Modifications in PAYE system arising from the introduction of the proposed new pay-related social insurance contribution scheme (PRSI)

PRELIMINARY NOTICE **TO EMPLOYERS**

New pay-related social insurance contribution scheme (1) The Minister for Health and Social Welfare has announced proposals which will enable, with effect from the 6th of April 1979. the present flat-rate social insurance, health, occupational injuries and redundancy contributions, as well as the present pay-related social insurance contribution, converted into a single pay-related contribution, to be collected through the PAYE system as a percentage of earnings up to a ceiling

(2) Stamping of insurance cards will be discontinued with effect from

(3) The new pay-related contribution will be payable in respect of all employees in insurable employment

Collection of the contributions

(1) No significant change will be required in the present PAYE collection procedures. Within nine days from the end of each income tax month, commencing with the month ended 5th May 1979, the employer must send to the Collector-General a return on the remittance form (P30) showing

(a) the amount of PAYE tax, it any, which he is liable to remit for that month

(b) the amount of pay-related social insurance contributions which he is liable to remit for that month and (c) the total of the amounts at (a) and (b)

The employer must remit to the Collector-General, with the return, the total of tax and pay-related contributions as shown on the

Records to be kept

(1) In addition to the details of earnings and tax recorded under the present system, certain particulars required for social insurance must be recorded for each employee, and the official tax deduction card, emergency card and temporary tax deduction form will be revised to accommodate the necessary details

(2) The particulars are (a) the employee's share, and the total of the employee's and

employer's shares, of the contribution (b) the social insurance contribution class and the total number of weeks of insurable employment

(c) any change in the insurance class and the number of weeks appropriate to the new class, and

(d) in certain circumstances the date of commencement and the date of cessation of employment

End-of-year returns (1) Details of the earnings and tax of each employee, as well as the particulars listed above, must be sent promptly to the Collector-General after the 5th April 1980, together with the annual declara-

tion on form P35 of the tax and contributions due (2) The final date for receipt of end of year returns will be extended to the 30th April in order to facilitate employers

(3) At the end of each income year the Collector-General will provide employers with a list of their employees in order to assist them in furnishing the required particulars. The employer will complete the list by entering in the appropriate columns the particulars from the tax deduction card, emergency card or temporary tax deduction form. The list, when completed, will be returned to the Collector-General with the completed form P35

(4) The official tax deduction card will be enlarged and will include blank columns for the convenience of the employer The employer will be obliged to retain the tax deduction cards, or any alternative document approved by the Revenue Commissioners, for record and inspection purposes

5 (1) Further details of the operation of the new scheme will be issued


