## PENSMAN TAKES YOU behind the SPOTLIGHT

### NO LONGER BEAUTIFUL BANTRY BAY

Bantry Bay immortalised in the lovely ballad which sings of its pleasant beauty and of the fishermen who come home in the gloaming with their harvest from the sea became the focus of world news in the disaster that occurred there around 1 a.m. last Monday morning when an oil tanker, discharging its cargo at Whiddy Island, exploded and became a holocaust which claimed 50 lives, seven of them Irish. When the news spread on Monday morning it left us all numb at the extent of the disaster.

Since Gulf Oil first came to Bantry in 1967 there have always been fears of major pollution disasters but no one ever imagined that the horror which has now struck the quiet West Cork town and which has left the country appalled would occur. These huge oil tankers, however have always been a menace and have been the cause of a litany of disasters across the world. When we heard of them before they were always far away and had little affect on us. Now it is a different story. The latest disaster on our own doorstep—the worst so far in the history of tanker transport—has left us horror-stricken.

Despite the precautions and the safety measures something went wrong at Bantry shortly after midnight on last Sunday night. Experts on the scene are at present trying to find out exactly what did go wrong to create a situation which has claimed so many lives and which caused some of the local residents there to think that it was the very end of the world.

Until these findings are made known we must only wait and see what further precautions are necessary to avoid such dreadful disasters or whether it is just something we must accept if we are to continue living dangerously with such situations as heavy oil concentrations.

Our sympathy goes out to the people of Bantry and particularly to the relatives of

and continued without further mishap. The time lost by the delay caused a good deal of added inconvenience but it all could have been avoided if in the first place, CIE had provided a properly serviced vehicle.

### WERE THE OLDEST AND THE NEWEST — THEN

The recent decision to put the FCA on a new footing vis-a-vis the regular Army recalls the history of the FCA in the Dungarvan area. This brief history was recalled for me recently when I saw a photograph from an old daily newspaper dated May 6, 1959. It showed the then longest serving member of the FCA, Lieut. Paddy Cullinan, Abbeyside who was a member of the Force since its foundation in Dungarvan with one of the newest recruits Pte Michael Daly.

Paddy Cullinan, one time member of the West Waterford Brigade IRA, now well over his three score and ten, has since retired from active service duty but I am glad to say that he is still hale and hearty and still very active in many other spheres.

## £5 Million Required To Combat Coast Erosion

It was stated at a meeting of Waterford County Council in Dungarvan last Monday that the cost of doing a proper job to combat the widespread erosion along the coastal areas of the county would cost a massive total of £5 million.

The matter was raised by the Chairman, Mr C Curran, who stated that since the position was last discussed by the Council before Christmas the position had become very bad in areas like Ardmore, Mr Curran said that in the recent storms a small farmer in the Whiting Bay area had lost two acres of good land to inroads made by the sea. The whole problem, he said, arose from the fact that no money was available to undertake the necessary protective works.

Mr S. Whelan said that the position was now very serious and he asked whether there was any source available from which they could obtain the necessary money or whether there was anyone who would accept responsibility for the position.

Mr A. Deasy, TD suggested that the council send a deputation to the Minister for Finance to find out whether money was available from EEC funds for the purpose. "Fantastic damage has been done in the last month at Ballyvoile, Ardmore and Whiting Bay," he said.

Deputy Deasy said that the damage had been caused by a knock and the other at Dunmore East.

damage had occurred in the East Cork areas such as Ballycotton he thought that the deputation should be representative of both Councils.

The Chairman said that the Minister of State at the Department of Finance, Mr Wyse who had responsibility for the Board of Works had said "no up to this to all requests of this kind."

The proposal to ask the Minister for Finance to receive a joint deputation to discuss the matter was seconded by Mr M Harty and passed.

**FIRST PRIORITY**  
Mr C. A. O'Connor, County Manager, said that they were compiling the estimates for next year at present and while they were under serious constraints due to the 10% limit placed on them by the Department, he proposed as a first priority to put in an allocation for coast erosion instead of money proposed to be used on removing dangerous banks.

"I have been informed," said the Manager, "that Ardmore especially is in a terribly bad position and we must try and do something there."

Mr J. Fahey TD asked what the possible cost of the necessary works would be and the Co. Engineer, Mr J. D. Hally said that he had given an estimate of £2.8 million four years ago. Since then however there had been two further serious slips which he had not anticipated one at Knockmahon and the other at Dunmore East.

