PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

IDA INDUSTRIAL PLAN

Addressing the Munster Society of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Ireland in Waterford last Friday, Mr Padraic O Slatarra, Chairman of the Industrial Development Authority referred to plans for industrial expansion and the creation of jobs which the IDA hopes to put into action during the next three years.

The plan calls for the creation of almost 50,000 jobs in new grant-aided manufacturing and service industries over this period and in summary it envisages a net increase in employment in manufacturing industry of 10,000 per year.

"The levels of job creation proposed," Mr O Slatarra said, "are greater than anything previously undertaken by the IDA and will call for an intensification of the IDA's promotional activities at home and abroad. Nevertheless, the IDA is confident of its ability to achieve its target in the circumstances prevailing."

There is an emphasis in the plan on securing over half of the new job commitments from within Ireland and in particular the IDA will be seeking to create about 20,000 of the new jobs from relatively small scale Irish industry.

The search for new activities under which the job target of the IDA may be reached is already on and last week-end the Minister for Industry, Commerce and Energy, Mr Desmond O'Malley told Shannon Development to "scour" the countryside in pursuit of more jobs. "I want them to go into every town, village and parish in the mid-west and scour it out in the most intensive way to develop any possibility of local enterprise," he said.

Custians of Dungarvan, County Waterford has not enjoyed much industrial development down through the years and the time would now appear to be right for the Co Council Development Team to make its presence felt by taking an active role in this latest industrial drive.

Mr O Slatarra referred to possibilities in this area in his speech when he said that while the job needs of the main centres of population are probably the most pressing, the requirements of the small towns and villages in West Waterford, West Cork and along the Kerry coastline would also have to be catered for.

It is interesting to note in this regard that among the recent orders made by the County Manager was one granting planning permission to the IDA, Industrial Estate, Waterford, for the construction of a factory premises at Cappoquin. Perhaps the Council team could come up with some ideas for this. It would be a good way of starting.

FULL STEAM AHEAD FOR DIRECT ELECTIONS

Ireland's voters will have a chance to elect candidates directly to an enlarged European Parliament in June of next year. The decision to hold the direct elections with-in the period June 7-10, 1979, has been taken by the heads of state and government at the European Council meeting in Copenhagen.

At present, the European

Parliament has 178 members, all of whom have been nominated by their national parliaments. The European Parliament which will be elected for the first time by universal suffrage next year however, will have 410 representatives. Ireland's representation will increase from 10 to 15 members.

The election in Ireland will be based on the single transferable vote system of proportional representation as for General Elections with the country divided into four constituencies. Four seats have been allocated to the greater Dublin area, three to a Connaught-Ulster constituency covering eight counties — Cavan Donegal, Galway, Leitrim, Mayo, Monaghan, Roscommon and Sligo, three to Leinster — Counties Carlow, Kildare, Kilkenny, Laois, Longford, Louth, Meath, Offaly, Westmeath, Wexford and Wicklow, and five to the Munster area taking in Counties Waterford, Cork, Tipperary, Kerry, Limerick and Clare.

Also due to be held next year are the local elections for electing members for County and Urban Councils and other local authorities but a decision has not so far been taken as to whether these should go ahead simultaneously with the Euro-elections or be postponed.

"Philanthropic Night" At Urban Council Meeting

Three deputations were received at the monthly meeting of Dungarvan Urban Council last Monday night each seeking the Council's assistance in one form or another. The first was a meeting which ran for over two hours was taken up by the deputations and when the last had withdrawn it prompted one of the members to remark "this seems to be philanthropic night as far as the Council are concerned."

SEPARATE SPORTS CENTRE FOR ABBEYSIDE

The first deputation from Abbeyside Community Games (Denis Fahey Chairman, Eddie Moore Mrs Mary Rossiter, Lydia Clancy, Joe Mernagh, Hon Sec), asked the Council to provide land on which they could build a Community Centre and lay down a track and playing pitch in Abbeyside. The area at Quannus should be sufficient for all the children in the town and we should get the pans for that moving first and then the rest will be a welcome to come to the meeting.

