The men spent almost an hour in their liferaft before being taken safely on board one of two Helvick Head trawlers which rushed to the scene after picking up distress calls on their radios from the stricken vessel The drama began around 11

am less than two hours after the Howth bound "Colm Maireid" left Helvick harbour Suddenly the skipper George Moran from County Mayo and the second man on board Denis of Currabinny, County

Good of Currabinny, County Cork saw smoke bellowing from the engine room of the 70-foot-long trawler

The men had the use of only one fire extinguisher which was in the wheelhouse of the vessel The others were located in the cabin which was in-accessible to them because of accessible to them because of the fire and smoke Unable to effectively control

the blaze and fearing a pos-sible explosion the men decided to abandon the trawler Before doing so they sent distress radio messages these were picked up by two Helvick fishing trawlers the "Moyness" skippered by Mossie Kelly and the Tiron" skippered by Tom Kelly



All four accused Kevin D'Arcy ing The Grove Abbey-side Anthony Duggan, Keating Street Kieran Cantwell Childers Estate and Patrick Coleman Boreenatra pleaded not guilty to the charges when they appenned on remand at Dungarvan Court

The defendants were charged that (1) on January 27th last at the County Home Dungarvan they stole assorted drugs valued £12330 the property of the South Eastern Health Board. (2) on the same occasion recsiving the drugs knowing them to have been sholen (3) entering the County Home as trespassers on January 26th/27th and stealing drugs valued £123 30, and (4) being in unawful possession of dangerous drugs at Castle St eet. Dungar van on January 29th

During a lengthy hearing Garda J. Twomey told of a car chale in the early hours of the morning of Jahuary 29th involving a garda patrol car and a car driven by D'Arcy in which the other three accused were pastengers

Garda Twomey said he saw articles being thrown out the di liver's winidow las the gave chase and later when the four men were arrested and taken to the garda station a quantity of drugs were found on searching the car in the presence of the




