## NEW 3-STAGE SEWERAGE SCHEME FOR DUNGARVAN

Proposals prepared by the Consultants Messrs B G Pettit & Co Cork for a review of the town sewerage system to serve the areas of Fr Two-mey's Road Ringastlogue (Childers Estate) and Boreenatra were placed before the members of Dungarvan Urban Council by the Town Engineer, Mr P Walsh at the Council's monthly meeting held last Monday night.

Mr Walsh said that it was proposed to carry out the work in three stages and when completed it would clear up the Western Bay and all the sewerage would be pumped into the Sluiseheen and from there to Abbeyside where the marine outfall would be located.

DIED AFTER FALL INTO OPEN TRENCH

How a 57-year-old retired farmer died following a fall into an open trench was told at the inquest held by Dr. J. A. Gallagher coroner, Lismore, sitting with a jury at Dungarvan Court-house last Friday on Laurence Power, 7, Keating Street, Dungarvan, and formerly of Clona. Evidence was given by Peggy Cronin with whom the deceased resided as a lodger that when she left her home at Keating Street at 10.30 a.m. on Saturday, March 12, he was shaving himself when he returned later in the day he was gone out and she did not return until the following morning. She was informed that he had died in Keating Street during the night. Maurice O'Connor stated that on Saturday night, March 12, he was in a local bar and saw Larry Power there he was fairly drunk and left between 9.40 p.m. and 10 p.m. Margaret O'Mahony, 21, Keating Street gave evidence that she had been at a dance that night and was returning home about 2.30 a.m. as she walked up by the end of Keating Street at the back of the "Moo-custer" bar she saw a man lying on his back in a trench with his feet sticking out of the hole. She was frightened and ran home but then Albert Power and Noel Duggan came along and they all went back. The man was very dead. They went to Ben O'Neill's house from where he was phoned for the Garda.

Garda M. Shanahan said that as a result of the report he went to Keating Street at 2.45 a.m. and saw the body of a man in a sitting position lying in a hole. He appeared to be dead. He called for an ambulance and accompanied the body to the mortuary. The trench where the body was had been opened for the purpose of laying a pipe and had been nearly closed. The area was well lit from a nearby street lamp but there were no warning lights at the hole. Garda P. Noctor gave evidence of identifying the body as that of the deceased who was known to him. Dr. J. Stacey, Abbeyside stated that on March 14 he carried out a post mortem examination at the District Hospital and from his findings he formed the opinion that death had been caused by asphyxia due to a lapse of consciousness after a fall. The jury returned a verdict in accordance with the medical evidence. The members of the jury were M.A. Nick Casey (foreman), Jerry Dee, James Power, Tom Murphy, Finbar Dunne, Michael Deasy, Donal O'Connell, Michael Whelan and Pat Ormonde. Sympathy was extended to the bereaved relatives by the coroner, the foreman of the jury and Sgt. M. Egan on behalf of the Garda Authorities.

