CALL FOR UPGRADING OF HOSPITAL

Further to our criticism of the South East Health Board in this column last week for suspending the x-ray service at the District Hospital, Dungarvan during the month of August, a note from the agents for the monthly meeting of the Board to be held in Kilkenny on Thursday (Thursday) that the General Hospitals Committee will consider a resolution from the Local Health Committee recommending that the Dungarvan District Hospital be upgraded and that x-ray laboratory, casualty department and other necessary services be provided there.

These are services which the people of the town and indeed of all West Waterford have been crying out for since the Board commenced its policy of downgrading Dungarvan first as an administrative centre followed by the gradual erosion of the various health services which had been provided there by the old Waterford Health Authority.

With all due respects to the members of the Local Health Committee and the resolutions which they pass the fact is that they are merely a talking shop with no executive powers and without the required muscle their recommendations are rarely worth any more than their face value. The seat of authority is located in 'Arus Slainte,' Kilkenny, the headquarters of the Health Board, and it is there that the decisions are made.

If Dungarvan with its growing importance as an industrial area is to have all the health services restored it will I am convinced, take something more than a resolution of recommendation from the Local Health Committee. The Urban and County Councils already have passed similar resolutions too without result so it would seem that some stronger line of action will have to be pursued.

The new Irish ten pound note will go into circulation next Monday. About one-third smaller in size than the one it will replace it will feature on the front a portrait of Dean Swift (1667-1745) together with the Arms of Dublin set against the background of a letter written by Swift and dated April 11, 1735.

The back of the note features a detail from John Rocques map of Dublin, first published in 1756.

A major flaw in the design, as in the £1 and £5 notes already in circulation, is the printing of the serial number on the top right-hand edge of the note in a position that readily lends itself to being torn away thus rendering the note valueless.

MUSEUM OF SCOUTING

WORLD MOURNS DEATH OF POPE PAUL VI

Pope Paul VI, spiritual leader of the world's 700 million Roman Catholics, died last Sunday night after a heart attack, ending a 15-year reign marked by reforms, world peace and campaigns for peace and the underprivileged.

The 80-year-old Pontiff died in his summer palace of Castelgandolfo, 18 miles south of Rome, three days after being stricken by the heart attack, sobbing Vatican spokesman told reporters. With deep anguish, I have to say the Pope passed on at 21:40 (8:40 pm) our time.

Only on the previous Tuesday the frail pontiff who had suffered for years from painful arthritis said that death for us cannot be far away.

Thousands of Italians and foreign visitors immediately went to St. Peter's Basilica and to the little town of Castelgandolfo to mourn the man who succeeded Pope John XXIII and carried out the sweeping reforms of the 1962-1965 Second Vatican Council.

All lights were turned out in Castelgandolfo. In the Vatican, officials started preparing for the funeral and a conclave of cardinals to elect a new Pope. No obvious successor is in sight. The Pope's heart attack came only a day after he was ordered to take a complete rest by his doctors because his arthritic condition had worsened.

ILL HEALTH
Cardinal Giovanni Montini was Archbishop of Milan when he was elected as the Church's 262nd Pope on June 21, 1963. Although he often suffered from ill health during his papacy, he became the first reigning pontiff to visit the continents.

Paul, who once described himself as an "Apostle on the move",

was given the unction for the sick. He was unable to give his last message to the world a brief talk at his traditional mid-day Sunday blessing.

According to the text he reminded holiday-makers of those who could not afford a holiday, the unemployed and the hungry and all those who cannot work out a satisfactory economic and social life.

Mass for the repose of the soul of Our Holy Father Pope Paul will be offered in Abbeyside Church on this (Thursday) evening at 7:30 pm.

Concelebrated Requiem Mass will also be offered up for the soul of the late Pontiff at St. Mary's Church, Dungarvan, at 7:30 pm on this Thursday evening, August 10th.

SPECIAL MASSES
Special Masses for the late Pope will also be celebrated this Thursday evening (August 10th) in Kilgobnet Church at 8:30 pm and Colligen Church at 7:30 pm and Kilbrien Church at 8:00 pm.

DEATH FORETOLD
Towards the end of his pontificate he refused several times to have his death foretold.

When he celebrated the 15th anniversary of his election in June he said his pontificate was almost completed and only last Tuesday said that death for us could not be far away.

Tributes to Pope Paul began pouring in shortly after his death was announced. Italian Prime Minister Giulio Andreotti declared: "We will remember him with unbreakable affection with admiration and with his taglia."

TAKES CHARGE
Until a new Pope is chosen by the secret conclave which meets later this month, French cardinal Jean Villot, the Church's Secretary of State, will take charge.

The Cardinal who spent much of Sunday afternoon with the dying Pontiff will convene the conclave and break the ring and seals of Paul VI in a final ceremony.

IRISH ATTENDANT
The Pope was attended at his death by his private physician, Dr. Mario Fontana and his two personal secretaries, Monsignor Pasquale Macchi and Monsignor Thomas Magee, an Irishman.

Vatican sources said that after the heart attack he was lucid and praying until he died. But his condition was such that he

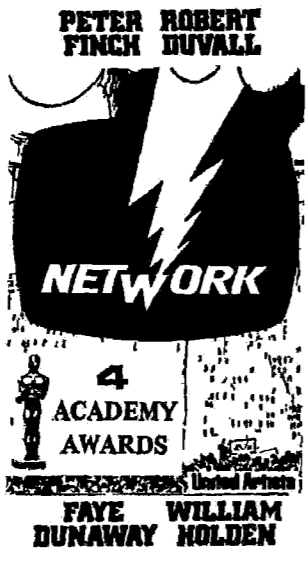
