, in view of the large increase in the cost of salmon fishing licences, he would consider issuing such licences at the old rate or at a substantially reduced rate to qualified persons over 65 years of age who have been fishing all their lives.

To this Mr Murphy replied that the terms of the order under which the duties in respect of salmon fishing licences were recently increased did not permit of licences being issued at reduced rates and accordingly it was not possible to accede to the Deputy's request.

WATERFORD TEAM IN QUEST FOR QUIZ WIN

Cross Country Quiz the popular TV general knowledge question time contest has begun a new series of transmissions from RTE television and for the next few months, the sixteen county teams which have qualified from the preliminary tests to compete will be paired in the half-hour programme which will be transmitted every Thursday evening at 7.15 p.m.

Each team comprises the four top members of the Macra na Feirme branches in each county and the team which will win the Quiz Outright will receive the famous Quiz Perpetual Cup and will be taken on an educational tour by the sponsors.

Protection work to save road at Ballyvoile

Members of Waterford County Council at their monthly meeting in Dungarvan last Monday were notified that Road Fund Grants for 1977 to a total of £272,900 had been allocated to the County by the Department of Local Government.

Mr J D Hally, County Engineer told the Council that the grants showed an increase of £81,000 on the 1976 level and an increase of £34,800 on the level anticipated when the estimates for the current year were prepared.

Mr Hally said that after transferring part of the money into block grants he would have about £38,000 to £10,000 available and he proposed to use this to carry out some protection work on the cliff base at Ballyvoile where they had a serious coast erosion problem.

He said that at present the edge of the cliff was within 60 feet of the public road. They had a scheme for work to be done here with the Board of Works since 1964 but he did not think they were any nearer to getting anything done now than they were then.

There was a very large gathering at the annual general meeting of Lismo and Cappoquin Credit Union at the club on Tuesday evening and the informative discussion took place on all reports before the meeting.

The report of the Board of Directors presented by the Secretary, Mr J. O'Connell, showed a year of continued progress. Members' shares increased from £26,109 to £37,743.

There are two 'subs' on the team, 26-year old Matt Nolan, Cairngadusta, Kilmecan and 29-year old Mary Walsh of Adamstown, Kilmecan, both members of the Ballyduff Lower branch.

All four have pleaded not guilty to entering St Joseph's Hospital Dungarvan as trespassers on the night of January 26th-27th last and stealing drugs to the value of £123 30.

CHOICE FOR MULTI-CHANNEL TELEVISION OUSTS BBC 1

By 9 votes to 6 Waterford County Council at their monthly meeting in Dungarvan last Monday decided that multi-channel TV would be more acceptable as a choice than BBC 1 for people in the single channel areas.

Discussion on the subject was instigated by Cllr F King who moved a motion that the Council call on the Minister for Posts & Telegraphs to re-broadcast BBC 1 in order to give a choice to people in single channel areas.

Cllr King said that people in the present RTE single channel areas should be provided with a choice and should be given the same alternative as people in Dublin and along the east coast where BBC 1 was available as it was also available in the Waterford city through the satellite system.

It said Cllr King 'it is good enough for half the country to have BBC 1 then it should also be good enough for the other half and we as a Council should bring as much pressure as possible on the Minister to change his mind in regard to RTE 2. He added that he did not agree with the Minister's decision in regard to RTE 2 in the same way that he did not agree that the result of the survey carried out was a true reflection of what the people in the single channel areas wanted.

Cllr O'Riordan said that if such a motion was passed it would be a sad reflection on the Council. He said that the Minister should get his priorities right first before any second channel was provided. He said Cllr Ryan 'come from an area (the Nare) where we can't even get a proper signal from RTE 1 not to mention RTE or BBC.

Cllr J Coffey seconded Cllr King's motion said that he was aware that the majority of people in single channel areas wanted BBC 1 instead of RTE 2. He was as simple as that. He said that the survey which had been carried out was 'loaded' and consequently meant nothing.

SHOULD HAVE MULTI-CHANNEL Cllr J Fahy TD said that he agreed with the provision of a choice and said that most programmes from RTE were just deplorable but he asked if they should be confined to BBC 1 instead of having a multi-channel choice which was the position in Dublin and along the east coast. If it's not bad for them then it can't be bad for the rest of the country and I think we should accept nothing less than they have at present. He then proposed an amendment that they press the Minister to provide multi-channel viewing for the entire country.

This was seconded by Cllr T Healy. Cllr King pointed out that the provision of multi-channel would prove much more costly, costly and expensive than the re-broadcasting of BBC 1 and that was why he opted for the latter in his motion.

Senator J Deasy said that while RTE were doing quite a good job at the moment it was obvious that a second RTE channel would be exceedingly poor as the present organisation can hardly handle the existing single channel. He also agreed that the survey carried out had been loaded in favour of the RTE 2 concept and the result was incorrect and they should ask the Minister to change his mind in this respect.

Mr Fahy's amendment was then put to the meeting and was carried by 9 votes to 6.




