PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

TAOISEACH FOR NIRE CEREMONY

It has now been confirmed that the Taoiseach, Mr Jack Lynch, will travel to the Nire, Ballymacarby, on Sunday, October 22, to perform the official opening of the restored Knockanaffrin Republican Cottage where in 1923, the secret meeting which finally led to the ending of the Civil War was held.

It was in this small thatched cottage, located in the remote fastnesses of the Nire Valley, that eleven men met to negotiate the terms for the ceasefire. They were Eamonn de Valera, Liam Lynch, William (Bill) Quirke, Tomas Derrig, Austin Stack, Sean Dowling, Sean McSwiney, Tom Barry, Humphrey Murphy, Tom Crofts and Frank Aiken.

Until recent times the cottage was occupied by Mr Jim Wall whose family played hosts in 1923 to this group of men whose names have become household words down through the years. It has, however, been unoccupied for the past few years and had fallen into a bad state of repair.

Feeling that such a historic building should be preserved for the nation a number of local people came together and set up a Restoration Committee and now after many months of voluntary work, the famous cottage has been structurally restored and the Committee of which Clonmel-based and Nire born Mr Paddy Harte is the Chairman, have decided to name it the Knockanaffrin Republican Cottage.

One of the prime movers behind the restoration of the cottage has been local County Councillor Kieran O'Ryan who told me "We felt it would be little short of tragic if such a historic cottage was allowed to deteriorate to the point where it would fall down. It was here that the talks that finally brought the Civil War to an end were held and it is only right and fitting that it should be saved for the nation."

Prior to the official opening of the cottage on next Sunday week, Mass will be celebrated in the Nire Church at 2 p.m. after which there will be a parade led by the Taoiseach and the Liam Lynch Memorial Pipe Band Anglesboro, from the Nire Bridge to the cottage.

The organising committee have a full programme of festivities planned for the occasion.

CIE TIMETABLES AND THE PUBLIC

The attitude of CIE in providing a suitable public transport in this county has been the subject of much criticism down through the years and on several occasions the parent public body in the County, the County Council, has felt itself obliged to protest to CIE for its failure to provide an adequate and suitable service. On most occasions these protests have netted little or no response.

The most recent protest by the Council to CIE came at the Council's meeting last Monday when it was stated that many would-be bus passengers were left stranded in Dungarvan on Sunday and consequently unable to return to Dublin to be in time for work on Monday morning. It is but another instance of the lack of consideration displayed by CIE towards the general public.

In recent months County Engineer Mr Jim Hally, Dungarvan, in his role as private citizen, has been in correspondence with CIE Area Manager for Waterford, Mr J. A. O'Connor, about the timing of departure of the express bus from Waterford to Cork in the afternoon at 2.30. Mr Hally has asked CIE to examine the situation with a view to changing this time of departure because at present it militates quite badly against passengers arriving from Dublin on the mid-morning train which is scheduled to get into Waterford at 2.25 p.m. He pointed out that it was impracticable to expect anybody coming off that train to get from the station to the bus depot on the quay in time to catch the bus.

Developing his argument on this point, Mr Hally, in his opening letter to the Area Manager, states "Recently CIE changed the time of departure of the mid-morning train from Heuston Station (Dublin) from 11.50 to 11.45 without however, changing the arrival time in Waterford at 2.25. It would seem reasonable to me that having brought back the starting time by 5 minutes they would also bring back the arrival time by the similar time and the train would then arrive in Waterford at 2.20. If this were coupled with a 10 minute delay on the starting time of the bus to move it from 2.30 to 2.40,

the 20 minutes interval would just about give time for a passenger arriving on the train to get to the bus in time for its departure."

In a P.S. to this letter Mr. Hally points out "The situation would be simplified from everybody's point of view if the express bus could leave from the station in this case it would be sufficient to bring the time of arrival of the train back by 5 minutes, thus giving an adequate 10 minutes for the transfer from rail to bus and the bus could then depart on its original scheduled time of 2.30."

This request would seem to be most reasonable and the alterations suggested to be completely logical. The CIE reply however, did not concede either and stated "It would be ideal if services connected perfectly but obviously this is not possible. Where borderline cases exist we must have regard to majority interests. The train timetable is cast as near as possible to what we consider to be ideal for our customers, but there is, as well, the question of making optimum use of locomotives and train sets."

