THE URBAN RATE

The Dungarvan Urban rate for 1978 has been struck at £10.17 and this will provide a sum of £296,752 which, with an additional income from receipts and grants of £305,582, will make the grand total of £602,334...

Increases have been provided for the inclusion of extra public lights in the housing estate which will be completed in the period and also for an extension of the lighting system along the Shandon Road.

There are also increases in the water supply and sewerage services in which pumping and electricity charges account for most of the cost of operating and maintaining the water supplies of £37,817 is up by more than £4,500 while the cost of operating and maintaining the sewerage treatment works at £25,277 is up by more than £10,000.

The Urban scavenging service shows an increase of about £4,300 with the principal costs being £21,117 for the collection of domestic refuse £12,750 for street cleaning and £4,194 for the operation and provision of equipment of the dumps.

Under the heading "recreation and amenity," the total expenditure is £20,000 and this includes £3,914 for the continuation of the repair of the swimming pool and £3,000 towards the cost of a larger slipway at the Look-Out.

There is also a sum of £5,000 included for the replacement of the present pick-up truck and provision is made for the purchase of £16,000 of a new road sweeper.

In regard to work on harbour facilities it was reported that all the major breaches affecting the berthing of ships at the quay had now been repaired and were in sound condition.

CALL TO STANDARDISE SUMMERTIME

A proposal to standardise summertime throughout the European Community is at present being considered and if the measure is adopted it will mean a uniform period for summertime from 1979.

EXPENSIVE TASTE

This reference to the European scene reminds me of the agitation that has been going on for several months past concerning the attitude of the French farmers in attempting to block Irish lambs from the French market.

In the winter issue of 'Livestock and Meat News' published by the Irish Meat Board, the importance of our export trade under this heading has been stressed by the Minister for Agriculture, Mr. Jim Gibbons.

France is one of our big customers and it can be understood why so much importance is attached to full access to the market there. Throughout the past year beef consumption has been steady in France and Ireland supplied over £30 million of the total consumed.

The cost of meat generally in most Common Market countries is high and on average household of husband, wife and two children will spend from £8 to £10 per week on meat and this is mainly because the average European housewife is a thrifty bargain hunter.

Since writing the foregoing the good news has been announced that following negotiations an arrangement has been reached under which the French market will be open for Irish lamb as from January 1.

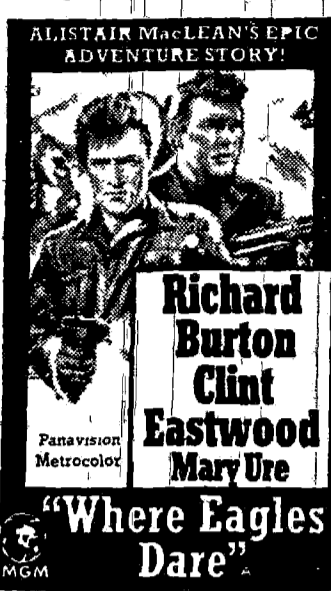
