**A QUICK SHIFT**  
Last week we drew attention to the dangerous location of the hut which the South East Tourism Organisation lobbied into the Square in Dungarvan as a Tourist Information Centre with the permission of the local Urban Council. Within a matter of hours of last week's issue of the "Leader" being published a couple of workmen appeared and by the afternoon the hut had been shifted from its dangerous corner position further back on the Square and it was moved around so that the entrance/exit was placed on the side and away from the traffic freeway through the Square.

In its new position the danger of someone being knocked down and the traffic hazard which the hut created by restricting vision at this high traffic point on the Square was eliminated but the contraption, nonetheless, remains an eyesore. One wonders why it should prove so impossible for the Tourism Organisation to obtain suitable offices for their activities in Dungarvan without coming along each summer seeking permission to place these jacked up temporary accommodations in a position which should be reserved for parking.

In fact this whole matter of the use of the Square requires to be looked at urgently once again. Last week an army of street traders descended on the town on Tuesday night and staked out their claims for "stands" on the Square and on Wednesday morning the entire area on both sides of the Square was taken over as these travelling shopkeepers parked their vans and lorries and erected their stalls from which they traded throughout the entire day. They brought everything and anything into the town and display racks of ladies dresses, men's suits, slacks, boots and shoes were pushed out even on to the traffic freeway. In addition there were stalls selling hardware, radio equipment, records and tapes, toys, fancy goods and bric-a-brac.

## FARM LABOURER REMANDED ON CAPPAGH MURDER CHARGE

The shooting of 47 years old Mrs Helen McGrath in the kitchen of her home at Ballinacorney Cappagh a few miles outside Dungarvan at about 9 o'clock on Wednesday night, June 21 had a sequel at Dungarvan Garda Station on Friday last when a 42-year-old single farm labourer John Murray of Ballinacorney Cappagh, was charged by Supt M English at a special court held before Mr D Goode P.C. with the murder of Mrs McGrath and was remanded in custody to Clonmel Court last Tuesday.

The tragic occurrence was one which shocked the people of the entire county but in particular the people of Dungarvan and Cappagh and Ballymacarbery where Mrs McGrath (nee Murray) resided, Ballymacarbery and her husband Michael McGrath who is an extensive farmer are well and popularly known.

Mrs McGrath was ironing in the kitchen of her home when a man entered on Wednesday night and shot her at point blank range before the eyes of her shocked 13-year old daughter Siobhan. He then tied up the girl and waited in the house before leaving a short time before Mr McGrath returned to find his wife dead in the kitchen and his daughter in a totally distraught state.

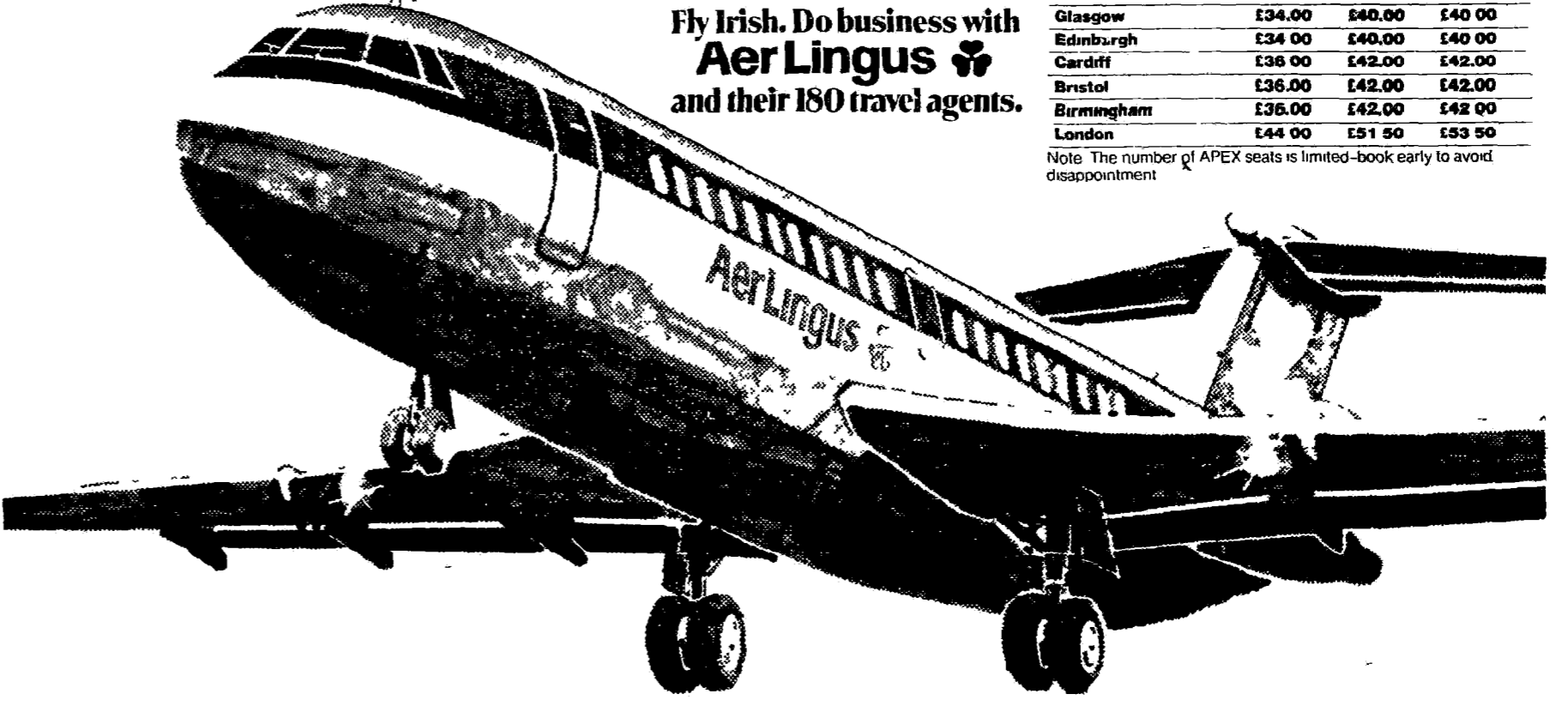