If, as they claim, CIE have regard to majority interests, I cannot for the life of me see why the alteration suggested by Mr Hally which involves a mere 5 minutes, could not be implemented. It would not affect the ordinary users of the afternoon express bus and would help the train travellers to make their connections. However CIE do not see it in that way and have held to their own line of argument and refused to make any alterations.

In maintaining this attitude CIE can be said to be consistent more in their disregard of other than their own majority interests. When they closed down the railways in the county they promised that they would replace the rail services with an alternative adequate road service, a promise which they did not keep.

THE HEIGHT OF FASHION IN 1828
 I am indebted to Mr Paddy Carroll, the well-known and popular parish clerk in Cappoquin for information about a poster which he came across pasted on a door at Cappoquin Church and which throws an interesting light on the styles of the time as worn one hundred and fifty years ago. The poster, dated May 8, 1828, was issued by William Sheehan, Dungarvan, who was advertising his "Woollen, Manchester, Hat and Fancy Warehouse" which was located at the Square, Dungarvan and it stated "William Sheehan takes leave to inform his customers

and the public, that in addition to his former stock he has, a few days since, arrived to him, from the first manufacturing towns in England and Scotland, an assortment of best black, blue and medley cloths, cassimeres and summer waistcoating, Gc, Gc, patent dyed London Beaver and silk hats, with a variety of other articles in his line, which he is determined to sell at very reduced profits.

"W.S. takes this opportunity of returning thanks to the public for the decided preference given to his Establishment since his commencement in trade, which he assures them it will be his study to merit. He feels confident that his present stock (on inspection) will be found to please."

The trading house of William Sheehan was located on the north-west corner of Grattan Square in the premises now occupied by the Waterford Trustee Savings Bank and it was from there that the height of fashion was made available especially for the menfolk of Dungarvan and West Waterford, one hundred and fifty years ago.

BOOM IN HOUSE PRICES
 There has been a big boom in the price of house property in Dungarvan and district in recent months. This is exemplified by the fact that within the last few weeks a 3-bedroom semi-detached house in Abbeyside was sold for the huge price of £27,000.

MINISTERIAL VISIT
 The Minister for Health, Mr Charles Haughey, T.D., will visit Dungarvan tomorrow (Friday) to perform the official opening of the new sheltered workshop for the handicapped at Carriglea. His Lordship, Most Rev. Dr. Russell, Bishop of the diocese, will be present to bless the new building prior to the official opening.

NO ACTION AGAINST F.F. COUNCILLORS
 After a lengthy discussion and an appeal not to take any disciplinary measures that would only focus an unwanted spotlight on the party at the present critical time, it was agreed at the meeting of the Fianna Fail Comhairle Dail Ceanntair held in Dungarvan last Friday night that the motion in the name of the Kilmacthomas Comhairle Ceanntair calling for disciplinary action against Cllrs K. O'Ryan and G. Armstrong for failing to vote for the party's nominee in the County Council co-option last June be withdrawn.

Much of the time of the meeting was taken up discussing the "press leakage" of the affair, possibly in the light of what appeared in this column last week.

COUNCIL SEEK DISCUSSION WITH MINISTER ON ARDMORE EROSION

Waterford County Council want to meet Minister for State Pearce Wyse T.D. to discuss the problem of coast erosion in the Ardmore area and in other coastal areas of the county. The decision was made at the monthly meeting of the Council in Dungarvan last Monday when the members considered a draft reply to be sent to the Commissioners of Public Works concerning the contribution to be made by the Council towards the cost of proposed coast protection works at Ballyville to justify a higher grant than the 50% proposed by the Commissioners.

The points made in the reply were that the existing rating limitation would make it imprudent for the Council to commit themselves to a burden which would be able to meet even a 20% share of the estimated cost. In these circumstances they felt justified in seeking the maximum grant of 80% and pointed out that even at this level the work would entail, and that the rate of growth of the valuation base on which the Council must operate left little hope that they would be able to meet even a 20% share of the estimated cost.

Mr A. Deasy T.D. thought that the submissions in the reply were quite reasonable and he proposed that it now be forwarded to the Board of Works. Mr C. Curran, Chairman said that although they were still not into the winter more land in the Ardmore area from Ballyquin to Whiting Bay had already been lost to the sea. He said that a meeting to discuss this problem had recently been held in Ardmore as a result of which he had written a personal letter to the Minister for State, Mr Pearce Wyse asking him to receive a deputation to discuss the position. He had received a reply from Mr Wyse which stated that the Commissioners for Public Works had informed him that the application from the County Council for coast protection works were only at a very preliminary stage of consideration and that it would be many years yet before any works could be undertaken by them. The letter concluded in the circumstances no useful purpose could be served by receiving a deputation.

