PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

THE COUNTY COUNCIL CO-OPTION

The vacancy on the County Council created by the lamented death of Cllr Norman Walsh, Cappoquin, will be filled by co-option when the Council meets in Dungarvan next Monday, June 12

Those interested in public affairs know well by now what is going to take place I have already referred to the matter once while other writers have got a great deal of mileage from it and I do so now again merely to refer to the feedback which I have got here and there throughout the electoral area of Lismore which is the one affected by this issue

Once Fianna Fail, through their Comhairle Dail Ceanntair, decided to contest the vacancy, the outcome was a foregone conclusion as they already have an overall majority on the Council and whatever nominee they put forward will automatically be elected to fill the vacancy They are quite entitled to take this line of action and they have justified their decision to take the seat on the grounds that it was the Fine Gael Party which first broke the gentleman's agreement which operated between the major parties where such matters as these co-options were concerned

Be that as it may The decision however, in the long term, could cause a backlash As I pointed out here a couple of weeks ago, the Fianna Fail decision will take away the only representation which Fine Gael had in the Lismore electoral area and from June 12 onwards the area will be represented on the Council solely by four Fianna Fail members That is, of course only until the next Local Elections as Fine Gael will be bound to win back the seat again through the vox populi when these take place

It is this aspect of the co-option which could cause the back-lash as people in the area have expressed disappointment at the Fianna Fail decision on this very point One man for whose opinion I have a high regard told me that he accepted my previous reference to this point as 'very fair comment' and he was not slow to add 'I say that even though I am a 'Jack' man' There are many other Fianna Fail supporters who feel the same way in the area

There can be little doubt but that there is a Fine Gael seat in the area so when the elections come round again in a couple of years time one of the sitting Fianna Fail Councillors will then be bound to lose as it is hardly possible that they would have a clean sweep and win all four seats in the area The question then will be who will have to go?

In the short-term everything looks rosy now for the party but in the long-term the decision to take the seat now may not prove to be such a good one Only time will tell

THE CONTENDERS

Over last week-end the Fianna Fail and Fine Gael parties held their conventions at which their nominees for the co-option were selected

As was generally expected, Mr Jack Cullinane, Glenribben Lismore who was a defeated candidate in the '74 Local Elections was the unanimous choice by Fianna Fail His nomination was proposed by Mr R J Mason, Cappoquin and seconded by Mr M Browne (Affane) at the Convention which was presided over by Mr Sean Ormonde The nomination was ratified by the Party's Comhairle Dail Ceanntair at a meeting in Dungarvan last Tuesday night Fine Gael have officially selected Mrs Grace O'Connor, Cappoquin, as their nominee She is a sister of the late Cllr

Walsh and it is worth noting that if the amicable arrangement between the parties remained operative she could have made history by being the first lady member of Waterford County Council However that will not be as I understand that all the Fianna Fail members of the Council are being issued with a firm directive to support the party's nominee at the co-option meeting on Monday next This directive lends credence to rumours circulating during the week that certain FF Councillors were in revolt against the CDC decision but they have been firmly told to give full support to the party's official nominee or else!

It is a pity that the clash will cause all the old bitter feelings between Fianna Fail and Fine Gael which have lain dormant in the Council for so many years to be once more revived

TOP TWENTY CAR DEFECTS

In the Free Car Safety Check carried out at nine centres throughout the country in 1977 by the National Road Safety Association the following were the top twenty defects found

- 1) Defective transmission, 2) Defective electrical system, 3) Defective steering linkage, 4) Defects in service brake condition, 5) Defective wipers, 6) Defective doors, 7) Defective brake liners, 8) Defective headlamps, 9) Defective headlamp arm (focus), 10) Poor tyre condition, 11) Inadequate tyre tread, 12) Service brake imbalance (pulling to one side), 13) Defective front suspension, 14) Defective parking brake 15) Parking brake imbalance, 16) Defective wheels (damaged or cracked), 17) Defective exhaust system, 18) Defective stop lamps, 19) Defective rear lamps, 20) Defective wheel alignment

Cars checked in Waterford during the safety check were well below the percentage average for most of the other areas except under the heading defective brake lines in which they shot to the top, poor tyre condition under which they were third worst and defective wheels in which category they were listed second from the top

Occasional checks are a necessary exercise which every careful motorist should take to ensure that the vehicle is roadworthy and safe

Discovery sparks off murder investigation

The discovery of the body of a woman in a meadow field at Ballymacmague, Dungarvan, at about 11 am on Wednesday morning, June 7, sparked off a murder investigation by Gardaí in Dungarvan under Supt M English

The body which was covered with a material resembling a candlewick bedspread was found under some bushes by Sgt M

Hayes and Gardaí M Blake and W Power in a field about 200 yards beyond the Master McGrath Monument at Ballymacmague on the left side of the road facing Cappoquin