SOCCER CLUB PROPOSALS

The second deputation was from Dungarvan United Soccer Club and consisted of Billy Kynne Chairman, J D O'Shea Secretary and Jim Walsh. The Club requested a letter from the Council circulated to the members setting out their proposals. This stated that the pitch they had at Spraggmount was ideal for them and they hoped to remain there. It was part of a site owned by J M J (Ireland) Ltd Building Contractors on which they had built some houses but who did not appear intent on further building there. The Club had been in negotiation with J M J about purchasing the pitch and a figure of £15,000 had been mentioned but they had been unable to get any satisfactory reply from the firm recently.

They asked whether the Council could now negotiate with the area on behalf of the club to hold down the price to that already mentioned and to provide a long term loan to enable

available to them instead of for housing development.

When the deputation with drew Deputy Deasy said that Nugent's field should be given to the Community Games as it was ideal for their requirements. "It would be disastrous for the Council to allow it to be built on as there would be no other land available for development as a recreation area for children there," he said.

Having made their case the deputation withdrew and the Council Manager Mr C O'Connor said that in his view the club would be best advised to consult a solicitor to see how they stood with J M J. He also said that the question of providing a loan would be a sticky one.

The Co Manager added that the Council would have to make up their minds on priorities as they did not have a bottomless well where money was concerned and it would be well for them to look at the overall problem. It was agreed to ask the Club to consult their Solicitors as suggested.

ROWING CLUB REQUESTS

The third and final deputation was from the Rowing Club led by John Walsh, Club Captain with whom was Mr Maurice Mullins President, Michael Roche Senior Vice-Captain and Helen Kealy Ladies Vice-Captain. Mr Walsh said that having read the Council's proposals for a marine amenity development at Strandside South Abbeyside the Rowing Club would like to have their problems considered in conjunction with it. The proposals they wished to make were he said prompted by the need for safety to their club members.

The main proposal was the erection of an 8 ft. weir at the Red Bridge to hold enough water so that the channel would be navigable for one mile upstream from the bridge at all times. This would enable training to be done here and would avoid the necessity of going in the outer harbour where their members were in danger.

It would also be only a fraction of the cost of building a 15 ft weir as mentioned in the new Town Plan cover most of the mud at all times, allow enough water to flush out sewage from Strandside North and to scour the quay, encourage a different type of water flow from surrounding land open and allow the mud opposite Strandside South proposed marina area to be scoured at low tide by a supplementary outlet from the lake through a large pipe across the Causeway.

In the course of a brief discussion Mr Walsh said that the Club would be prepared to get a marine engineer to prepare a report on the feasibility of their proposal with an estimate of the cost.

The Council agreed that the club should get this done before any final decision on the proposal is made and the deputation then withdrew.

Death Of Very Rev. W. Power, P.P.

Very Rev. Wm Power Parish Priest of Clonea Rathgormack near Portlaoise died on Friday, April 14 in Waterford after a long illness. Aged 71 he was well known in the Counties Cork and Waterford having been a curate at Doneraile, Cogh Cloyne, Ring Old Parish West Waterford St John's Parish (Waterford City) and Dungarvan.

In Dungarvan where he went in 1961 he was responsible for forming strong sodalities and confraternities. Born in the Nire Valley he was educated at the local National School Clonmel High School later at St John's College, Salamanca Spain.

He was ordained in 1934 and remained at Salamanca to teach Spanish and continue his studies. He was then recalled to Clifton England and afterwards returned to Ireland. He became Parish Priest of Clonea in 1971.

He is survived by his brother, Very Rev John Power P.P. Cappoquin and three other brothers James, Sonny and Dick. He also is survived by a sister Sr Teresa of the Presentation Order Clonmel.

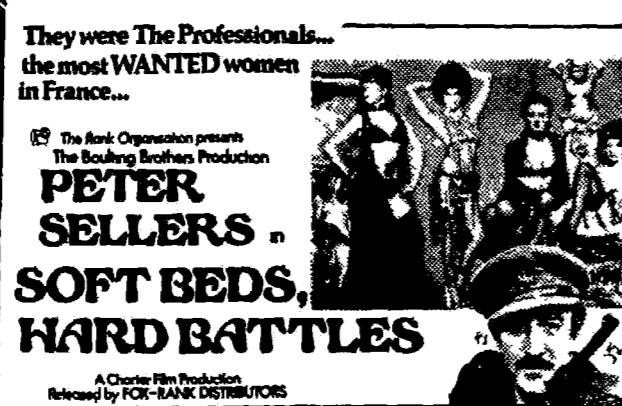
