PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

DEATH OF CARDINAL CONWAY

This week people in all parts of the country, north as well as south, have been mourning for the death of Cardinal William Conway, Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of All Ireland.

Cardinal Conway who was aged only 64 years died peacefully at his residence in Ara Coeli, Armagh, at 10.30 p.m. on Sunday night. A statement from the Catholic Press Office in Dublin issued on the hour after his death said that the Cardinal began to slip into unconsciousness shortly after 7 p.m. and died peacefully and quietly at his bedside. He was buried in the presence of his brother, Fr. Joseph Conway and Fr. Noel Conway and the Auxiliary Bishop of Armagh, Dr. Francis Lenny as well as the Cardinal's doctor, two nursing sisters and the house staff at Ara Coeli.

One of a family of nine children born in Belfast, he was ordained in 1937 and after a period in Rome and in Belfast he was appointed Vice-President of Maynooth in 1957. The following year he became Auxiliary to Cardinal D'Alton whom he succeeded on the latter's death in 1963. He was created a Cardinal on February 22, 1965.

Cardinal Conway was a big man both in physique and in his accomplishments as head of the Catholic Church in Ireland and his untimely death will be a great loss both to the Church and to the country.

Besides his two brothers he is also survived by his 86 years old mother who lives in Belfast and by four sisters: Solas siorraid a'na om.

EXCELLENT "GOOD DEED" SUGGESTION

In a recent issue of the "Scout Leader," the monthly newsletter of the Catholic Boy Scouts of Ireland, the feature article on the front page contains a special message from the Chief Scout, Mr. J. D. Holly, Dungarvan, to mark the Golden Jubilee Year of the CBSI. The message is directed to all scouts all over the country and in it the Chief Scout urges all to give every possible support to the special project undertaken by the Scout Section of the Organisation—"Good Deed '77".

The project is aimed at the provision of guide dogs for the blind and in his message Mr. Holly has this to say: "This is a great act of charity and a cause which should have the support of every member of the Association. I know from personal experience with some friends of mine of the great assistance these dogs can be and the degree of freedom which having one confers on a blind person. Only those who have had personal experience and knowledge through contact with the blind can appreciate fully the value of the dogs but even a little thought will, I am sure, convince everybody of how important they are."

The Chief Scout then goes on to say: "It is unfortunate that at present we have to get dogs from England and send Irish blind people to England to train with the dog because this is a great strain on the people involved and is of course also expensive. I know that Scouts everywhere will want to do their share to help out in this great work and I can think of no better 'good deed' for our jubilee year than to help in the provision of these guide dogs."

I do agree, as I am sure will most of the readers of this column, that this is an excellent "good deed" suggestion and one with which many of the general public might wish to identify. It is an aspect of life and living which most of us think very little about but this message of the CBSI Chief Scout might tend to open our eyes to more than just what comes within our field of vision.

COUNCIL TO DECIDE POLICY ON LAND DEVELOPMENT

When Senator Deasy asked at the monthly meeting of Dungarvan Urban Council last Monday night whether there had been any further development since the last meeting in the negotiations with CIE for the purchase of the old railway line at Abbeyside, Mr. B. White, Town Clerk stated that he had been in touch with the CIE Area Manager in Waterford who had informed him that he was putting the matter before the Secretary of the Company in Dublin and he felt that the views expressed by the members at the last Council meeting would expedite the matter. Senator Deasy said that this matter was dragging on far too long and the position was still highly unsatisfactory. Reference was also made by several members to the ill-kept appearance of the land being reclaimed at the Causeway which was described as an eyesore in its present condition and which looked like a public dumping place.

The Town Clerk said that the gate was left open last week and to enable a local builder to dump rubble there but on Monday morning the body of an old mini car was found dumped there. The matter was being attended to, he said. Senator Deasy said that the Council should be very careful about how this land and the CIE property in Abbeyside would be developed when they got it and it was agreed that the matter should be fully discussed at the next meeting to decide the Council policy as to its development to ensure that it was developed purely as an amenity area and that nothing of a commercial nature would be allowed there.

same old traffic problems in Dungarvan

Members of Dungarvan Urban Council at their monthly meeting last Monday night again made complaints about serious traffic problems in town and Abbeyside which have been raised and discussed on a number of occasions in the past.

Cllr P. Whelan referred to the continuing problem of traffic control at the Causeway in Abbeyside caused by cars which do not slow down and that although the road was wide people and especially elderly people were finding it very difficult to cross from one side to the other without being knocked down by speeding cars. Something would have to be done there he said or else they could have another serious accident.

Cllr W. Costello pointed out that in the past it was suggested that a pedestrian crossing be put there. The matter was being attended to, he said. 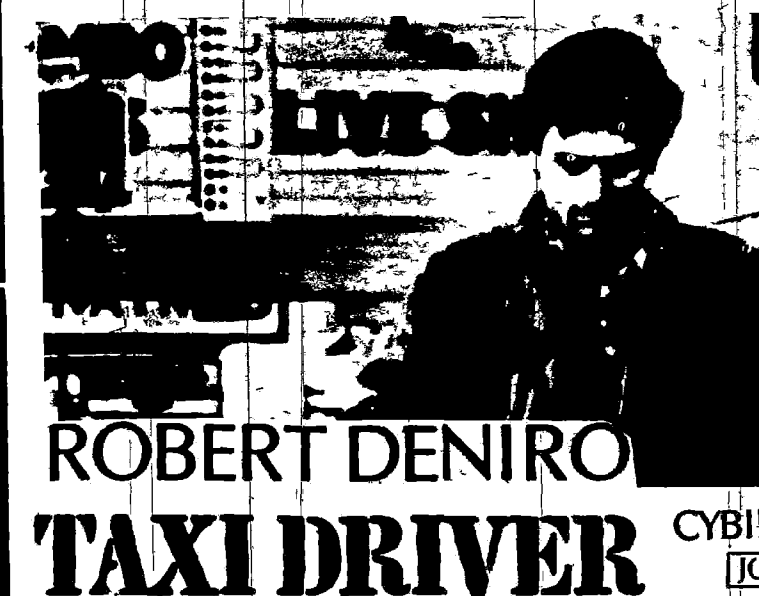

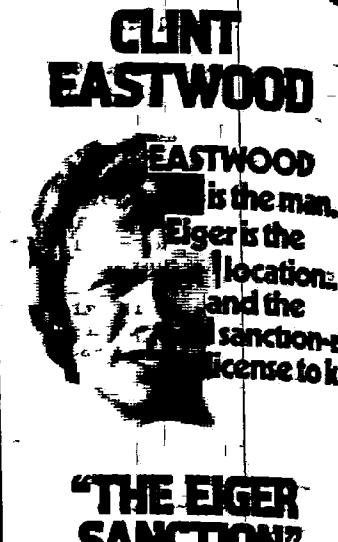
