County senior hurling champions Portlawa gave ample testi-

mony at Fraher Field Dungarvan on Sunday last that they have the ability and the determination to retain their crown

when they sent Western challengers Ballyduff crashing to an eleven points defeat in a game which proved disappointing for the very large attendance present.

Hopes of a repeat of last year's county decider were quickly dispelled as Portlawa showed their attacking power as early as the third minute when Hugh Maher scored following a melee in the Ballyduff goalmouth.

It was a disastrous start for the childreners who were never to recover from the blow they laboured throughout the remainder of the game particularly in attack where the absence of Liam Cumming was sorely felt and they were in the main but a pale shadow of the side which got to the final last year.

Portlawa's dominance grew as the game grew older as Mossie Whelan emerged as the dominant force in the centre of the field. The winners forwards thrived on the liberal supply of the ball they received and when Mick Regan had the first of his brace of goals in the 39th minute the writing was on the wall for Ballyduff. Ritchie Walsh's goal in the 41st minute brought the Westerners to within 4 points of the winners but they never got a-ciser and any hopes they had were well and truly shattered in the 48th minute when Mick Regan had his second and Portlawa's fourth goal.

Although the game was a spectacle was disappointing due to the inevitability of the outcome.

SOUTH EASTERN HEALTH BOARD PROPOSED NEW FOOD PREMISES

Persons who propose to commence any of the 'registrable food businesses' (hotels, cafes, restaurants, poulterers, fishmongers, food manufacturers, ice cream manufacturers, wholesalers of food) may not be fully aware that before any such business may be legally carried on they must first apply for registration within a specified period of one month prior to the commencement of such a business and obtain registration full or provisional of the premises concerned.

Failure to observe this requirement can result in legal proceedings being taken against the proprietor. Prior notification will also ensure that subsequent and expensive alterations to the premises can be avoided.

Architects and Solicitors are especially advised to instruct their clients to give preliminary notices to the Health Board at the planning stage. This procedure will ensure that the statutory requirements will be incorporated in the final layout thereby avoiding possible additional outlay on the building.
