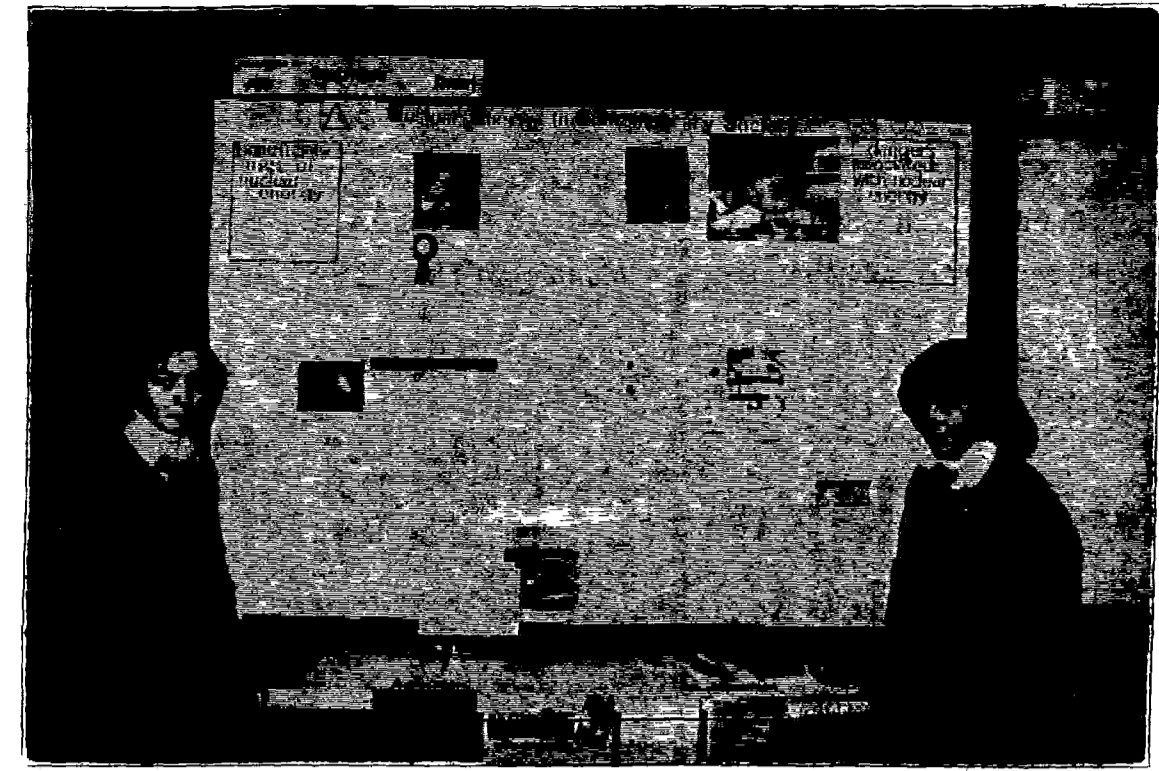

CALL FOR MORE GARDAI FOLLOWS MINI-RIOT IN CLASHMORE

A mini-riot in Clashmore last Saturday night resulted in serious damage being caused to one of the public houses in the village when a door was torn from its hinges and several windows were broken

The matter was referred to at a meeting of Waterford County Council in Dungalvan last Monday when the Chairman Mr C Curran who lives locally stated that when the mini-riot broke out a call was made for the Garda but none were available on the spot

Mr Curran said that the position was that there was only one Garda stationed in Villiers-town but even though he did his best it was physically impossible for one man to cope with such a large area. He said that the Garda authorities themselves admitted that the area stretching from Ballinacourty to Yougal was one of the worst patrolled areas in the county

He then proposed that the Council call for an increase in Garda strength in Villiers-town in order to be able to handle situations such as the mini-riot of the previous Saturday night

His proposal was seconded by Cllr P Kenneally and passed unanimously

40 m.p.h. Speed Limit At Grange Not Practical
When Cllr Sean Whelan proposed at last Monday's meeting of Waterford County Council in Dungalvan that a 40 m.p.h. speed limit be introduced on either side of Grange Church he said that people going to Mass on Sundays were unable to cross the road because of the speeding traffic. He suggested a similar arrangement as at Leamybrien where speed signs might be erected even though not legal as they would have the effect of slowing down cars

Deputy A Deasy said that he would like a definite answer about the speed signs at Leamybrien for the next meeting as he understood people had been prosecuted for speeding there

Cllr T Kyne thought the idea of a speed limit at Grange was a good one that you will block up the whole road from here to Cork" he said
