THE PROBLEM OF ROAD REPAIRS

Discussions at recent meetings of Waterford County Council have highlighted the problem which the Road Authority is at present experiencing in funding the soaring cost of repairing and maintaining the road systems within the county. The discussions were initiated by a report submitted by the County Engineer Mr. J. D. Hally.

The report drew the attention of the Council to the manner in which the roads are deteriorating and pointed out that in the case of the Waterford/Youghal road the amount of money spent since 1972 in improvements and strengthening works has failed to even keep pace with the overall deterioration of the road. The report also referred to a survey by An Foras Forbartha which has been going on since 1974 and which indicated that while the roads of the county are safer than average they are deteriorating at a perceptible rate.

The principal cause for the accelerating deterioration of our roads in recent years has been the very marked increase in the volume, weight and speed of the traffic using them. The growth of heavy vehicular traffic has been very noticeable and has been assessed at 25% in the last five years.

It has become patently obvious that the huge juggernauts with their enormous loads are the prime cause of the great wear and tear which our road surfaces are now being subjected to. These gothaths are usually driven at high speeds as time is an essential factor in their operations. In recent months I have had the unhappy experience of finding myself driving behind some of these monsters on several occasions and finding it impossible to pass as they pounded on at well over 50 m.p.h. No later than last Saturday evening I was travelling to Waterford and found myself behind one on the Leamybrien straight which was

clocking up to 55 m.p.h. but the driver was flagged down by members of the Garda Road Traffic Corps who were operating a radar check on the road. I am sure that most motorists have had similar experiences and know how frightening it is to attempt to pass these flying 'artics'.

It is these vehicles and the speeds at which they are being driven that are causing most of the damage to our road surfaces and this is borne out by the County Engineer when he told the members of the County Council that it was estimated that 10% of the traffic using the roads was responsible for 70% of the damage.

In this context Cllr J. Cullinane raised a moot point when he stated that a lot of this heavy traffic consisted of EEC juggernauts and asked whether any grants were available from the EEC for road repairs. The County Manager replied that he did not think so. I believe that this is an aspect of the matter which should be followed up but whether it is one for the County Council to take up themselves or for the Department of the Environment to pursue on behalf of all the Road Authorities in the country I do not know. The only certainty is that the cost of repairing and maintaining the roads is going to continue on an upward spiral and even as of now it has gone beyond the ability of the local ratepayers to cope with. Money will have to be found if the roads are to be kept up. The big question is where?

RESIDENTS OBJECT

The residents of O'Connell Street and South Terrace in Dungarvan have lodged an objection with the local Urban Council against the proposed expansion by Waterford Co-op Society of the Provender Mill at the Co-op concern which is located in close proximity to the north side of the street. In addition they are preparing a signed protest to be lodged with the Co-op Management concerning air pollution in the locality and the high noise rate which emanates from the same source.

Several of the residents in the street have informed me that they have found it impossible to leave those windows of their houses, facing in the direction of the mill, open and have complained that it is almost impossible to sleep at night because of the noise created by the machinery at the mill which operates throughout the night.

The Waterford Co-op Society, is, without doubt one of the biggest concerns in the town and as such is one of the largest employers in the area. On this score they are entitled to every consideration when it comes to developments within their concern which enable them to expand. However the residents in the locality of the Co-op's main complex are also entitled to consideration when something occurs which alters the environment and creates a situation which makes life and living more difficult for them.

No one would want to halt the onward march of the Co-op or for that matter of any other business which contributes so much to the economic welfare of the town and district but surely the technicians and engineers concerned with the construction of these mills should be able to come up with some solution to keep the dust or whatever from flying and to reduce the noise content to an extent that it does not create a nuisance.

BALLYDUFF NOTES

Tidy Towns - This is the report of the adjudicators in the National Tidy Towns competition Category A (150) 92 marks received. Effort 35 (24) - It is nice to welcome Ballyduff to the Tidy Towns competition. This is a very attractive village with a beautiful setting beside a river and as such has the potential to gain very high marks in future years.

Timeliness 20 (10) - Despite the fact that there are well placed litter bins throughout the village there is still quite a lot of litter about and everyone should be encouraged to use the bins. The house in the centre directly opposite the road from the bridge which spoils the approach and the old warehouse on the Fermoy road. Difficulties often arise when trying to handle such buildings but even if they are kept nicely painted at the front and free of weeds.

