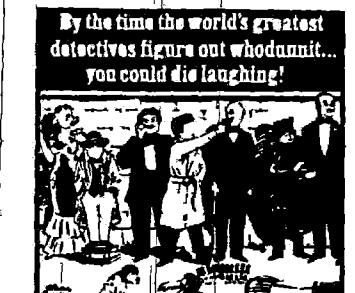

FEARS OF BAN ON DRIFT NETTING

Fears are mounting in fishing circles throughout the South and South East coasts that emergency action may be introduced within the next few weeks by the Department of Fisheries officials to close down drift net fishing for salmon around the Irish coast from the end of June.

Fishermen fear the move as they go through one of the worst salmon fishing seasons for almost 65 years, with landings only a fraction of previous years.

Last week Department of Fisheries inspectors called on salmon dealers throughout the twenty-six counties and checked the salmon registers to determine the landings of both salmon and grise since the season opened.

Worst season

One salmon exporter in Waterford said this week that he had not experienced such a bad salmon and grise season since he became involved in salmon fishing in 1930. "It seems to me," he said, "that the cause of the scarcity of salmon is overfishing by drift net fishermen some of whom are operating miles of drift net off the South West and West coasts of Ireland."

One of the worst hit areas is the South East where landings so far this season are the lowest since boats started fishing for salmon out of Dunmore East.

Over the last ten years good salmon landings have been reported from Dunmore East, Passage East, Ballyhaack, Duncannon and Slade particularly during the months of June and July.

But said one drift net fisherman "This is the worst season we have experienced for many years. There should be plenty of grise running for the last three weeks but the boats have been landing only two and three fish each after an entire day's fishing."

Not only is the season very bad," he added, "but the number of sharks off the South East coast has vastly increased in the last few years and they are doing a good deal of damage to our nets nightly. Some of the boats operating out of the Waterford Harbour Estuary are not even bothering going to sea, the season is so bad."
