



From 2nd January, 1978 the Employees share of the Social Insurance contribution will be reduced by £1 a week for workers who earn less than

The reduction will apply to all insured employees (apart from permanent and pensionable employees in the public sector whose social insurance contribution covers a limited range of benefits).

Earnings, for the purposes of the £50 weekly limit, will be gross earnings less superannuation contributions Thus, "earnings" include, in addition to salary or wages, all items treated as pay, such as overtime payments, bonuses, holiday pay, danger money all of which are chargeable to income tax, whether or not tax is actually payable.

A new series of social insurance stamps at the reduced rates for the various classes of contributors involved will be on sale at Post Offices alongside the present rates which will continue to be payable in respect of persons earning £50 a week or more Employers who used the Impressed Stamp system are being notified of the arrangements for implementation of the reduction in

Employers should ensure that the reduced rate of contribution is paid only in respect of any week where earnings are below the £50 limit. Where the reduced contribution rate is paid incorrectly the employer, as the person responsible for the payment of the contribution, would himself be liable to make good the deficiency.


