PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

SERVICES MUST BE CLOSE TO PEOPLE

The Minister for Health and Social Welfare, Mr Charles Haughey, TD, was very much to the point last week-end when he criticised our present rating as a caring society. He said that the government's programme of hospital development, with the emphasis on the patient and his needs, would be matched by expanding community health services. "Our whole approach to the provision of community care services is to bring the services as close as possible to the people," the Minister said.

In this regard it would be well for the Regional Health Boards to pay attention to the views expressed by Mr Haughey and this is particularly so where Dungarvan is concerned. Over the past year or so there has been more than a suspicion that the South Eastern Health Board, has evolved a policy of downgrading the health services in Dungarvan and irrespective of the official denials to the contrary, there has been an erosion of these services.

The latest issue of contention is the removal of what remains of the Health Board staff in the town from Arus Brugha and the transfer of the Health clinic to St Joseph's hospital on the outskirts of the town. In no circumstances can it be said that such a decision to make these moves is in accord with the Minister's view that services should be brought as close as possible to the people. The hospital is at the perimeter of the town on one side and locating the services there simply means moving them as far as it is possible to do so from those at the other end which in this case happens to be Abbeyside which is one of the fastest developing residential districts of the Urban area.

The Health Board has spent a good deal of money on improvements in the hospital area and indeed not all has been well spent. A nurses quarters was provided for the staff nurses but this was never required as the nurses return to their own homes in the town and district after their duty rosters. These are probably areas which the Board wants to put to alternative use for clinics.

At the same time the Board occupies properties in the town—at Priory House—which is their own property and at Mary Street. Both of these have been allowed to run into disrepair for whatever reason. I cannot be very sure just as the local public representatives' cannot understand why Priory House was allowed to become so run down. This fine building in a central part of the town should be suitable for its purpose as a clinic and indeed for some offices for the Board's staff as well. It certainly would be more in keeping with the Minister's wish to have the services as close as possible to the people for whom they are being provided rather than shifting them out of town as is planned.

THE DANGER IS ALWAYS THERE

Details of a Water Safety Campaign organised by the Department of the Environment in conjunction with the Irish Water Safety Association were announced by Mr John O'Leary TD, Minister of State at the Department at a Press Reception in Dublin yesterday.

The main purpose of the campaign is to create an awareness, especially among those involved in the various forms of water activity of the need to take reasonable care when in or near water without in any way detracting from the enjoyment of such activities or from their beneficial effects.

The Minister pointed out that an average of about 150 persons lose their lives in this

country in drowning accidents of one sort or another each year and the launching of the campaign is timed to stress the need for care over the June Bank Holiday next week-end which marks the commencement of the summer season.

As part of the campaign the County Waterford Water Safety Committee have issued their water safety message through their PRO, Garda Frank Nolan, Waterford. This points out that despite the warnings which are issued at this time every year drowning accidents continue to occur and unfortunately, when the statistics are compiled for the summer of '78 it will be found that many of the people that were drowned need not have died, if only the basic precautions had been taken.

The message stresses the grave responsibility which parents have towards their children to educate them in the simple code of water safety, thereby ensuring their safety while swimming, boating or fishing. The code is so simple that adults and parents are inclined to disregard it but the experts know that many drownings could have been avoided if the simple rules involved were observed.

In an effort to focus a new awareness to their importance we now list these again: 1) Don't swim alone or from lonely, unfrequented parts of a beach, river or lake. 2) Don't swim immediately after a meal. 3) Don't swim if overtired or heated from some physical activity. 4) Don't swim out to sea, keep close to the shore and 5) Avoid using air beds, kilos or inflated tubes which may be blown out to sea.

Where children are concerned on a beach outing many parents have experienced occasions of stress and anxiety because they have not looked after them. Small children get lost very easily on crowded strands and while

sometimes this cannot be helped it can be avoided if a little more care is taken. In this regard the message to parents from the Water Safety Committee is straight and to the point "Look after your children, they're your responsibility."

Another aspect of the message warns against interference with life-saving equipment such as ropes and ring buoys. In many instances in the past we have had cases where damage to such equipment renders it useless in a crisis when it is most required. Children should be encouraged to respect life-saving equipment and teenagers and indeed young adults should have enough responsibility to do the same.

And having said all this all that now remains is to reiterate the words of the Minister for State at the Press Reception, "I hope that all who enjoy water activities next week-end (and indeed throughout the summer) will do so in safety."

