PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

THE GENEVA TRIP
Next week three members of Waterford County Council will leave for Geneva where, from September 3 to September 10, they will attend the International Conference on Housing and Planning. The cost to the ratepayers has been publicly estimated at £300 each but I have a feeling that it will run to a much higher figure before it is all over.

The manner in which the matter was approached and the decision taken did no credit to the parent public body in the county. It was evident that the decision to send the representatives to Geneva was made outside the Council and it was then introduced in an apparently innocuous manner and steamrolled through. The end result was that three members of one party are to get a holiday on the continent with the expense tag being taken up by the ratepayers.

An effort to justify the decision to send three was made by the Chairman who pointed out that practically all bodies in the country sent delegates to various centres in Europe from time to time but that Waterford County Council had never done so before. Now Waterford has joined in and will help to spend a little more of the ratepayers' money.

Last year this conference was held in Helsinki and Ireland was represented by six Councilors from all over the country. How excessive a number this was can be gauged from the fact that the United Kingdom of England, Wales and Scotland had only three councillors at the same conference. It looks as if last year's sixty from this country will be doubled this year and this surely makes a laugh of the entire affair. But I suppose it's a case of the more the merrier!

AN EYEBROW STILL
Even allowing for the fact that big bodies move slowly there can be no excuse for the long period which it has been taking to resolve the transfer of the C.I.E. property along the old railway line at Abbeyside to the County Council. The negotiations have now been going on for far too long and it is more than time that matters were brought to a head.

The property involved includes an old house, now derelict, which stood at the level crossing at Strandside. This has been, and still is, one of the biggest eyebrows in the whole affair. We have written about this before as it became a haven for dossers who created quite a nuisance there. Local residents have complained that this nuisance is still continuing in the old building.

Besides being an eyebrow the place has become a health hazard and I think that the Urban Council as the Sanitary Authority should move in and use their powers to clear the place and demolish the old house. This is something which should be done as a matter of urgency and it should not be necessary to wait until the property transfer has been finalised as this could still take a considerable time.

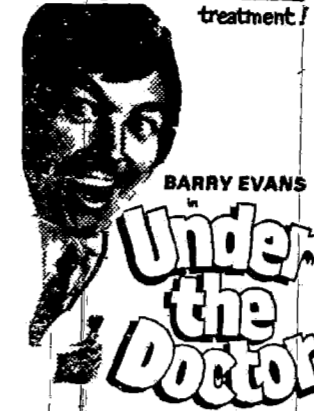
