PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

CHRISTMAS '78

It was a quiet Christmas but it was a very wet one especially the days before Saturday was a dreadful day but despite the day long downpour shops were extremely busy up to closing time. Thankfully the weather improved on Christmas Eve and it was mild and fine and remained so for Christmas Day and St Stephen's Day.

Churches in all areas were crowded for midnight Masses on Christmas Eve and also for the Masses on Christmas morning.

However the rain made an unwelcome return on Wednesday and flooding was reported from several areas.

A few minor traffic accidents occurred but fortunately there was nothing very serious and the Garda authorities stated that there were no untoward incidents reported.

Well the great occasion is once again behind us and now we face a new year once more. I hope it will prove a happy and prosperous one for all readers.

THE STREET TRADERS

The street traders were back in force at Griffin Square, Dungarvan on the Wednesday of Christmas week. It coincided with the old fair day—third Wednesday in the month in the town. They had everything and anything for sale from clothes to hardware and of course the most seasonal line of goods for the days before Christmas—Toys. From what I could see as I passed through the Square they did a roaring trade and the large crowds were undoubtedly bargaining hunting—that is if bargainers were to be had.

A good deal of interest centred on what the street traders would do following the recent upholding by the High Court of the decision of the District Court to impose fines on those who had been summoned for breaches of the town parking bye-laws by parking their vehicles at the Square, while trading for longer periods than the one hour permitted. I understand that the twelve who were convicted and fined have taken the matter a step further and have now appealed the High Court ruling to the Supreme Court.

Pending the outcome of this appeal the Garda Authorities are, I understand taking no action even regard to breaches of the parking bye-laws by the group.

But whatever the outcome of the appeal the position will remain far from resolved as

East to Youghal have had heavy inroads made by the sea and particularly badly hit in the storm earlier this month were areas around Ardmore and the Cunnigar in Dungarvan. The latter has always acted as a bulwark against the high tides of winter when backed by gale force south-easterly winds but this, too, has now become badly breached with the result that the main road leading out of the town to Youghal becomes subject to heavy flooding on the occasions when high tides are backed by these strong following winds.

Members of the County Council and of Dungarvan Urban Council have repeatedly expressed their concern at the major deterioration in these areas and while proposals for protective works have been prepared in a number of cases the cost of doing any kind of proper jobs is estimated to run into millions of pounds.

The availability of money to finance these projects is the main problem as the local authorities do not have the kind of cash which is required. It appears also that the Board of Works which is the Government Department in charge of such projects has not the kind of money required to tackle the task either.

Mr Pearse Wyse, Minister for State at the Department of Finance who heads the Board of Works made this clear last October when he stated that over the past three years the total amount expended by his Department on coast erosion came to £120,000, not even a mere drop in the ocean. He further stated that no money was available from the EEC Regional Fund for coast protection works and the best hope he could hold out to those seeking grants for such projects was "we are exploring the possibility of getting money".

In this context it would seem to be only a waste of time at local level to prepare schemes in the hope of getting grants to carry them through. There just is no money available from Government or EEC funds—at any rate not the kind required for major schemes—so the best that can be done is the stop-gap jobs which the Council can carry out from their own resources and at least these are better than nothing.

I.D.A. Promises More Aggressive Promotion For Dungarvan in 1979

In a special report reviewing 10 years operation of the Small Industries Programme 1967-77 the Industrial Development Authority states that 1977 was the most successful year of operation of the Programme resulting in the approval by I.D.A. of 225 new projects, I.D.A. grant assistance of £6.4m, promoters investment of £13.8m and 3,529 new jobs at full production. In the context of the South East region the report states that three new companies commenced operation during the year at the Waterford Industrial Estate and construction on two new factories commenced. The Waterford Glass £20m expansion of Waterford Crystal (lightware) Ltd was announced and when this is in production by early 1980 it will employ approximately 1,000 people. The report adds "A special effort was made during the year to encourage existing industries to expand and to attract in new developments to Dungarvan and to West Waterford. This area will be a target for a more aggressive promotional campaign in 1979."