Mr Fahey — So it could all cost as much as £5 million now Mr Hally—Yes

To a point made by Mr T. Healy who asked whether there was any point in spending sums like £40,000 or £50,000 on small jobs which could be swept away in the next storms, Mr Hally said that without the "sleeper wall" which they had placed in certain areas things would be much worse there now.

The Manager's proposal was approved in principle.

### Move To Force Manager's Hand Not Necessary

The first item on the agenda at a meeting of Waterford County Council in Dungarvan last Monday was a notice of intention signed by Cllrs J. Fahey TD, D. Ahearn and C. Curran to propose a resolution under Section 4 of the City and County Management (Amendment) Act, 1955, directing the County Manager to grant planning permission to John Long, Cherrymount, Youghal to erect signs for which he had applied pursuant to Section 39 of the Local Government (Planning and Development) Act, 1976.

Before the resolution was moved, the Co. Manager, Mr C. O'Connor recalled that the matter of allowing Mr Long to erect signs about his home farm accommodation had been discussed at the October meeting of the Council and he indicated then that he proposed to have the matter further examined.

Mr O'Connor then informed the Council that he visited the scene where the signs were to be erected with Mr Hally, Co. Engineer and Planning Officer last month and as a result had decided to grant permission for two of the signs but had refused permission for the third which was to be placed 150 yards on the Youghal side of the bridge.

Cllrs Fahey, Ahearn and Curran all expressed satisfaction at this decision and said they were glad that the need to move the resolution did not now arise.

