## PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

### THE MULTI-CHANNEL CAMPAIGN

As I predicted the poor support received by the Multi-Channel TV candidate in this constituency in last month's general election is now being used by those opposed to the idea as a weapon to kill off the idea altogether. In the weeks prior to the election I made the point that it was foolish for the Multi-Channel organisation to make the matter an issue in an election which was concerned principally with politics and the election of a government. That the people went to the polls to elect a government is now plain but it would be wrong for anyone to read into the result in Waterford and the poor support (306 preference votes) which the TV candidate received that, in fact, the support for multi-channel is equally poor. That is not so.

In one of the Dublin papers last week I read a letter over the name of Maolshéagáin O'Caolláin, who described himself as "Cathaoirleach, Príochaisle Craolacháin," with an address at 6, Sraod Fheadhair, Baile Atha Cliath. In the course of the letter, An t-Uasal O'Caolláin stated: "In the general election the Waterford, Cork and Galway (Multi-Channel TV) lobbies ran a candidate in Waterford, the heart of the presumed multi-channel lobbyland."

Mr Billy Kirwan, the candidate, was presented to the press before the election by representatives of the Waterford, Cork and Galway multi-channel TV Campaign Committees who assured him publicly of their support. Some of the newspapers announced that the question of rebroadcasting would be an important election issue even venturing to suggest that the multi-channel "lobbies" might decide the election. In a valid poll of 42,625 votes, Mr Kirwan, the Multi-channel candidate, a former Waterford County hurler, received 306 votes.

On its face value An t-Uasal O'Caolláin's reading of the result could be said to be correct but the fact of the matter is that thousands of voters marked some preference on their papers for the TV candidate and this can be borne out by the "tally" men who watched the opening of the ballot boxes and the sorting of the papers at the count. It would take it that any preference even as low as the tenth, should be taken as one in favour of multi-channel TV. On that basis An t-Uasal O'Caolláin would be incorrect in his assessment of the people's views on this issue.

It is still very well for people like An t-Uasal O'Caolláin who live in Dublin or along the east coast to say that the rebroadcasting of channels from the English TV networks is not on. They already enjoy the privilege of choice and can switch on and off as they wish from the BBC to RTE but for us in one-channel land the situation is absolutely diabolical especially since RTE turned over to their so-called Summer schedules. The programmes going out to one-channel areas now are just one long yawn—there might be the very odd exception—but for the most part they are absolute crap.

Those of us living in the part of the country are merely seeking equality with those who at present, because of their geographical location, can switch on to the outside channels—what's the sauce for the goose should surely be sauce for the gander! and what are accepted standards for them cannot be bad for us. We cannot be working on a double standard or having the privileged class in Dublin with those of us down here being treated as second-class citizens. Why should An t-Uasal O'Caolláin and those like him think that they should have the right to decide what we

## COUNCIL CAN DO LITTLE TO PUT DOWN SEASIDE THUGGERY

Following complaints of hooliganism and vandalism by unauthorized campers at a public park site at Curragh, Ardmore, owned by Waterford County Council the matter of issuing a Sanitation Order under the Local Government Sanitary Services Act for the purpose of prohibiting such campers from trespassing on the property was further discussed at a meeting of the Council held in Dungarvan on Monday night.

Mr C. O'Connor County Manager said that the problem of controlling these campers was a difficult one. The fact that more people were going to Ardmore showed that the area was becoming more popular and while they wanted this to happen they also wanted to see them go there in an orderly fashion.

Mr T. A. Kynne said that the Council should encourage tourists to the Curragh site.

Mr N. Walsh—Yes but not vandals.

Mr P. Kennedy said that if toilets were erected at the site the local people would be more satisfied with the position.

The Manager said that there was nothing the Council could do about the position this summer but they should encourage tourists to go to Ardmore.

Mr C. Curran said that the people responsible for the complaints that were made were not tourists "They're thugs who go there at week ends on motor-cycles" he said.

The Chairman in Ardmore at present was the said different to other places as the site concerned in the complaints is Council property. "What has been going on there" he added, is destroying Ardmore and if it is allowed to continue it will stop genuine visitors from going there.

