PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

FIANNA FAIL AND FHEIS
The Fianna Fail Ard Fheis takes place at the RDS, Dublin this coming week-end and delegates from all over the country will be flocking to the capital to swell an attendance expected to make new records at over 7,000 for the occasion.

Following the landslide which swept the party back to power in the June election, they have continued on the crest of the wave and while this year's budget has been described as that of a gambler, it has been very much in accord with the election manifesto which was one of the major factors in winning the election so no complaints can be made that the Party is not delivering on its promises so far.
