At Dun- garvan last Friday night it was decided by 33 votes to 10 that the Party would put up their own candidate to fill the vacancy on Waterford County Council caused by the regretted death of Fine Gael Councillor Norman Walsh, Cappoquin. The decision means, in simple terms that when the co-option takes place at the Council meeting to be held on June 12, the Fianna Fail nominee will automatically be elected as the Party holds an overall majority of 13 in the 23 member Council with Fine Gael holding 7 seats Labour 2 and 1 Independent.

The Fianna Fail decision of last Friday night came as something of a surprise as it was expected that it would be left to Fine Gael to fill the seat and while I understand that the Party's Council members were opposed to taking the seat, the proposal made by Mr Jimmy Cummins, Glenbeg Cumann and seconded by Mr Billy Cotter, UDC, Abbeyside to contest the co-option was supported by a 33 to 10 vote from the delegates to the Comhairle Ceanntair.

There has been an "off and on" all-part agreement on the matter of Co Council co-options in the past. It was broken by Fine Gael when Cllr Jackie Fahey TD resigned on being appointed a Parliamentary Secretary but the status quo was restored in 1975 following the resignation of Fine Gael Councillor Michael Veale and Fianna Fail agreed not to oppose the Fine Gael nominee to fill the vacancy.

At that time Deputy Fahey who had retaken his seat on the Council, speaking for the Fianna Fail Party said that they would have been justified in taking the seat in view of the previous breach of the agreement by Fine Gael "but we decided not to as we feel and always did that the filling of a vacancy of this kind should lie with the party to whom the seat belongs." Deputy Fahey is on record as saying on the same occasion that we hope that for the future there will be reality about the matter and that any party will not take a seat which does not belong to it as it would be against democracy to do so.

However I understand that the Comhairle Dail Ceanntair was not satisfied with that decision and directed that on any future similar occasions

He was harshly critical of the legal system in which the evidence required for the arrest and prosecution of poachers was far too restrictive. Piracy at sea is alive and well and circling our coasts in the shape of foreign plunderers, and our legal system, instead of hindering and preventing these criminals, is making it easier for them to operate."

Mr Murrin emphasised the need for more efficient use of the legal system in which the evidence required for the arrest and prosecution of poachers was far too restrictive. "Every condition in the book must be met," he said, "before the navy can arrest even the most blatant poacher. Piracy at sea is alive and well and circling our coasts in the shape of foreign plunderers, and our legal system, instead of hindering and preventing these criminals, is making it easier for them to operate."

This latter observation by Mr Murrin has more than a grain of truth in it as our government, since our access to the EEC have always abided by the rules when most of the other member States, especially the UK take the line that suits them best irrespective of whether it accords with the rules or not.

Our coastal fisheries are one of our most valuable assets and we should not allow them to be destroyed as they are by these foreign trawlers who think nothing of the rules when they come on their plundering expeditions hunting the lucrative shoals of fish around our coasts knowing that even if they are caught they have more than an odds-on chance of getting away with a nominal fine.

The Fine Gael Spokesman on Fisheries, Dungarvan Deputy Austin Deasy, has given notice that he intends to move a private member's bill in the Dail next week calling for fines of £100,000 with confiscation of gear fish and even trawler where such foreign trawlers are caught and convicted of plundering our waters with a possible prison sentence of up to 12 months for the skipper.

Tough measures like these are without doubt required to deal with the tough merchants who at present, show little or no respect for our laws, and the sooner they are introduced and become law, the better.

CO-OPTION AGREEMENT TO BE BREACHED

At a special meeting of the Fianna Fail Comhairle Dail Ceanntair held in Dun- garvan last Friday night it was decided by 33 votes to 10 that the Party would put up their own candidate to fill the vacancy on Waterford County Council caused by the regretted death of Fine Gael Councillor Norman Walsh, Cappoquin. The decision means, in simple terms that when the co-option takes place at the Council meeting to be held on June 12, the Fianna Fail nominee will automatically be elected as the Party holds an overall majority of 13 in the 23 member Council with Fine Gael holding 7 seats Labour 2 and 1 Independent.

There has been an "off and on" all-part agreement on the matter of Co Council co-options in the past. It was broken by Fine Gael when Cllr Jackie Fahey TD resigned on being appointed a Parliamentary Secretary but the status quo was restored in 1975 following the resignation of Fine Gael Councillor Michael Veale and Fianna Fail agreed not to oppose the Fine Gael nominee to fill the vacancy.

At that time Deputy Fahey who had retaken his seat on the Council, speaking for the Fianna Fail Party said that they would have been justified in taking the seat in view of the previous breach of the agreement by Fine Gael "but we decided not to as we feel and always did that the filling of a vacancy of this kind should lie with the party to whom the seat belongs." Deputy Fahey is on record as saying on the same occasion that we hope that for the future there will be reality about the matter and that any party will not take a seat which does not belong to it as it would be against democracy to do so.

However I understand that the Comhairle Dail Ceanntair was not satisfied with that decision and directed that on any future similar occasions

the decision should rest with the CDC rather than with the Council members of the Party. This is what was, in fact, done at their meeting last Friday night.

It is, however, unfortunate that the region to be affected by this decision is the Lismore Electoral Area. This area elects four members to the Council and there was an even balance of 2-2 between Fianna Fail and Fine Gael up to the last election when Fianna Fail won 3 of the 4 leaving the late Norman Walsh as the sole Fine Gael representative for the area. The latest move by Fianna Fail will mean that they will now fill all 4 seats and the Fine Gael electorate in the area will have no spokesman — surely not great democracy.

I understand that the Fianna Fail Party will hold a convention in Lismore soon to select their nominee but even before last Friday night's CDC decision to contest, it was an open secret that the choice would be Mr Jack Cullinane of Glenribben and in all probability the convention will endorse this choice.

Likely candidates whom Fine Gael might nominate have also been mentioned but now that Fianna Fail have taken their decision it will be nothing more than a futile exercise to oppose them.

NEED FOR HEAVIER PENALTIES

The urgent need to introduce legislation to enable heavier penalties to be imposed on foreign trawlers which breach our fishery limits was stressed by a Cork District Justice within the past couple of weeks.

District Justice Kevin McCourt stated at Carrigaline Court on May 11 that the present position was ludicrous as the maximum penalty under existing legislation that could be imposed on skippers who were convicted was £100. In the circumstances he said that the courts were "stymied" as they could not even make an order for the confiscation of a trawler's gear or fish.

Before the Court were the masters of two Spanish trawlers who were fined £100 each when they admitted entering the exclusive fishery limits of the State and £50 each for having an undersized mesh in their nets.

Last week Mr Joey Murrin, the Chairman of the Irish Fishermen's Organisation went to sea in one of our fishery protection vessels, LE Deirdre on a patrolling trip of the Celtic Sea during which an-

Cllr Kyne said that going on the press report the official made what was described as a jocose remark about a comment which he had made at a recent County Council meeting when he opposed a suggestion that the Health Board might change their offices and health clinic in Dungarvan out to the County Home. The comment he had made then was that he could not see that a pregnant woman from Abbeyside should have to walk all the way out to the County Home to inquire about something such as a medical card.

The press report stated that Mr Glanville rejected that but went on to say that they could walk to Waterford if they liked or they could write 'I feel' said Cllr Kyne "that such a remark made by an official in this way should not be tolerated."

Cllr D Goode Chairman said he had attended the Health Committee meeting and proposed that Priory House be demolished and the site rebuilt on but he got no seconder for this.


