PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

BE SAFE, BE SEEN
 Of the total of 576 persons
 killed on the roads during
 1977 almost 222 were pedes-
 trians, who are one of the
 most vulnerable groups on the
 road. This was one of the
 facts that was stressed at the
 launching of a new campaign
 by the National Road Safety
 Association in Dublin last
 week.

The campaign is aimed at
 encouraging pedestrians to
 make themselves more visible
 to motorists at night. Most
 pedestrians on the road at
 night assume that they can be
 seen easily by drivers. They
 can't and in assuming that
 they can many of them could
 be making a fatal mistake.
 The best protection is to
 wear a strip of reflective
 material in the form of an
 armband as this can be seen
 in the headlights of a car up
 to 500 feet away.

Now that we have the long,
 dark nights with us again it is
 essential for pedestrians to
 realise the dangers on the
 roads after dark and to guard
 themselves by adopting the
 motto, 'Be Safe, Be Seen'.
REMINDER OF PAST TRAGEDY

Recently while Mr Ned
 Morrissey Shandon, Duncar-
 van was clearing bushes and
 briars from an area adjacent
 to his home he found an old
 cross which had obviously
 been hidden for years behind
 the tangled growth.
 The cross had a couple of
 engraved brass plates to the
 front and back and when these
 were cleaned they were found
 to bear the following inscrip-
 tion: "Erected to the memory
 of the poor people who died
 of Asiatic Cholera in the year
 1832, and on the back of the
 cross: "Erected by Surgeon Henry
 Anthony, Dungarvan"

The cross, made of cement,
 is a link with a tragedy which
 struck Dungarvan close on 150
 years ago when a cholera out-
 break said to have been
 brought to the town by some
 sailors, caused the deaths of a
 big number of people, all of
 whom were buried in a special
 graveyard located at Kilmur-
 which is close to Shandon or