Members of the Garda Technical Bureau in Dublin were notified of the discovery and they arrived in Dungarvan on Wednesday evening as did Dr R O'Neill, Cork, State Pathologist who performed a post mortem examination of the body at the District Hospital where it had been removed by Fire Brigade ambulance

Joint Plan To Increase Advisory Services In Waterford

A joint plan worked out between representatives of the Waterford Co-op Society and the Co Committee of Agricultural Services for the county was outlined by the Co George T Frost at the monthly meeting of the County Committee held in Dungarvan last Tuesday

The matter was taken in conjunction with a letter from the I.P.A which stated in regard to the existing services in the county that while the quality was satisfactory the number of advisors employed by the Committee was not sufficient to provide an adequate service for all farmers in the county The letter recommended as a consequence, that additional advisors be appointed

Mr Frost then told the meeting that with the Chairman and other members of the Committee the plan was to approach the Co-op of the Co-op Society including the Chairman, Mr Walsh Chief Executive, Mr O'Connor, Mr C Dempsey Mr O Power and Mr O'Mahony, Agricultural Advisor, who they threshed out a plan which was now being submitted to the Committee for approval He said that latterly the larger creameries were inclined to take on an advisory service of their own and the case of the Waterford Co-op the advisors they had would pick out 60 farmers for specialised attention

At present the County Committee employed nine advisors with approval for one more Under the new plan the Co-op would be prepared to provide two additional advisors and pay half the cost if the Committee would pay the other half The more advisors it would then bring the number of advisors employed by the Committee to 12 an increase of 30 per cent on their present strength It would also mean that the size of each area to be serviced by each advisor would be reduced by 30 per cent and it was proposed that each of the advisors would then select ten small farmers with potential for development in each area for specialised attention

In reply to Mr Sean Whelan the CAO said that the increase would bring the farm-instructor ratio down to about 250 per instructor

Mr Frost assured Mr J Quirke that all the instructors would be under the Committee and not the Co-op and Mr Quirke said he was glad to know that as a man "could not serve two bosses at the same time"

Mr F O'Ryan, Chairman said that in their discussions the Committee had got every co-operation from the Co-op where all these matters were concerned

Mr Frost said that in the event the plan was approved he proposed to start off with two new temporary men as it would take twelve months before the permanent appointments would be made

On the proposal of Mr J Fahey TD seconded by Mr J Crotty the Committee unanimously approved the plan submitted by the CAO

VERY SUCCESSFUL YEAR FOR WATERFORD CO-OP

The surplus of £37 million retained by Waterford Co-op reflects improved performance from all divisions and subsidiaries. It is a tribute to the Society as being in line with capital requirements for expansion and development that will meet the needs and demands of the future.

Turnover increased by 37 per cent to almost £67 million and milk from the Society's own suppliers increased almost 9 per cent.

An outstanding feature of the year was the growth of business enjoyed by the Trading Division. Its turnover was up almost 40 per cent to a very satisfactory level of £20 million.

The Annual Report issued to shareholders for the annual general meeting to be held in Dungarvan today, Thursday, the Chairman of Waterford Co-op Tom Walsh and Chief Executive Stephen O'Connor state that it is clear that milk production and the demand for farm inputs will increase substantially in 1978 and subsequent years.

The present capital commitments and those of the next five years are likely to be in excess of £20 million.

The report states that the Board is conscious of the responsibilities it has to face and is pleased that this new period of strength is starting from a point at which there is financial strength in the co-operative. The progress of the co-operative must be planned and executed very carefully and cannot be pushed unduly for both financial and operational reasons and the Board is proceeding with the necessary improvements and developments in a balanced fashion.

The results published by Waterford Co-op shows a further improvement in the ratio of farm investment to borrowed funds. Farmers now own 51 per cent of the total funds of the Society. This compares with 48 per cent even as recently as 1976.

Referring to the potential for farming in the area the report states that the present climate in farming is good. The confidence of farmers is at a high level and adequate finance is available for investment in agriculture.

ADVISORY SERVICE

Referring to the provision of farm services Waterford Co-op's Annual Report states that it is the policy of the Board to assist and to supplement the Advisory Service within the entire Waterford Co-op areas.

Developing arming automatically required increased advisory input. It is essential that the advisory services are adequately staffed. The Society is more than willing to adopt an active and effective supporting role in any appropriate way.

As a practical step there has been a series of meetings with the advisory services to identify common ground and areas where the Society can assist in providing the best possible services to all farmers with expansion potential.

It is encouraging that a very high degree of co-operation and understanding already exists in a practical way in such areas as soil sampling relief milking, and farm building planning etc. in general way there is growing evidence that the specialist and indeed expanding dairy farmer wants to be relieved of the chores that are inseparable from expansion.