DUNGARVAN HORSE FAIR

The horse fair held recently in Dungarvan has come in for a good deal of criticism. The criticism has not been so much for the fair itself but for its location and the litter and dirt that it created and for the swarm of street traders that it attracted to the town. If it is thought necessary to hold a horse fair in the town it should not take place at the Square which is the traffic hub of the town. It could be held at the Mart or perhaps at Quanns or in some quieter part of the town.

On the night before the fair the travelling traders descended upon the town and staked their claims to the Square the next day. The result was that one entire half of the Square was taken over by them and when the animals arrived for the fair they were squeezed on to the traffic freeway and this created traffic chaos in the town throughout the day.

Added to this was the danger which pedestrians were exposed to as they moved

The procession proceeded from the Church to the Cross where Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament was given and returned by the same route. The way of the procession was highly decorated for the solemn occasion.

Death of Mrs Margaret Foley, Aghish — The death occurred recently of Mrs Margaret Foley Shanakill Aghish and the sympathy of the community goes out to her bereaved sons, daughter, brother and other relatives. Deceased was extremely popular and her death at an advanced age is much regretted.

INQUEST TOLD OF MAN'S MYSTERIOUS DISAPPEARANCE

While out for an afternoon stroll on April 8th last two young Cappoquin boys came across human remains which were later identified — through particles of clothing — as those of a 74-year old retired farm labourer who had mysteriously disappeared almost two years before that.

That was the story told at an inquest in Lismore before Dr James A Gallagher, Coroner for West Waterford on John Horan Afiane Cappoquin, who vanished on June 5th, 1976 and who had not been found despite the most intensive garda enquiries.

Paul Flynn (12), Cooke Street, Cappoquin and Patrick Doherty (13) Barrack Street Cappoquin stated in evidence that they were out for a walk on April 8th last. At a place known locally as "The Glen" they went into a wooded area and there saw a dog rooting at a burrow. They went over to see what the dog was rooting at and saw a human skull and a pair of trousers. They immediately returned to Cappoquin and informed the gardai of their discovery.

Patrick Morrissey farmer Afiane Cappoquin, told the inquest that John Horan had been in his employment as a farm labourer for a long number of years and resided by himself in accommodation provided by witness. In later years he had been in frail health and was retired from regular farm work.

Witness said he last saw Mr Horan alive on June 15th, 1976 but on April 8th, last he was shown the remains of a man's suit and cap which he could posi-

tively identify as belonging to Horan. He was satisfied as a result that the human remains found at "The Glen" were Horan's.

FOUND REMAINS

Sergeant V Bergin, Cappoquin said he had been involved in the enquiries into the whereabouts of John Horan since his disappearance on June 5th, 1976. Having received a report on April 8th last he went to "The Glen" where he found human remains and the remnants of a man's clothing, shoes and braces.

The Sergeant went on to state that on a branch of a tree overhanging the slope where the human remains were he saw a blue nylon cord tied around a branch with a loop at the end of it. It was about ten feet from the remains. On a nearby bush he also found the remains of a cloth cap and coat. The clothing was subsequently identified to him as being the property of John Horan by his former employer Patrick Morrissey.

Dr D J McNamara Ardmore of carrying out a post mortem examination on April 8th. They were identified to him as being those of John Horan.

Dr McNamara said that only the skeleton remained and the skull was detached from the spine. There was nothing remaining to evaluate the cause of death.

Dr Gallagher Coroner, said that in the light of the medical evidence a verdict incorporating the exact cause of death could not be returned.

