The first problems showed themselves with the dumping cheap imported leather goods into several of the EEC countries and these have now expanded to such an extent 17th century that the markets for locally produced leather have shrunk to such a degree as to force the Irish Leathers Group to introduce a rationalisation plan which unfortunately includes a loss of between 130 and 140 jobs at the Dungarvan factory by January 31 next and the possible total closure of the factory at a later date That is, of course, unless a rescue operation can be mounted by the government to enable the Company to survive In the short term this would call for a government subsidy to enable the Company to purchase its basic raw materials at a realistic price and in the long term a change in current EEC policy

The latter concerns three of the larger South American countries which do not allow the export of hides. The result of this is that the hides are sold to the tanneries in those countries for little or nothing to the detriment of their own cattle producers Those hides are in turn processed into leather which is being sold on the European markets at extremely low prices with whic's Furopean producers, including ourselves, cannot compete These imports are allowed under EEC agreement despite the fact that they provide unfair competition to the tanneries in the EEC and agan unfortunately, Ireland now fares worst where this is




