ARRANGEMENTS FOR GIVING RELIEF The relief applies in respect of individual dwellings (houses, flats, etc.) together with any small garden and outoffices (fuel shed, private garage or carport, greenhouse, agricultural outbuildings) which are included with the dwellings in a single valuation figure on the current Valuation List.