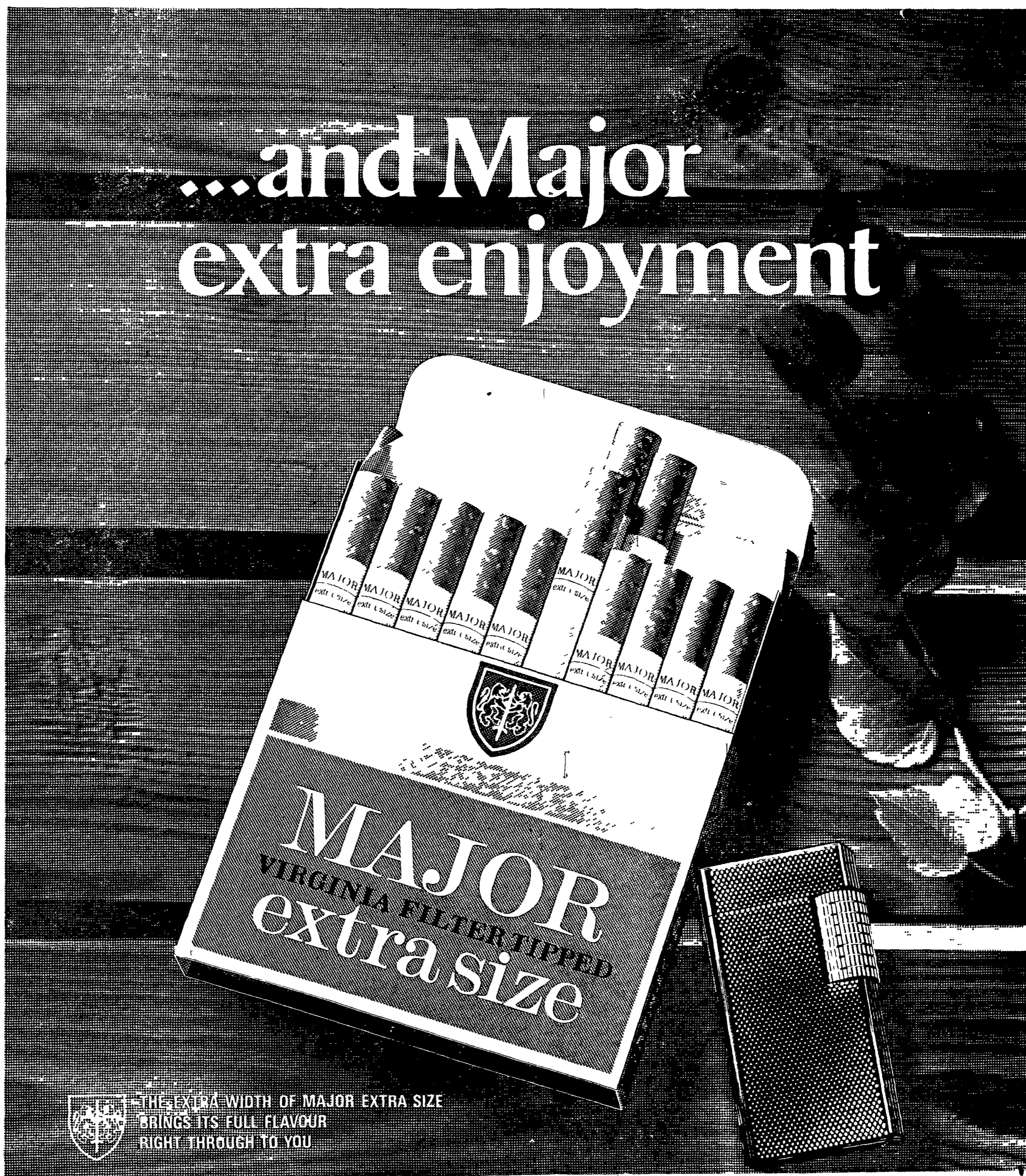

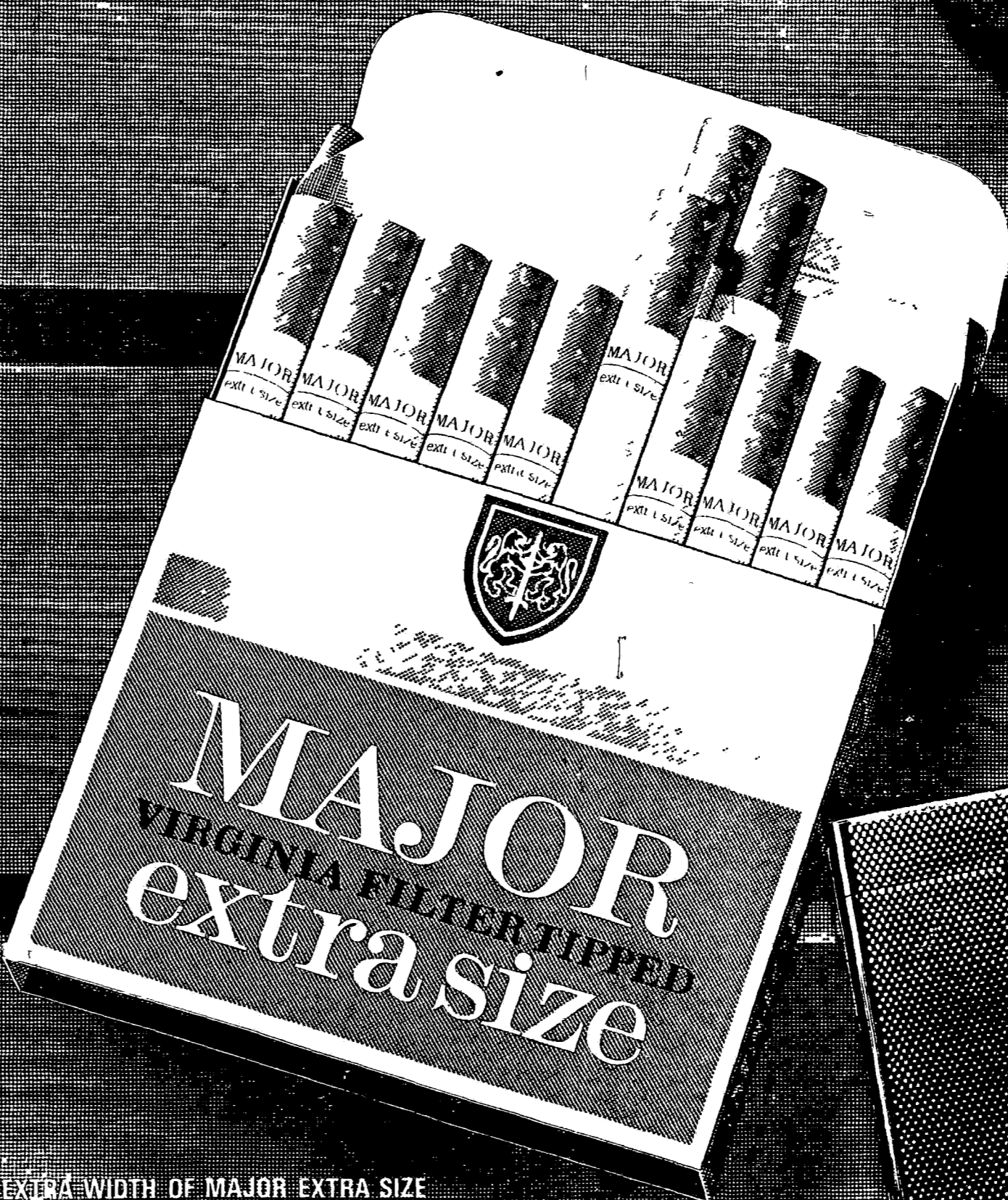