WATERFORD HAMMERED BY CLARE

CLARE 1-18, WATERFORD 3-6

Waterford's footballing stock sunk to new depths of despair at Fraher Field, Dungarvan, on Sunday last when the senior side were literally hammered by Clare in their first round Munster championship tie. Forget about Waterford's 3-4 tally. Two of those goals came in the last two minutes of the game and were nothing more than face-savers. Waterford's general performance in a game best forgotten that caused more than just anxiety for the future of the county at this level. Waterford were mercilessly slaughtered by an unimpressive Clare side. They showed a lack of fitness, a lack of training and a lack of match practice, and above all they or the majority of the side at any rate, showed a complete lack of interest and it was no wonder that most of the fairly large crowd were suddenly wending their way home long before the finish. Something will have to be done if Waterford are to salvage any of their lost prestige. It is a mistake about it. Clare were by no means a good footballing side. They were anything but. But at least they were until they possessed the heart and the will to win. Waterford had the wind behind them in the first half but were beaten by Clare in the end of the first 35 minutes, period. Even then there was hope that they might lift their game and make a contest of it. But as the minutes ticked by in the second half and Clare sent over point after point it became painfully obvious that Waterford were not going to be beaten but badly beaten. Clare had sent over nine points before Waterford had their first score of this half, a goal in the 60th minute. Clare pointed again before referee George Ryan, Tipperary, blew the final whistle five minutes prematurely. Rehashing his mistake the official restarted the game and two further Clare points followed. There were just a handful of spectators present when Vinny Kirwan had 2 goals for Waterford in the last minute of the game. Waterford minor footballers hovered on the brink of championship extinction at Fraher Field, Dungarvan, on Sunday last when they trailed by a point to Clare with just three minutes to go in their first round Munster championship tie. It looked at this stage as if Clare were going to get through until Anthony Kelly earned the right to a replay when he pointed for Waterford from a free two minutes from time. The sides now meet in Tipperary on this Thursday night, May 19. Strangely enough this was a game Waterford should have won but any chance they had was ruled through extremely bad finishing. Both sides missed a number of chances but Waterford were far more culpable in this respect and in the end they were lucky to survive a surprisingly good Clare challenge. Waterford, who led from the 7th to the 56th minute played well and had a much stronger breeze in the first half and looked to have the measure of Clare when they scored four points without reply in the first quarter. 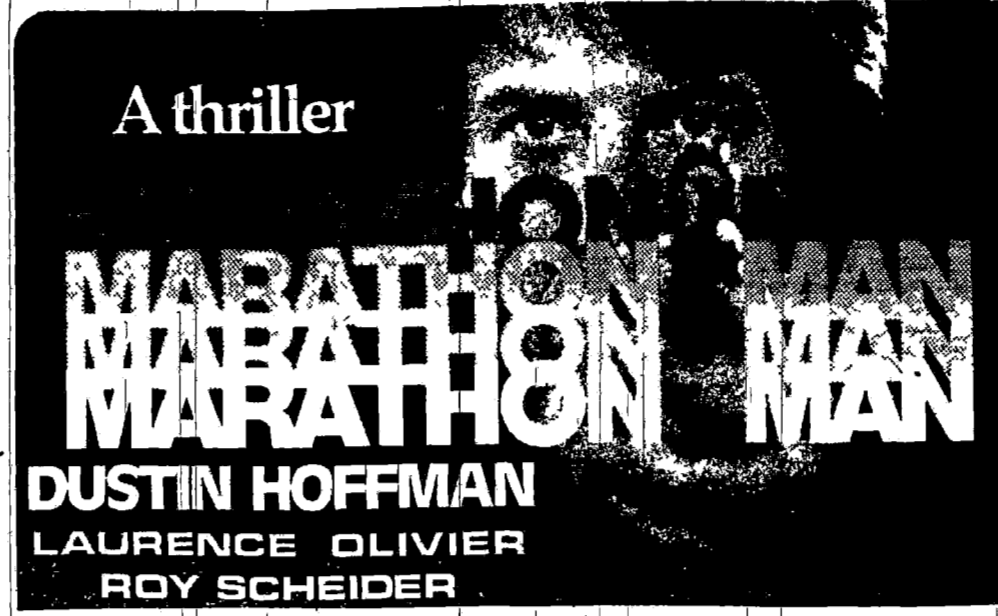

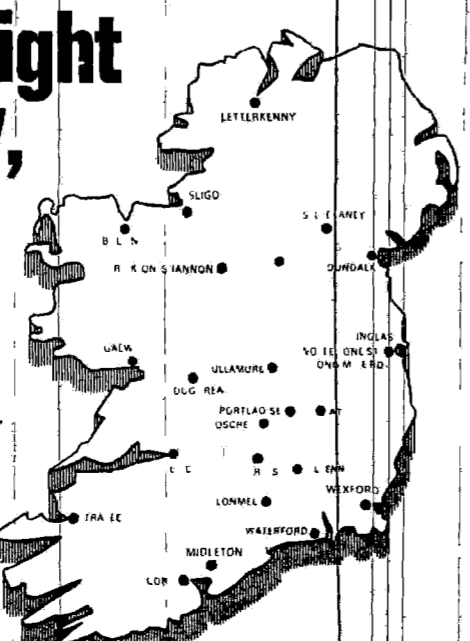

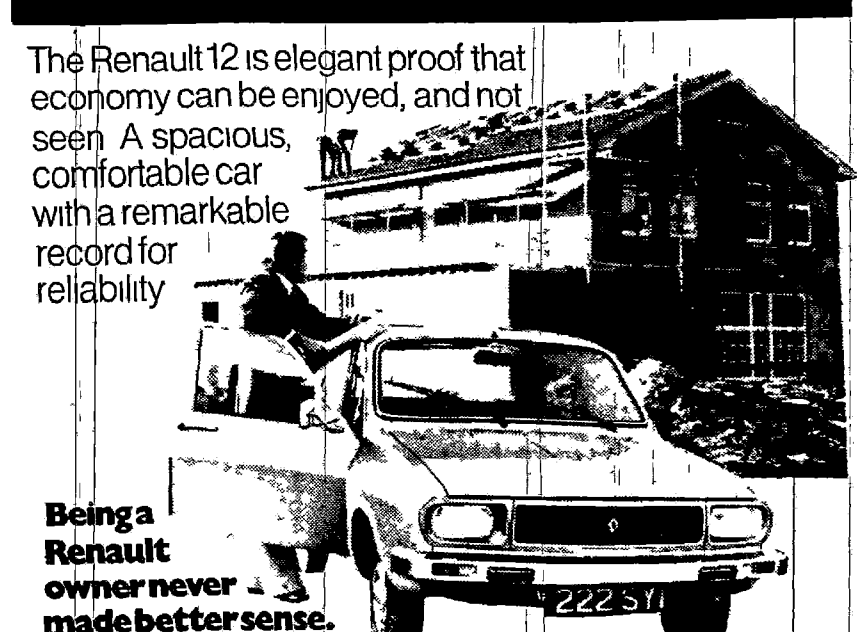

**COURT SEQUEL TO BUS-CAR COLLISION:**
