PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

IN THE GLEN OF SECRETS
It was a vintage October day on Sunday last when I stood gleaming on the hillside in the autumn sunlight. Tri-golours floated from flag-poles and houses all along the route showing that the old republic spirit is still as much alive there today as in the days of yore when it was also "friendly country" for those on the run. Arrived at the Nire Chapel I experienced the first traffic jam and having been told by one of the stewards that the cottage was "just about quarter of a mile up the road," I decided to park there and walk the rest of the way. It was the longest quarter of a mile that I ever walked and it was on a good incline up and having retraced my steps later in the evening I knew that I had travelled a fair distance on foot.

However, far be it from me to complain, because as I trudged up the road I was amazed to see so many elderly people many of them well into the winter of their years and not very well able to walk, making their way in the same direction. There were also young couples with their infants in arms or in prams which they pushed along, all obviously in happy humour.

The official opening is fully covered elsewhere in our news columns and all I would add to it in this column is a reference to the presentations made to the Taoiseach and Mrs. Lynch to mark the occasion. Before they left the cottage after the official opening a bronze plaque bearing a beaten image of the cottage with a suitable inscription was presented to Mr. Lynch by the Restoration Committee. The plaque was made by Miss Siobhain Kearney of Clonmel, and the presentation was made on behalf of the Committee by the Treasurer, Mrs. Nora Dougan Clonmel, while later, in the Nire Community Hall, a beautiful piece of hand made lace made in the local Craft Centre was presented on behalf of the people of the Nire, to Mrs. Lynch.

The significance which An Taoiseach attached to the occasion is also noteworthy. He gave it priority over the Cork Senior Hurling final which was played in Pairc Uí Chaoimh, Cork, also last Sunday, the first one he missed in thirty years.

TAOISEACH ATTACKS PROVO VIOLENCE AT BALLYMAC CEREMONY

Thousands of people converged on the lonely Nire Valley in the heart of the Comeragh Mountains near Ballymacardry last Sunday evening to attend the official opening of the Knockanaffrin Republican Cottage by the Taoiseach, Mr. Jack Lynch. The occasion was favoured by beautiful weather and the day was reminiscent of what we might have had in the summer which we never had earlier in the year.

Following Mass at 2 p.m. in the Nire church the crowd wended their way along the narrow road strewn with autumn leaves to the cottage where in 1923, leaders of the Anti-Treaty side in the Civil War, met and reached a decision which resulted in the subsequent ceasefire and the end to the hostilities.

On arrival in the Valley, the Taoiseach was met by the Honour of Old IRA men and was escorted to the cottage led by the Liam Lynch Memorial Pipe Band from Anlesboro, Co. Tipperary. He was greeted with rousing and vociferous reception by the huge crowd which was crammed into every available vantage point.

Having been introduced by Mr. Paddy Harte, Chairman of the Restoration Committee, Mr. Lynch recalled the historic meeting which had taken place at the cottage over 55 years ago which set in motion a process which brought the Civil War to an end.

"In that Spring of 1923," said Mr. Lynch "a process of reconciliation was possible. It is still relevant. Fear and hatred still survive in some few in Ireland, even if they are far out-numbered by those who seek understanding and trust. Words cannot describe the impact of violence in Northern Ireland in recent years. The image, and the reality behind it bring us shame. The violence of the IRA is committed without our consent and in flagrant disregard of the democratic principles of the people of the North and South, but it is committed in our name and in pursuit of our aspirations. We and our aspirations are thereby defiled."

The Taoiseach then said that like the process which was set in motion in this cottage more than 55 years ago, reconciliation required courage. Where antagonisms have become ritual, he said, "the sterile cycle must be broken. Such actions require foresight and dedication because there will always be those who allege betrayal and for personal advancement, use the catch cry of deviation from traditional roles. 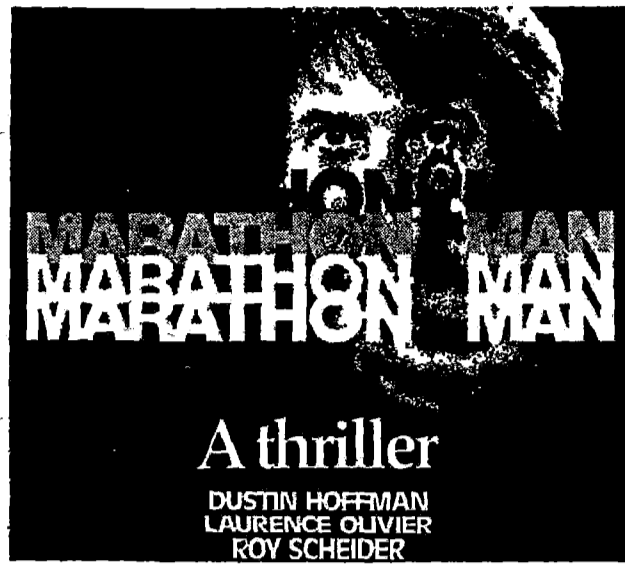

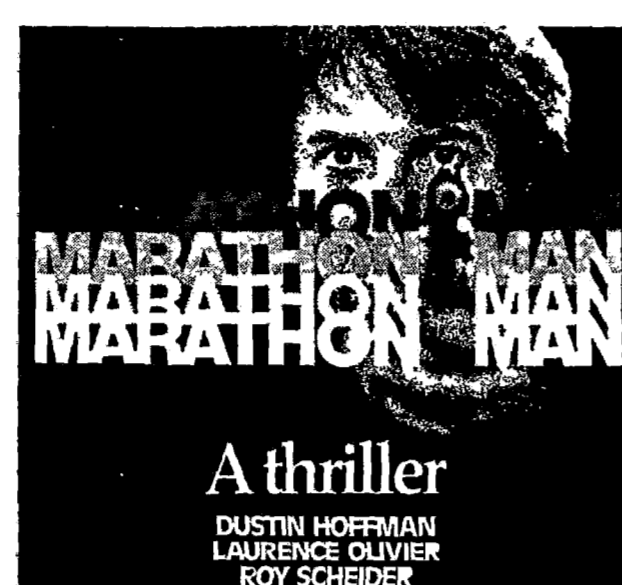

Next Sunday
The Western junior hurling final between Ardmore and St. Mary's, which was due to be played at Dungarvan, has been postponed for November 5th in order that John Dalton and Declan Fitzpatrick will be available to the county selections for the National League game against Wexford on Sunday. This means that there will be no championship game in the West next Sunday and supporters will be free to travel to Wexham Park where a double-header in the National League is scheduled.

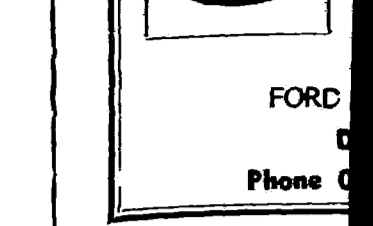
