#### STREET TRADERS NOT EXEMPT FROM PARKING LAWS IN **DUNGARVAN**

According to Mr A R Far-rell Solicitor, Law Advisor to Dungarvan Urban Council-street traders are not exempt from the one hour parking regulation which applies to Grattan Square during business hours under the Councils Parking Bye-laws

from parking on the Square at all because of bye-law 6 (1) (a) which says that a vehicle may be parked only if it complies with the following conditions, that is to say that it is not a vehicle used in connection with the sale of modes. with the sale of goods or any service This in my opinion, would mean that street traders selling from vehicles could not park at any time during business hours on the Square"

mr T Kyne TD, said that it was unrealistic to think that anyone would build a £10 000 house there if a Council scheme was going to go up close by later on He said that the only thing to do was to either hold the site for an entire Council scheme or lease it now to pri-vate contractors Finally the Council agreed to seek tenders for a building licence for private development

# Easier Means Test for persons claiming Blind Pension

The amount of earnings disregarded in assessing the means of a blind person for pension purposes is being considerably increased from April 1977. As a result, a blind person whose means are derived partly from earnings can have up to £10 a week, if single, and qualify for the maximum pension He can have up to £19 a week and still qualify for a reduced pension. If he is married he can have an extra £3 a week plus £2 a week for each child and still qualify for a pension.

Those whose pensions are reduced on account of their earnings should apply to have their pensions reviewed Persons who have been refused a pension before on grounds of excessive means and feel they will now qualify should apply immediately | Claim forms are available at all Post Offices