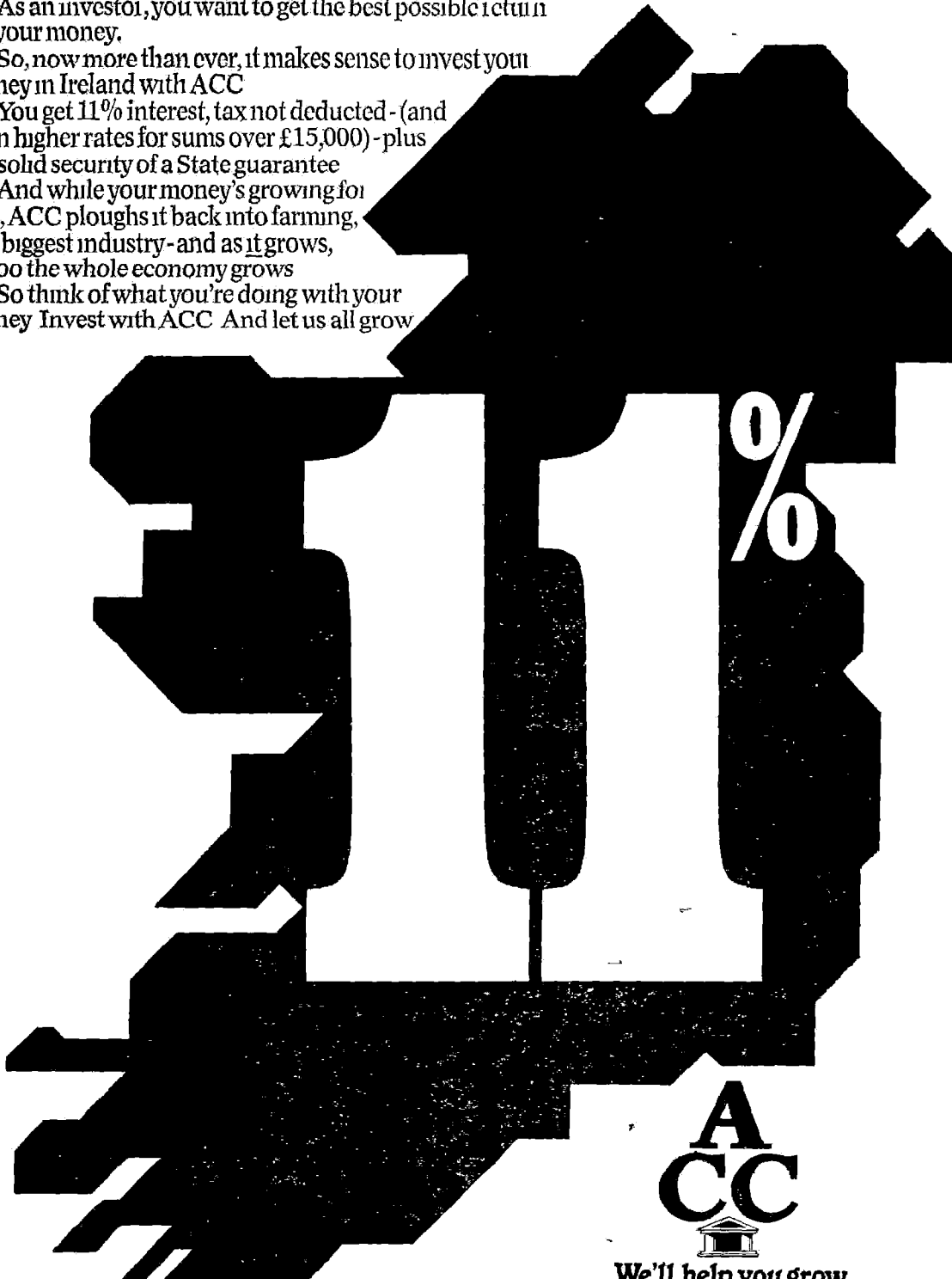