Mr Curran remarked I think that ends any hope for Ardmore. P. Kennedy suggested that the Council should put £5,000 into this year's estimate to carry out some work in the area. Mr J. Hally Co. Engineer—A sum of £10,000 was included last year. Deputy Deasy said that a serious aspect of erosion was that farmers were now being asked by the Council for land which no longer existed as it had been washed into the sea. He was aware that land was sold recently in the Ardmore area and 10 or 15 acres according to the maps no longer existed. A similar situation arose in the Clones (Dungarvan) district and he thought that it was up to the Council to do their part where these problems were concerned.

IN DANGER
 Mr M. Harty referred to the erosion at the Cunnigar at Dungarvan and said that if this continued the town of Dungarvan and the main road to Yougha, were in danger. Unless something was done here now the job would run into hundreds of thousands of pounds later. Mr Hally said that the Cunnigar was one of the areas included in the list which he had

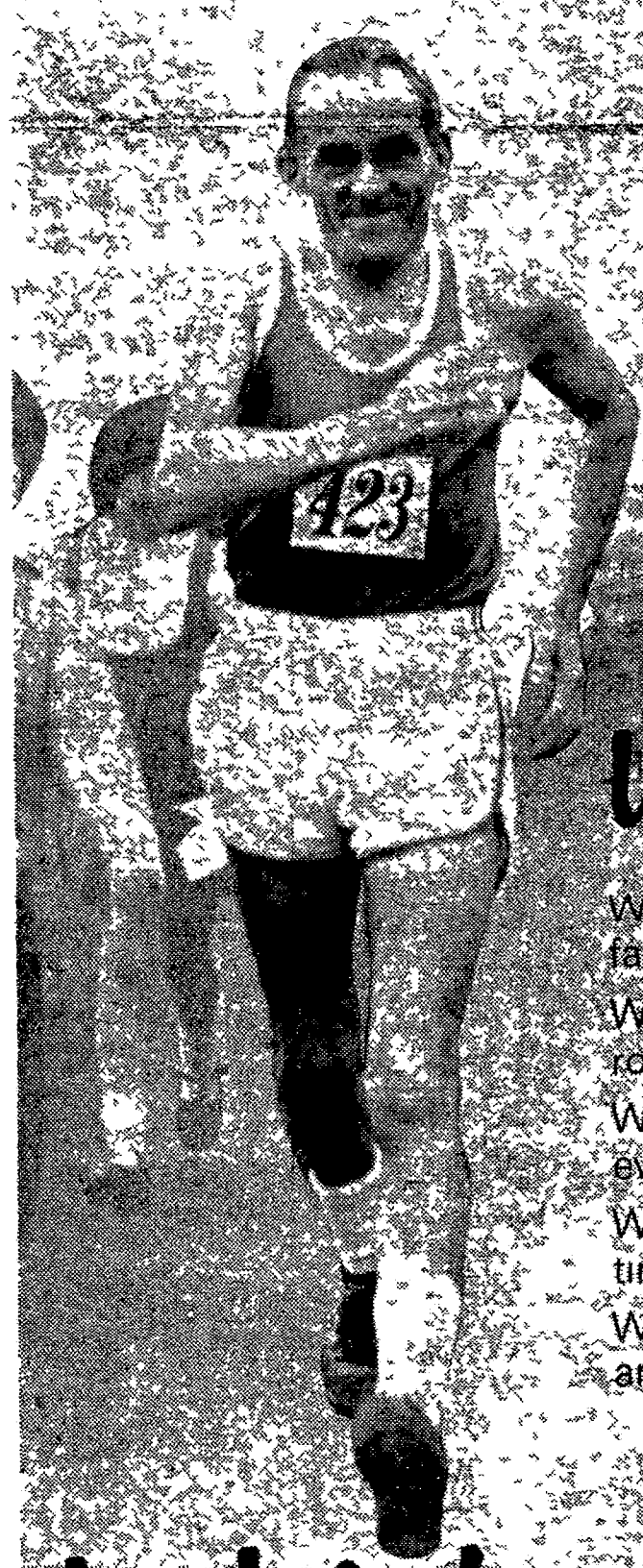

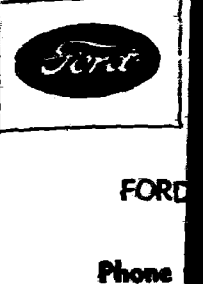