Presentation of Buildings 20 (14) - The Church School, Library and shops are all very neat and are obviously well looked after. The garage, however, is rather untidy and cluttered and could be improved if freshly painted. Where possible the attractive traditional shop signs should be retained and the use of plastic signs and boardings discouraged.

Presentation of Natural Amenities 25 (12) - The river and open spaces beside it are tremendous natural assets and a lot more should be done to make further use of these. The bridge however is very well painted and looked after. The river etc could be made into a very attractive recreation area and incorporated more into the overall visual aspect of the village.

Appearance of Approach Roads etc 20 (10) - The appearance of approach roads is very important and it is here that one gets the first impression of the village. Community effort is essential here. The County Council should be approached for their assistance in keeping the verges trimmed within the village itself. It is important to keep the road sides and footpaths free of weeds. It is attention to such details which gains marks in the competition.

Presentation and Appearance of Residential areas and open spaces 15 (12) - Many of the older houses in the village look very well indeed as do the new houses on the Fermoy road. Responsibility should not end at the boundary wall or fence however but where possible care should be taken to keep the roads in front of houses tidy also.

Street Furniture, Litter Bins, Car Parks, etc 15 (10) - Some of the plastic litter bins are cracked or broken and it is recommended that these be replaced by a more durable type. Some of the road signs are in need of repair - e.g. the speed limit sign on the approach road from the bridge. The telephone kiosk is in good condition.

OLD LINKS WITH THE AREA

C Coy of the 13th Bn as it is today evolved from the old L.D.F. force that gave such sterling service to the country during the days of the emergency. Over the years volunteers from all walks of life have given their spare time to help mould the unit into the force which it is today.

The continuation of the military tradition in the area has been due to the unselfish service of men like Comdt Richard Keating, Comdt Gianville and Capt Seamus O'Brien (now Secretary of the West Waterford G.A.A. Board). Other familiar names spring to mind like those of Charie Curran of Clashmore (now Chairman of Waterford County Council), Tom McGrath of Ballymacarby, Dick Brennan of Lismore, John Hayes from Piltown, Jim Wyse, who was a bank manager here, the Dunfords of Kibreen and Dungarvan the Grants and the Cashmans.

There are countless others who have written their names into the annals of the unit and departed quietly over the years, but their service to their country and their unit will always be remembered.

Of course there are veterans like Coy Sgt Paddy Delany, Joe Kelly, Tom Washe, Mick Keating and John Crowley who are serving since the 1940's and who are a link with that great era and who continue to guide and administer the unit as it moves towards 1979.

MUCH TO OFFER YOUNG MEN

To continue the high standard and great military tradition that the unit has built up over the years a steady stream of suitable young men is continually required to replace those who retire from the unit. The force has much to offer to the keen young man—training in modern army weapons and firing them on army ranges, radio/signal training—tactical training—adventure training—orientation etc. In addition there are week-end camps, summer and winter camps during which members attending are paid at Army rates of pay and also receive a substantial gratuity. Physical Training and athletics are also well catered for with particular emphasis on cross-country running, Volley Ball and Basketball and members are permitted to participate in All-Army Championships.

A STEPPING STONE

Service in the F.C.A. has proved a stepping stone to many young men in their selection of careers. In the past decade nine young members of the Unit won Commissions in the Permanent Defence Forces while numerous others launched themselves on successful careers by gaining training in the Army and Air Corps Apprentice Schools. Service in the F.C.A. merits consideration for applicants for Government, Local Government and semi-State appointments.

