Engineers Work To Rule Creating Massive Hardship
 Mr C Carran Chairman stated at a meeting of Waterford Co Council in Dungarvan last Monday that the work to rule policy being followed by the Council's engineers was creating massive hardship throughout the county especially among the weaker sectors of the community. He said that because water supplies were shut off there were areas such as Washmore where people could not even light the fires in their houses. He said that the Council was being blamed for the position but he wanted to make it clear that they had no say in the matter because it was a national problem. He asked whether anything could be done in the interests of the public to bring about an early settlement. Mr J D Hally, Co Engineer said that the matter did not rest with him. The dispute had been referred to the Employer/Labour Conference and they could only await the outcome from there. Asked about the back-log in the work schedule of the Council resulting from the situation Mr Hally said that as soon as the position was resolved he would then come back and report to the Council.

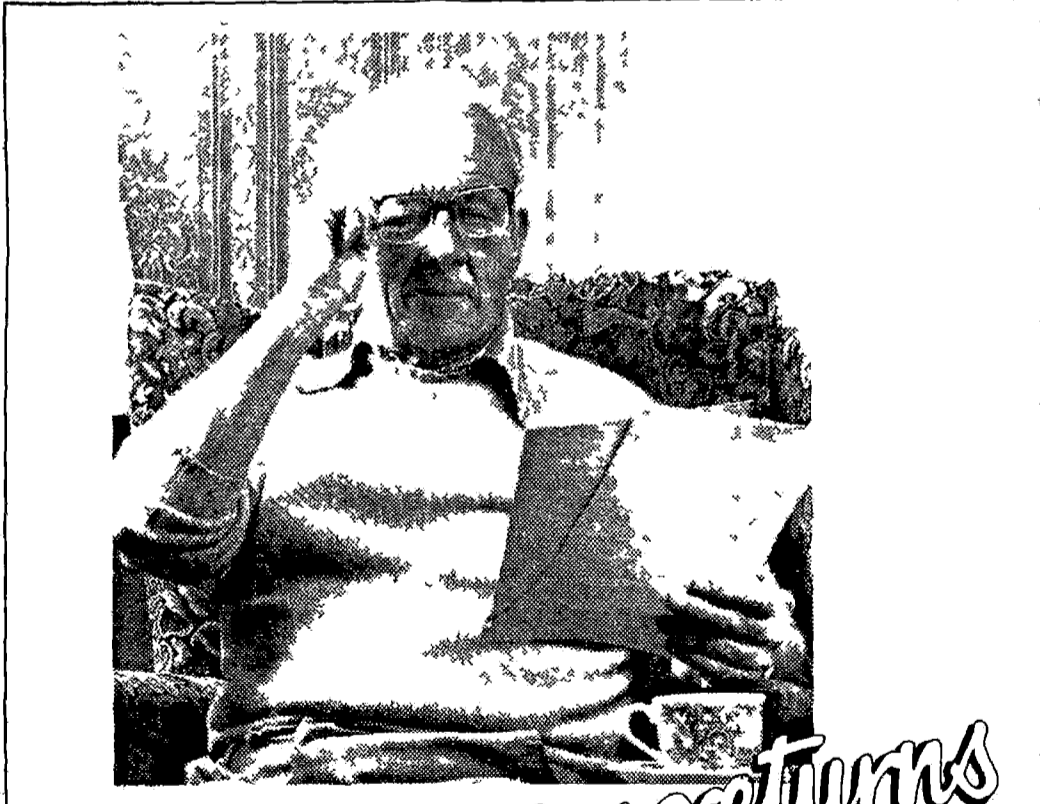

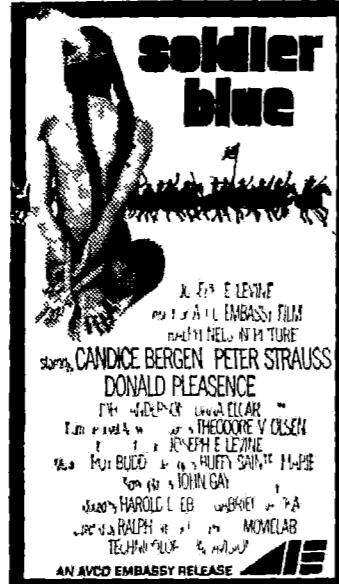
