## PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

### PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS FOR ARDMORE HARBOUR

Some time ago a deputation from the Ardmore area was received by Waterford County Council and proposals for the improvement of harbour facilities for local fishermen and other tourist amenities for the resort, were discussed. The proposals were referred to the Council's Fishery sub-committee who in turn invited a representative of the Department of Fisheries to come to a meeting to discuss the position further.

That meeting was held recently and Mr C J McGrath from the Department attended and was informed that the Committee having examined the fishing harbours of Waterford, had come to the conclusion that priority should be given to carrying out improvement works at Ardmore and at Boat Strand (Dunabratrin) and that Ardmore should be dealt with first.

The County Council have now received a letter from the Department informing them that having considered the matter, the Department is of the opinion that the most practicable means of meeting the fisheries interests at Ardmore, while at the same time catering for those of the tourist interest would be to carry out the following works:

(a) connect the pier with the main road by a new pier and a promenade-road constructed at the base of the cliff and designed to function also as a pier by the provision of mooring-rings along its length and also a set of steps leading from the deck to the beach (b) construct and enlarge the parking area at the head of the existing slipway and install there a powered winch to facilitate the operative removal of boats from the water to the parking area.

The Department letter then goes on to state: A preliminary estimate of the probable cost of carrying out these works is reckoned to be of the order of £80,000. Before asking the Office of Public Works to devote the time to the preparation of the necessary design and plans, the Department would wish to know if expenditure of this order is envisaged by the County Council.

The present thinking of this Department is that in view of the fact that in large measure the tourist interest at Ardmore will be catered for as much as will be the fishery interest and that in fact some of the difficulties being experienced by the fisheries interests arise from tourist activities in the area that in the circumstances it would be appropriate that Bord Failte be asked to contribute 25% of the cost and if so that this Department will be prepared to look for sanction from the Department of Finance for grant aid of a further 25% and the balance thereafter (50%) to be met by Waterford County Council.

The majority view was that the estimated amount of £10,000 would not go very far and that the eventual cost which could be very much greater in providing a facility for the mooring of pleasure craft using the harbour, even if the numbers of these were increased as a result, would not be warranted. Priority, I was told, should be given to some more urgent requirements such as a swimming pool.

### REFLECTION ON ALL

Attention pay my countrymen to hear what I would say. But when the day of reckoning came not all man called him wise.

But blood was spilt the way he chose for all did not agree. His heart it broke in Ireland's cause the split brought (tragedy).

Will they carve the head of him on a southern mountain-side? For coming generations to remember him with pride? For coming generations to recall his name and say: A prayer for brave Mick Collins who died that August day.

## ICMSA MAN "TALKING THROUGH HIS HAT"

A recent statement by Mr Donal Murphy general secretary of the ICMSA in which he described the agricultural advisory services operated by county committees of agriculture as a failure was strongly criticised at the monthly meeting of the County Waterford Committee of Agriculture in Dungarvan last Friday.

Mr Murphy in his statement said that following the results of the Agricultural Institute's Farm Management Survey 1976 which showed that not more than half of all Irish farmers were earning less than a living wage the advisers could not be said to have done anything else but failed. In addition Mr Murphy blamed the county committees which employed the advisers and said that he would prefer to see them working for the co-operatives. At least the co-operatives would be able to exercise more control and direction over the advisory services than at present.

Mr Murphy stated that the committee structure failed to give incentives to the best advisers. "The good and the bad advisers get the same praise" he said.

INQUEST HEARS DETAILS OF TRAGIC LOVE STORY

The poignant story of a Dun garvan youth who lost the will to live only three days after his teenage sweetheart was burned to death in a fire at the farm home was told at an inquest in Dungarvan before Dr James A. Gallagher Coroner for West Waterford and a jury.

The inquest was told that Patrick Moore (17) 22 Keating Street Dungarvan, was found in a pool of blood in an upstairs bedroom in his home on the night of February 24 last.

An inquest was also held into the death of Moore's girlfriend, Philomena Maguire Barrana Stook Old Parish Dungarvan, who was burned to death in the same house in the early hours of February 21 last.

Witness also stated that since the death of his girlfriend who had died in a fire three days previously his son was feeling very depressed. He added that there was never a shotgun in his house he had never seen his son with a gun, and he didn't know where Patrick got the one in his possession that evening.

Sergeant T. Carty Dungarvan said he found the body of the girl around 9.30 p.m. and there he found Patrick lying on a bed behind the door in an upstairs room. He was lying backwards with his head hanging down at the other side of the bed and there was blood on his shirt and around the left breast and also around his nose and ears.

Sergeant Carty said he also found the sawn-off shotgun lying by the youth's left hand on the bed. He also found a card with the following written on it: 'Try to understand I'll be happy this way I

will be with Philomena, that is all I ever wanted. It will be a lot better to die now than grow old without her.'

Dr M. K. Cusack, Dungarvan, said he carried out a post mortem examination on the deceased youth. The left upper part of his shirt was extensively soaked in blood, his cardiogram similarly though to a lesser extent and his coat soaked in all in the region of the left breast of the shirt and cardiogram there were corresponding holes of one inch in diameter with well defined edges. The only mark of violence on the body was a sharply defined hole on the left side of the chest.

Dr Cusack went on to state that that hole one inch in diameter was caused by the discharging of a shotgun with the mouth of the barrel held close to the chest.

In my opinion death was caused by gross disruption of the heart through a gunshot wound. Dr Cusack said 'Death in my view was instantaneous.'

After the jury had returned a verdict in accordance with the medical evidence Dr Gallagher extended sympathy to the deceased and relatives of the deceased on what he termed 'this terrible tragedy' which he said had numbed the entire county with shock and sadness.

Edward Dobbyn, step-father of the deceased said he was awakened by his wife around 3.45 a.m. who said there was something wrong in the kitchen and she went to investigate. He and his four-year old child got out of the house through a window but all efforts to get Philomena out failed. A neighbour told him to get to the kitchen and the room was in flames at that stage.

Evidence was also given by Mrs Bridget Dobbyn, mother of the deceased and by her brother John Joe Maguire (13). Dr J. Stacey, Dungarvan said he was present when firemen removed Miss Maguire's body from the debris and he subsequently carried out a post mortem examination. The body was extensively charred beyond possible visual recognition, Dr Stacey said. There was marked evidence of carbon monoxide poisoning and destruction of the body by fire and these were in his opinion the causes of death.