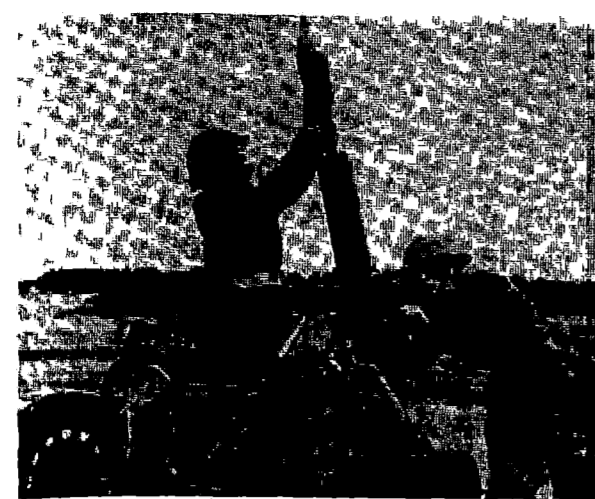

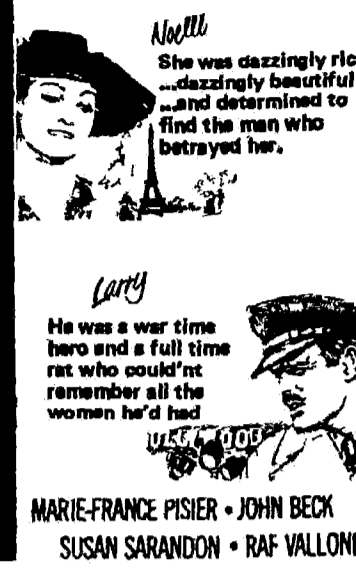

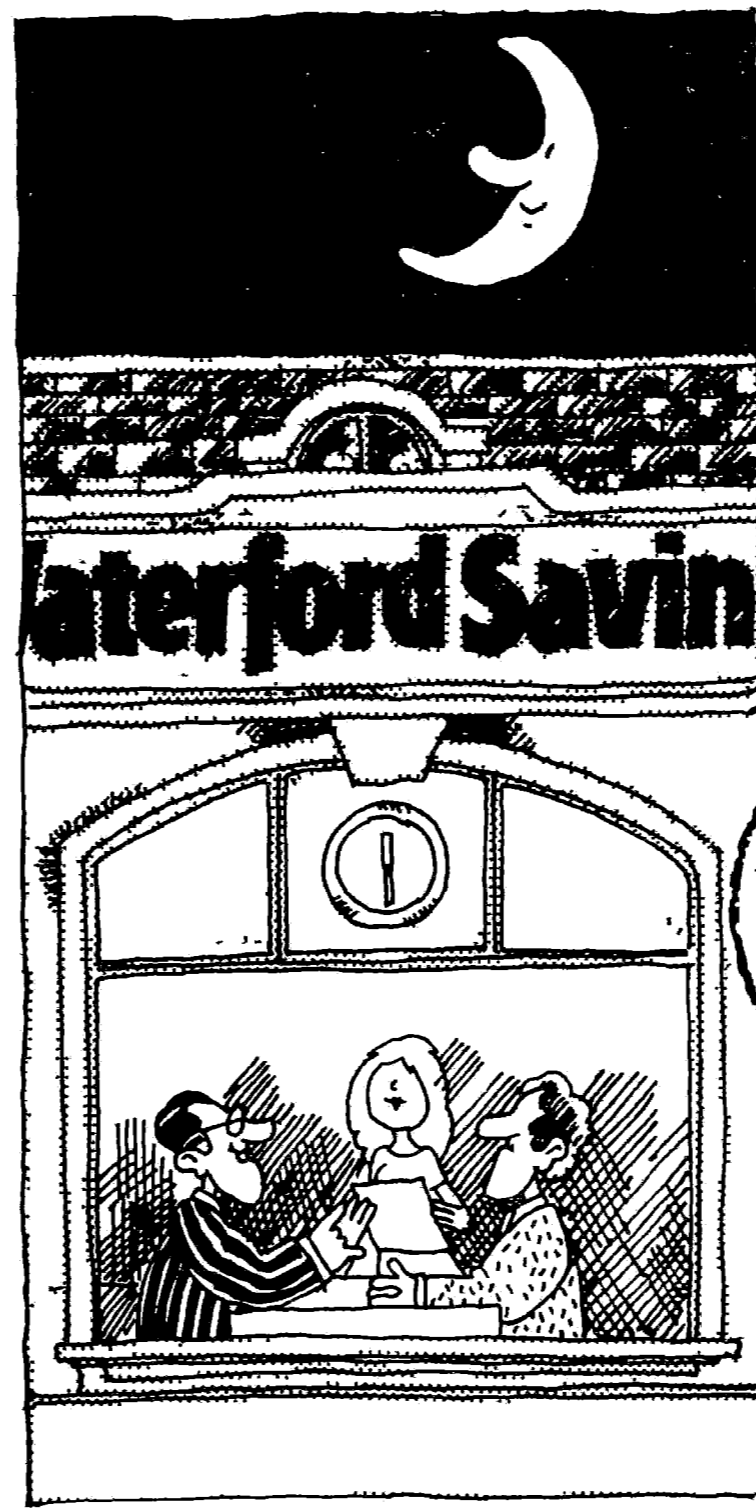