Mr J. D. Hally Co. Engineer said since the complaint was made at the last meeting he had no Campers signs erected at the Curragh site. He referred to "one pair of characters" who were obviously from Thurles who had travelled from Tramore along the coast road and then up through the Vee who had "autographed" every road sign on the way recently. "The Garda were at present trying to locate them he said and if caught he thought they should be brought back and made erase the things they had written."

UNWANTED INTRUDERS

Mr M. Harty said that the Council should seek the co-operation of the local people in Ardmore to stop the unwanted intruders there who were responsible for so much vandalism.

The Chairman said that the local people to move in and stop this rowdism but he did not know what they could do.

Mr N. Walsh—This is something that we should take a very strong stand on instead of just talking about it!

The Chairman said that the difficulty was that the Council had no power to do anything in the matter at present.

The Co-Manager again stated that there was not a lot they could do about it this summer. He would not ask the Council to consider the implications of a Sanitation Order at this stage but said that in September they could get down to it and consider the problem deeply.

Mr M. Henery said that the law should move in on these thugs and remove them wherever they cause trouble. "This is the only solution to a problem like this" he said.

Finally it was agreed to write to the Garda Authorities to take whatever action was possible when the occasion arose.

## DUNGARVAN F.F. CUMANN REJECT C.D.C. DECISION TO EXPEL MRS. O'BRIEN

Dungarvan Fianna Fáil Cumann following a meeting on Monday night last called a Press Conference at the Hotel O'Meara in which it was stated that the Cumann did not accept the decision of the Party's Comhairle Dál Ceannair to expel Mrs. O'Brien D.D.C.

The news of Mrs. O'Brien's expulsion which broke after the Comhairle Dál Ceannair meeting on the previous Tuesday night was the subject of a week in political circles and the decision has been having repercussions ever since. Following the wide publicity surrounding the Party's candidates in the general election had been expanded on conducting a go-it-alone campaign in the election a statement followed from the General Secretary of the Party which said that the position was "unsatisfactory" and that pending a decision on the matter by the National Executive that Mrs. O'Brien would maintain her status within the party.

Present at the Press Conference called by the Dungarvan Cumann last Tuesday night was Mr. Pádraig Uí Dúghaill, Chairman of the Cumann, Mr. T. Nugent and Mr. J. Tobin. Mrs. O'Brien was also present but made no statement.

UNJUSTLY EXPELLED

At the outset reading from a prepared statement Mr. Uí Dúghaill said that at a very largely attended meeting of the Dungarvan Cumann held the previous night at which Mrs. O'Brien's position was discussed, it was agreed to put the matter to a vote of confidence in her. Mrs. O'Brien he said, was a valuable member of the cumann and a defeated candidate in the general election and they felt that she had been unjustly expelled by the Comhairle Ceannair. They had been directed by the Chairman to call a Press Conference to announce this publicly and also to assure Mrs. O'Brien of the Cumann's full support and to wish her every success in the campaign for election to the Senate.

In reply to a question Mr. Uí Dúghaill said that the decision of the Comhairle Ceannair in expelling Mrs. O'Brien.

Mr. J. Tobin said that Mrs. O'Brien had been expelled for mounting a go-it-alone campaign at the election but he claimed she did nothing different to any of the other candidates of the party. He reiterated that they in the Dungarvan Cumann did not accept the decision of the CDC to expel Mrs. O'Brien and they held that as stated by the General Secretary of the Party Mrs. O'Brien held her status within the Party until the National Executive would decide the position at their next meeting in September.

In reply to further questions, Mr. Uí Dúghaill said that the decision of the Dungarvan Cumann would be conveyed officially to the National Executive and Mr. Tobin added "the Dungarvan Cumann has accepted responsibility to see fair play carried out especially where one of our members is concerned."

Mr. Tobin also stated that Mrs. O'Brien was absent from the CDC meeting at which her expulsion had been decided but that she had informed the CDC of the decision and that it would be impossible for her to attend as it coincided with the opening of the new Dail.

UNOFFICIAL

A "Leader" reporter was later informed that the Press Conference held by the Dungarvan Cumann was unofficial and was mounted in spite of a direction from above that no public statements should be made about the matter without prior sanction.

This traffic chaos has always been and still continues to be one of the greatest drawbacks in travelling to Thurles on Munster Hurling final day and there appears to be little that can be done to solve it. This is a great pity as it can spoil what should always be a great occasion.