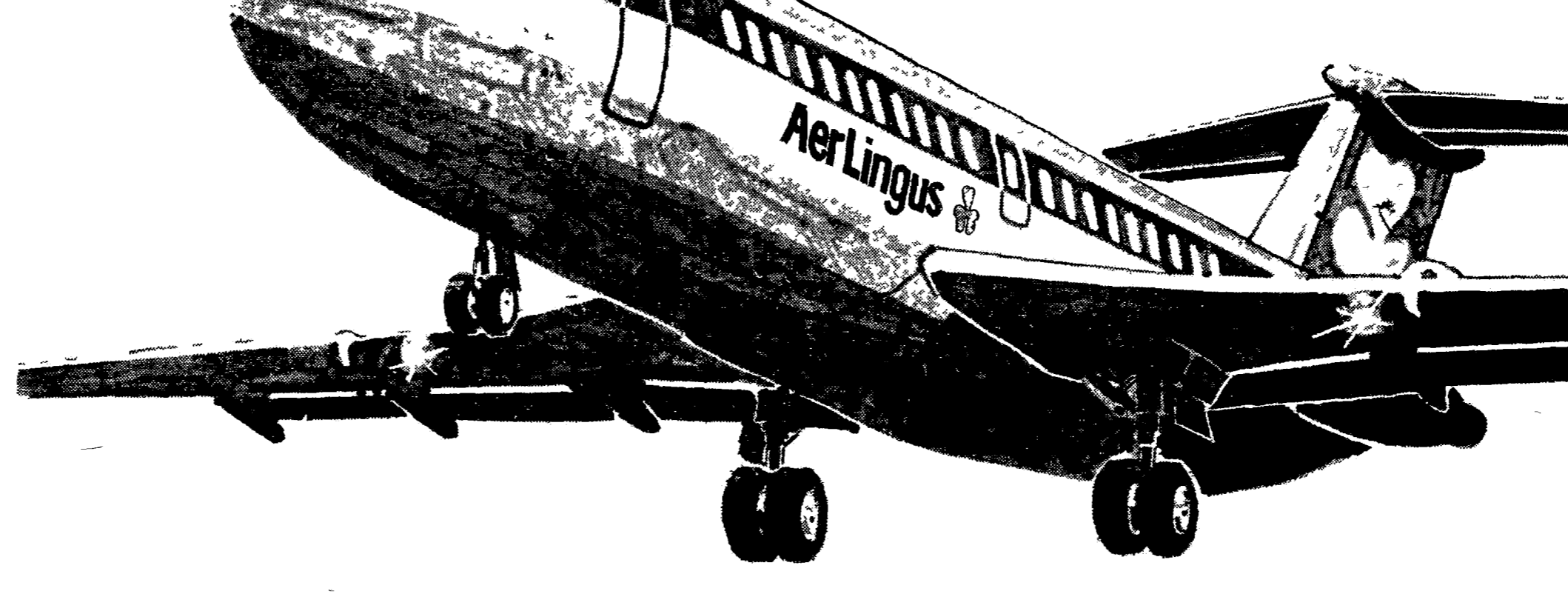

Young Chef Took Disliking To A Car

A young Cork City man who was employed as a chef at a Dungarvan hotel at the time appeared before Dungarvan District Court last week on charges arising from a drinking bout which he had on March 2 and during which he damaged a parked car and broke a window in the house next door to the flat which he was staying at O'Connell Street.

Terence O'Brien, (19), pleaded guilty to the charges. Supt M English said that after work on March 2 the defendant had some drinks and when going home some time later he saw a car and damaged it to the extent of £12 and broke a window in the house of John Meehan, O'Connell Street, costing £475. When approached by the Garda he admitted the offences but could give no explanation for what he did.

He then "had a crack" at a window of the house adjoining his flat and broke it. The following day he admitted the offences when approached by the Garda. He paid for the damage to the window and apologised to the owner and was prepared to pay compensation to the car owner also.

Defendant in evidence told the Court that he drank a certain brand of whiskey and after that he did not know what happened or what he had done.

Imposing fines of £5 on both charges with £12 compensation for the car damage District Justice Wallace warned the defendant to be more careful about the brand of whiskey he drank in future and the manner in which he conducted himself.

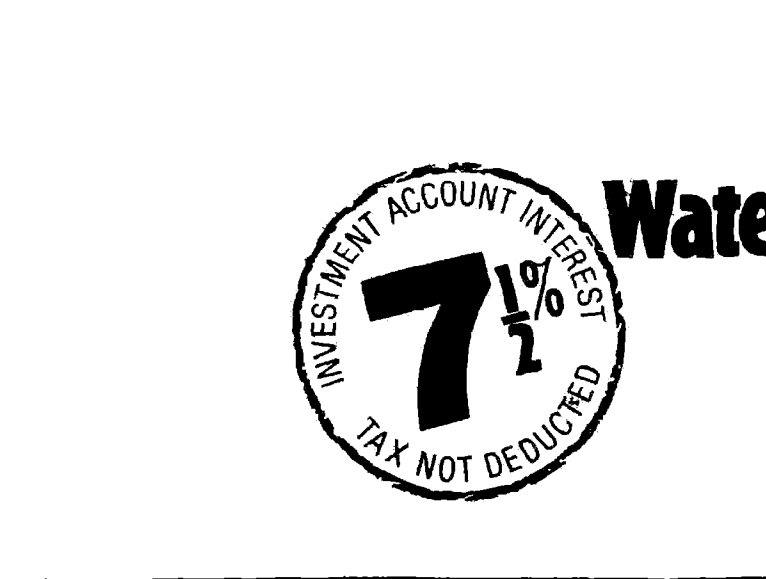
